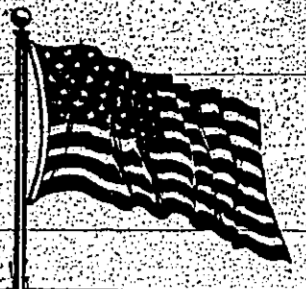

DOUCETTE HOMECOMING IS SUNDAY

The Sixth Annual Homecoming at Doucette this Sunday is expected to be attended by from 200 to 300 residents and former residents of the once-thriving sawmill town. It was the site of the largest Southern mill in the Long-Bell Lumber Company system.

Henry Hendrix of Beaumont, president of the Homecoming Association, said the fifth "First Citizen" award would be presented. This award is presented each year to a recipient named by the association executive committee and announced at the homecoming. The honoree in 1970 was Mrs. Josephine Baskin of Galveston, widow of the late Frank Baskin and long time resident of Doucette.

This year the "Homecoming family" to be given special recognition will be the Shepherd family. This family are descendants of Allen Shepherd and his wife who came to the area in 1873.

Shepherd and his brother left Dothan, Alabama, on horseback in 1872. They rode over Mississippi, Louisiana and into Texas seeking a place to settle. After crop-time in the fall of 1872 the Shepherd family left Alabama and by way of New Orleans, Galveston, and Sabine Pass finally landed in Town Bluff, then a thriving river town, in the spring of 1873.

Dee Shepherd of Doucette, a veteran teamster and farmer, Kirby of Beaumont, Preston of Liberty, Mrs. Maggie Ruse and Mrs. Seta Eaves are grandchildren of the original pioneer Shepherd family.

Special invitations have been sent to Joe Adams and T. L. Brodax, International Paper representatives in the Doucette area. International is now the parent company of Long Bell.

All residents and former residents are invited to bring a basket lunch and join old friends for the program, Hendrix said.

Registration will start at 10:30 a.m. at the old community church. Lunch will be 12 noon and the program starts at 1:15 p.m. Ronald Roberts of Doucette, vice president of the association, is program chairman. Mrs. Wayne Herndon and Mrs. Wade Best are in charge of arrangements.

Wiley Poston Dies In Accident

Funeral services for Wiley K. Poston, 57, of Lufkin and former manager of Radio Station KVLL in Woodville, were held at 3:30 p.m. Sunday in Gipson Funeral Home chapel in Lufkin. The Rev. John Cassey and the Rev. George Powell officiated. Burial was in Glenwood cemetery at Groveton.

Mr. Poston was killed Friday night in a three-car accident in Lufkin. He had stopped to make a left turn and his compact car was struck from behind, thrown into the other lane and hit by a third car. It burst into flames and Mr. Poston was pinned inside.

Highway Patrolman Tony White, one of the investigating officers, told the Lufkin News that Mr. Poston had dropped his daughter-in-law off at her home about two-tenths of a mile from the accident scene and was attempting to turn left toward his home onto a farm road when his car was hit from behind by a late model sedan driven by Elton Mosley Wright, 50, of Lufkin, who received only minor injury.

White said that Poston's car was knocked upside down into the west bound lane of traffic on State Highway 94 where it was struck by a late-model sedan driven by William E. Shakley, 27, of Nacogdoches. Whites said the Poston vehicle suffered a rupture of the gas tank and burst into flames that covered the west-bound auto also.

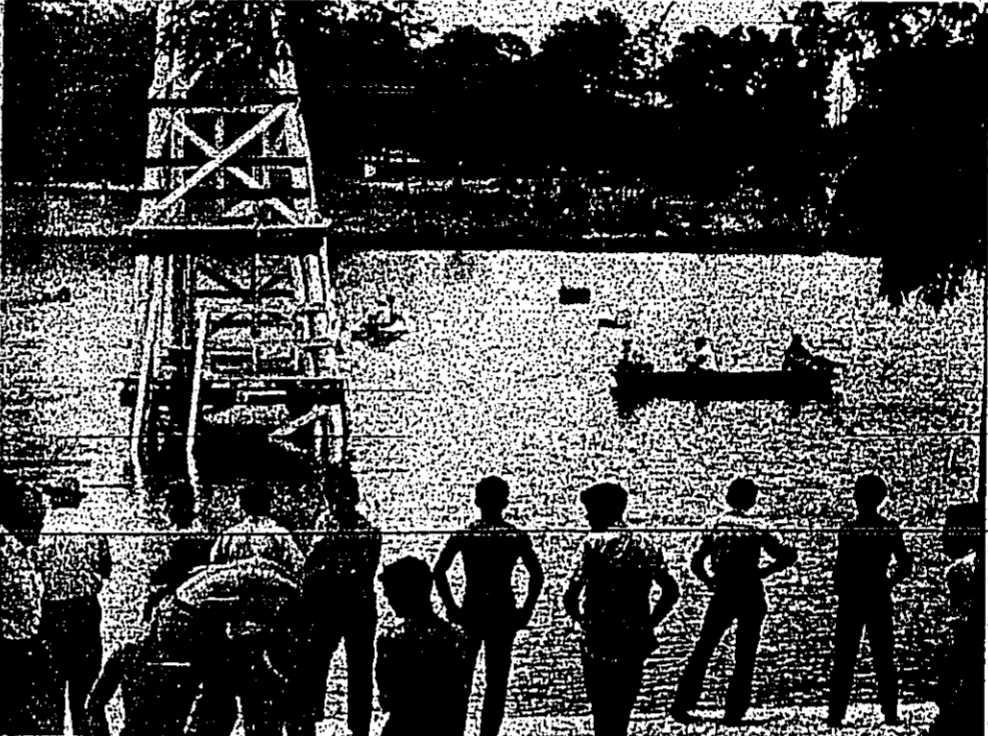
Justice of the Peace Helen McClure pronounced Poston dead at the scene. Shakley and his wife and two-month old son were taken to a Lufkin hospital and treated. The husband and wife were released but their infant son was hospitalized. A passenger in the Shakley car, Norman Feder, 23, of Nacogdoches did not suffer injury although the hair on his head and face was singed by the heat of the collision, the patrolman said.

Mr. Poston, or Wiley as he was known to everyone young and old, opened Radio Station KVLL as manager in January 1968. He went to station KPPL in Diboll in 1969, and had been manager of KLUF in Lufkin for about six weeks. He had worked on stations in Livingston and Jasper. He had made his home in Jasper and commuted to work in Woodville and on weekends while in Diboll and Lufkin.

He was a member of the Lufkin Kiwanis Breakfast Club and a member of the Trinity Episcopal Church in Jasper. He was a native of Groveton. He is survived by his wife, Virginia, of Jasper; two sons, Ken, of Lufkin and Charlie of Nacogdoches; two daughters, Lucy of Natchitoches, La., and Amy of Jasper; his mother, Mrs. W. S. Poston of Lufkin; two sisters, Mrs. Ted Trout of Lufkin and Mrs. R. E. Schuller of Houston; one grandson.

OUTING ENDS IN TRAGEDY

Huntington Boy Drowns At Tejas

An outing of Huntington Junior High School pupils ended in tragedy Tuesday when a 15-year-old boy drowned in Lake Tejas near Colmesnell.

Tommy Williams, son of J. T. Williams of Huntington, did not surface after diving from a high diving board at the lake about 10:30 a.m. Tuesday. The sheriff's office was notified by Harley Crews, precinct three constable, and an Edwards ambulance and rescue team went balance and rescue team went to the lake by Sheriff Grady Ray.

Highway Patrolman Joe Williams left immediately for the lake with a boat and he was joined by Game Wardens B. R. McReynolds and Billy Platt with another boat. Others assisting in the search for the body were Highway Patrolman Gary Henigan, Sheriff's Deputies B. J. Yardeman and John W. Davis, and Earl King.

The body was found about 12:30 p.m. in about the same location where it went down. It was brought to Edwards Funeral Home where it was picked up by Gipson Funeral Home of Lufkin.

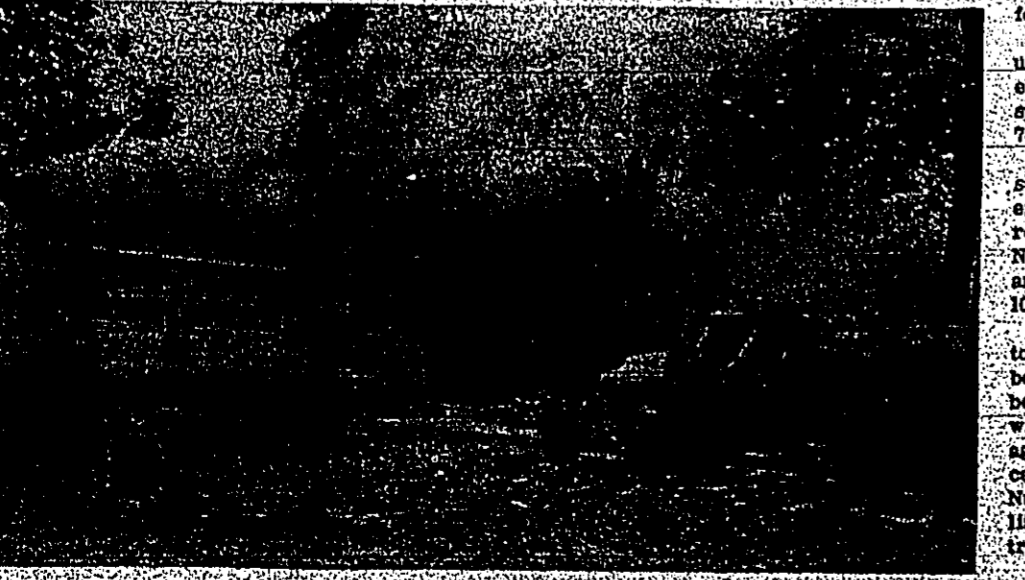

Ella Moseley Named Outstanding

Mrs. Ella Moseley of Colmesnell presented the award as Outstanding Senior Citizen of Tyler County for the year at the meeting of the Retirees Club Tuesday morning at the Lions Den. The presentation was made by George Barclay, chairman of the county Governor's Committee on Aging, and her accomplishments told by County Judge Tom D. Mann.

When Ella Moseley retired from her profession, she did not retire from life. Moving back to her old home town, she plunged into the religious, civic, and social work of the community. Today, no citizen, young or old, does more toward the upkeep and for the welfare of this small East Texas town than this Great Lady.

As the daughter of a Baptist minister, a kind and gentle man, Ella Martin grew up in a home built on the principles of the golden rule. Although she lost her mother at a very early age, she did not accept this as an excuse to be a weakling. Rather this fact served as a challenge to her to be the kind of a person her mother would have wanted her to be. And, so she grew into a strong and lovable character with high and attainable goals.

At a very young age she started her teaching career that lasted for several years. She taught in the fall and winter and attended Sam Houston Normal Institute in the summer.

In 1924 she married A. G. Moseley of Carthage, Texas. Mr. Moseley served as principal of Kirbyville High School, superintendent of Humble High School, and superintendent of Jolietville High School. During this time Ella filled her place in the school room and her role as wife of the superintendent with equal skill. When her husband died, she was teaching in the school at Nacogdoches. In addition to teaching, she was a reporter for a newspaper, The Sentinel. She remained there with their young son, now an engineer in California, until her retirement.

When she returned to Colmesnell, she built a lovely home near the Baptist church. Today the doors of the church are of open without Ella Moseley in attendance. She taught a Sunday School class; helps to direct the B.T.U.; and works in the W.M.U. In addition she has kept the flowers growing around the building.

DPS Reports Two Fatal Accidents During April

During the month of April there were two rural auto accidents in which two persons were killed, according to Sergeant C. L. Taylor of the Texas Highway Patrol.

In addition highway patrolmen investigated 18 rural motor vehicle accidents in which 13 persons were injured.

This year there have been 60 rural accidents in the county, through April, in which three persons have been killed and a total of 30 injured.

During the same four month period last year there were 52 rural traffic accidents in which one person was killed and 25 injured.

In District 25, comprising 16 counties, the highway patrol investigated 395 rural accidents in which 19 persons were killed and 214 injured.

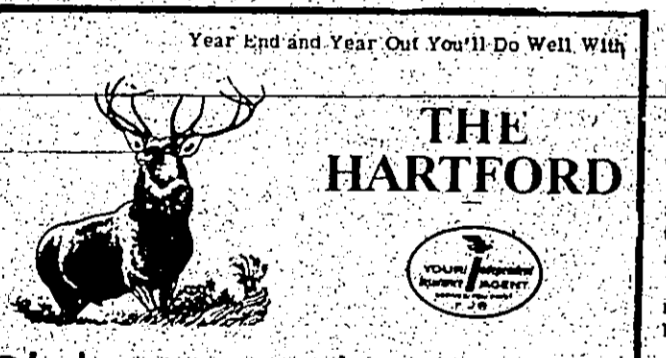

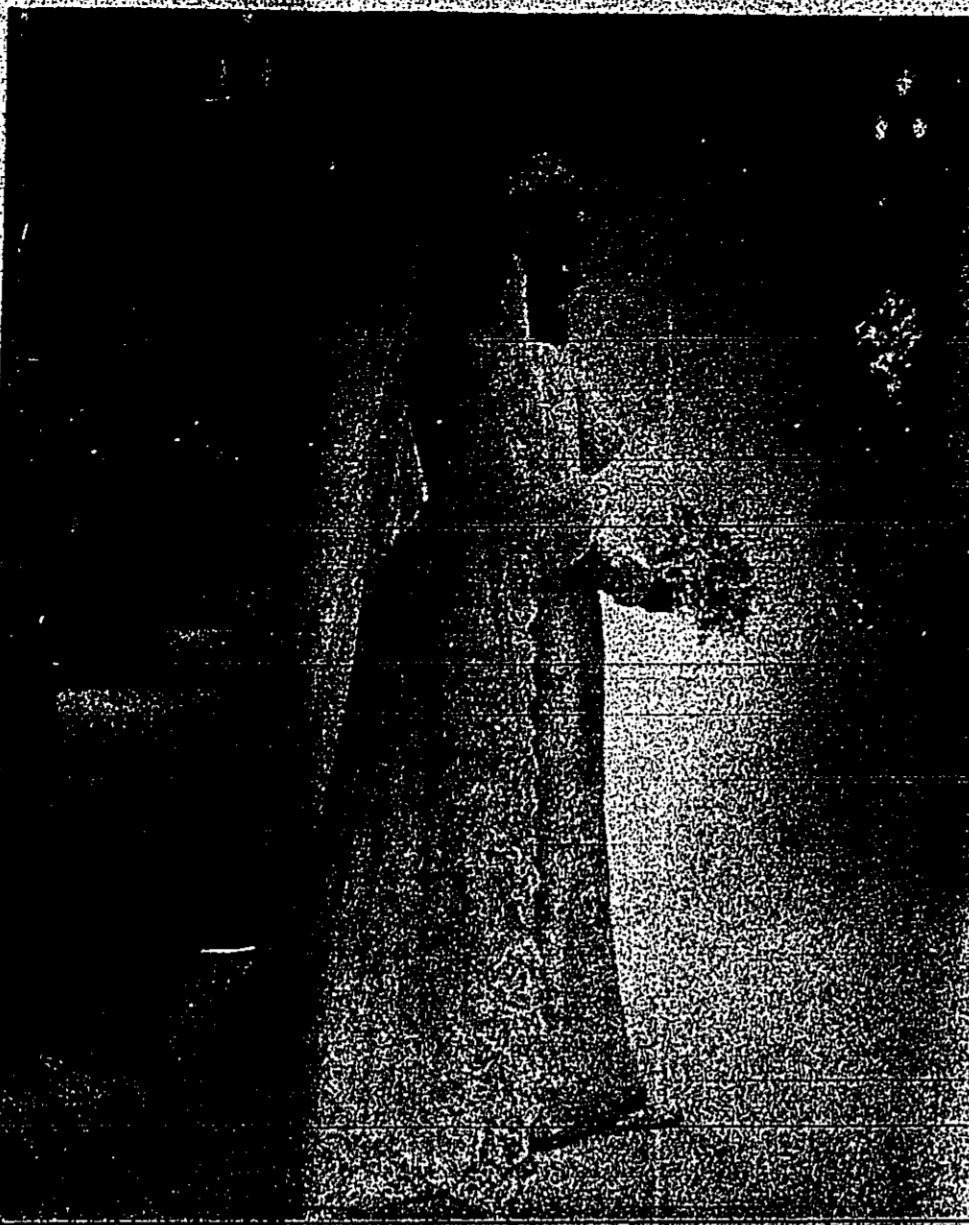
