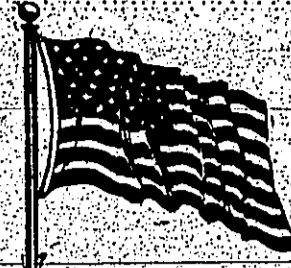

Jack C. White has retired from the Soil Conservation Service after nearly 24 years in Woodville. He first went to work for the U.S. Forest Service in Idaho in 1949, serving summers while attending Forestry school at the University of Montana. He passed the Junior Forester Civil Service examination while at Yale University.

His first appointment was as a junior forester in CCC camps in northern Michigan. Then he was transferred to South Dakota, Nebraska, and Colorado. During World War II he was on the Emergency Rubber project in California. In 1944, he was transferred to Soil Conservation Service as a forester to work in Arkansas. The next move was to Woodville, while here he has worked in twelve counties in southeast Texas.

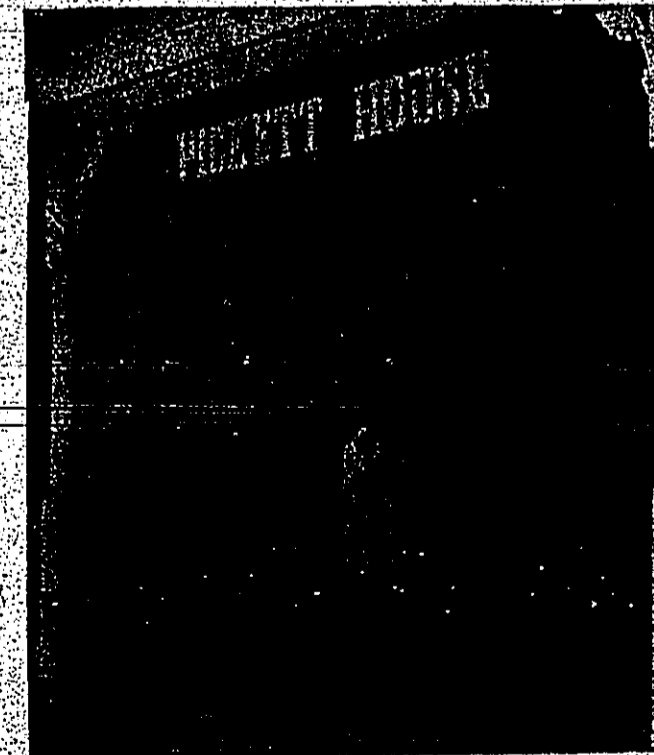

So save your corn cobs for garden to fall. And tomato plants won't fall or fall.

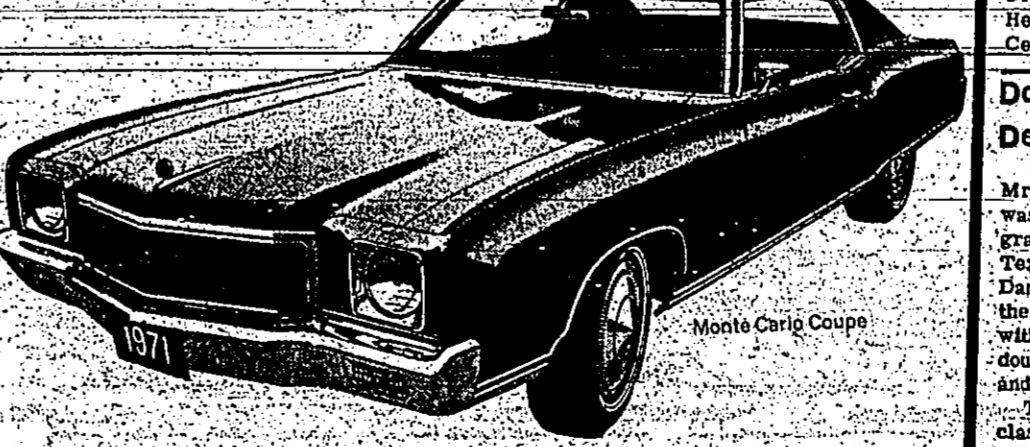
And whether the garden is fall or in spring, A garden is truly a wonderful thing.

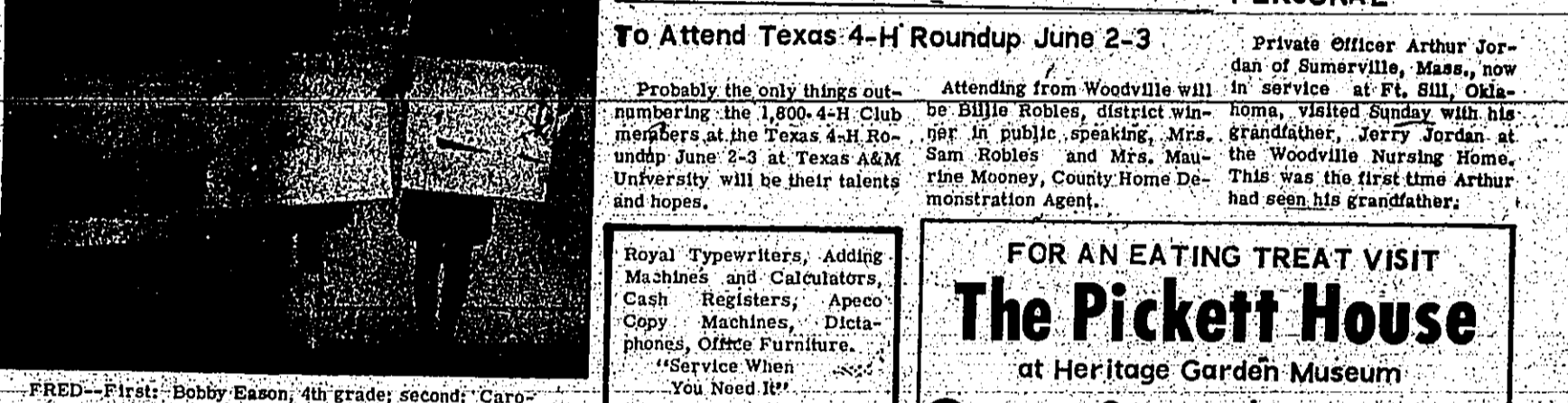
TYLER COUNTY BOOSTER WINNERS NAMED IN ANTI-LITTER POSTER CONTESTS IN SCHOOLS

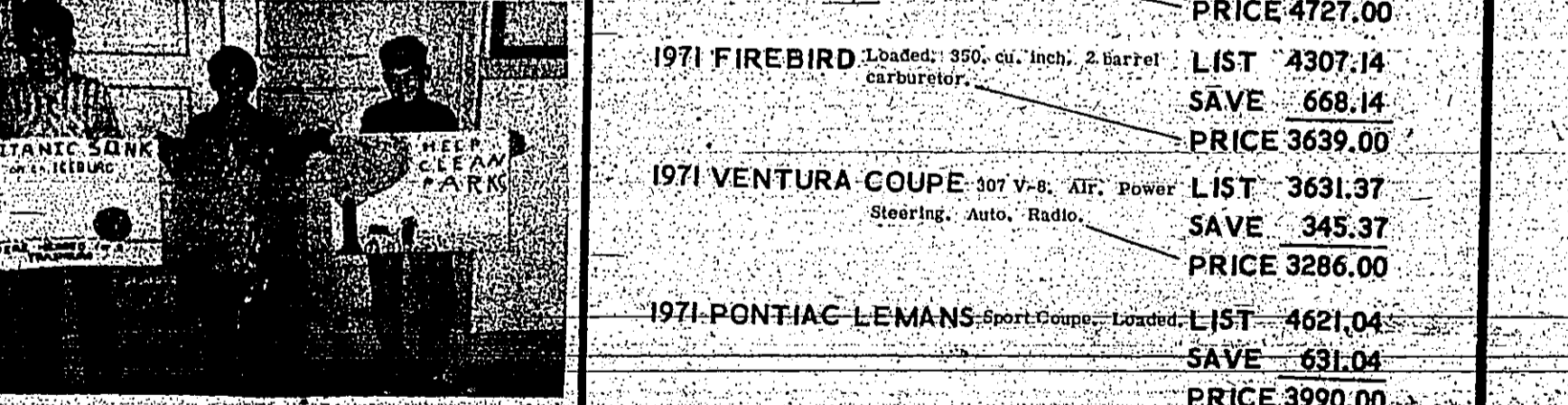

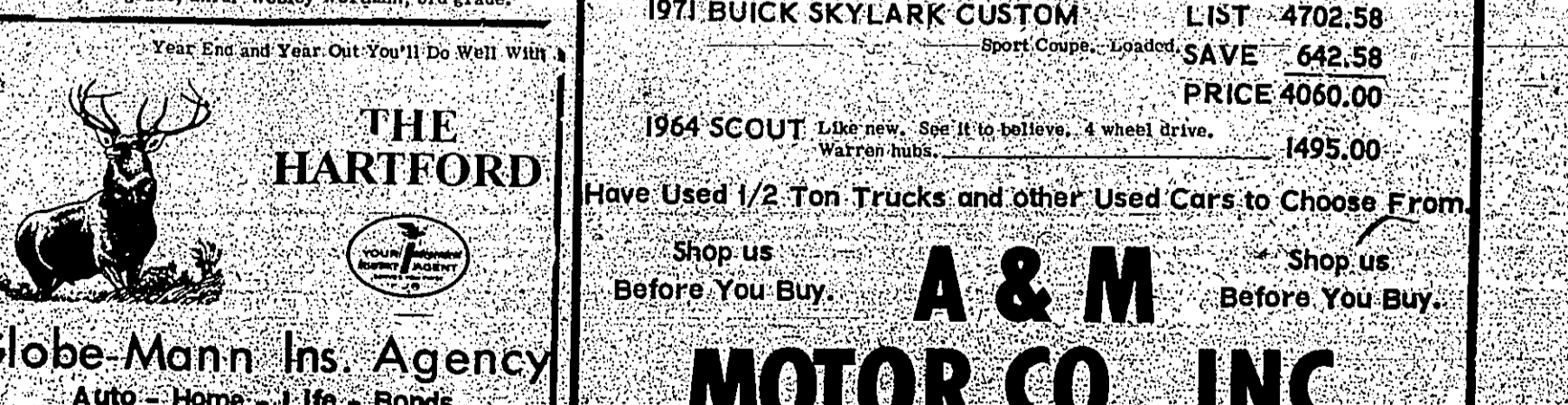
