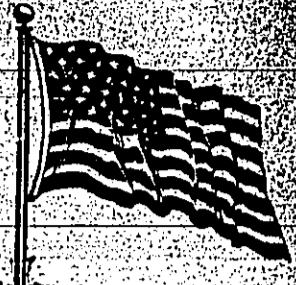

LITTLE LEAGUE GAMES

The second half of the Tyler County Little League season started last Thursday with the Colmesneil Cardinals continuing their hard-hitting streak with a 14 to 4 victory over Warren and the Eagles holding on to an early lead to edge the Yankees 9 to 8.

The Eagles jumped out to an 8 to 1 lead over the Yankees and increased it to 9 to 2 in the second inning. They nipped a Yankee rally in the late innings to emerge victorious in the first meeting of the two teams.

Friday night the first game was a free-hitting affair between the Red Sox and the Astros who were tied at 14 all until the fifth inning when the Red Sox scored to win the game.

The second game was a pitcher's duel going until the 7th inning tied 1-1 all between the Indians and the Tigers. The Tigers rallied to score and win the game.

Tonight (Thursday) and Friday night's games pit some of the stronger teams against each other and may indicate the teams which will contend for the championship.

Thursday night the Astros meet the Tigers in the first game. The second game, however, should be a thriller with the surging Cardinals colliding with the fast-improving Eagles. Of course, if the Cardinals got by the Tigers this past Tuesday night (played after the Booster deadline), they will be contenders.

Friday night the Indians and Yankees meet in a game that could eliminate one or the other from second-half chances. Each team has lost one game in the second half, although the Yankees won the first half.

In the second game the Warren Dodgers meet the Red Sox. June 27 to July 3 is Boy Scout week and the teams will be idle while Scouts attend summer camp.

Chase Ends At Roadblock

Five Center men, are in the Polk County jail under \$10,000 bond and charges have been filed in Montgomery and San Jacinto counties following a robbery spree and a high speed chase, partly through Tyler County, early Sunday, June 13.

The escapades started near Humble, where the five picked up a Marine hitchhiking home to Porter after landing at the Houston airport. The Marine, Richard Broome, was robbed of \$30. Another hitchhiker, a Shepherd man, Sam Odom, was picked up and robbed of \$20 and a pocketknife.

Next the five robbed a Livingston service station of \$238. John Land, an attendant at LeBlanc's station, was roughed up in the robbery.

By this time an alarm had been sent out through East Texas and law enforcement officers were on the lookout for the car. A Livingston city patrolman, Cleburn Swilley, took up the chase after the car sped through a stop sign. He was using his personal car which had no radio and did not know of the robberies. He chased the car to Corrigan where it turned east on Highway 287 and he lost it.

Tyler County Deputy Sheriff John Wayne Davis sighted the car at Chester. He radioed other law enforcement units and followed the car to Woodville, Colmesneil and on toward Angelina county in a high speed chase.

Lufkin highway patrolmen set up a road block at Zavalla and Davis pursued the Zeigler car right into it.

Western Electric Spends \$103 Million With Texas Firms

Western Electric Company, the manufacturing and supply unit of the Bell System, purchased more than \$103.5 million worth of goods and services from Texas businesses during 1970, according to figures released by Southwest Bell.

The amount represented an increase of more than \$28 million over Western's 1969 Texas expenditures.

Western paid a total of \$103,505,466 to 1,740 suppliers in more than a hundred Texas towns and cities during the year. More than 87 per cent of these Texas firms were categorized as small businesses. The cities where Western's expenditures were greatest included Dallas, El Paso, and Houston. El Paso, Dallas, Fort Worth, Longview, Mesquite, Orange, Richardson, and Seadrift were among other Texas cities where Western spent more than a million dollars last year.

Payments to individual suppliers ranged from more than \$12.5 million down to several payments of \$2 each. The expenditures were part of nationwide purchases totaling more than \$2.5 billion in the United States last year, and did not include Western's \$37.4 million payroll in the state. As reflected in its Texas expenditures, Western not only purchases material to be used in production, but it also buys manufactured articles for use by the system's operating companies, such as Southwestern Bell, which serves more than 80 per cent of the telephones in the state.

Trustees Accept Bids On Buses

The board of trustees of Woodville Independent School District at its meeting Monday night opened bids on three old school buses—and found that they are commanding a good price in Houston.

Because of the need for all the buses available to carry pupils back and forth to meet integration demands, a Houston

firm which has a bussing contract with the Houston district submitted higher bids than expected for the three buses which have been replaced by new vehicles here. 7-K Transit Company bid \$685 for a 1959 Ford bus, \$870 for a 1964 Chevrolet and \$980 for a 1965 Chevrolet school bus.

Next highest bid was made by a Groves Boy Scout Troop which bid \$499.99, \$716.66 and \$456.75 respectively for the 1959, 1964 and 1965 model vehicles.

The Antioch Baptist Church submitted a bid of \$826.50 for the 1964 bus, and other bidders were in the \$300 to \$550 range.

The board voted to accept the high bids with the proviso that if the sale did not go through the next highest bids will be accepted.

The bid of Citizens State Bank of Woodville was accepted as depository for school funds. Carey D. Cruse, president of the bank, submitted the bid.

The bank offered interest rates of 4.75 percent, 5 percent and 5.25 percent on certificates of deposit depending on length of time and amounts deposited.

The bank put up \$2500 cash and pledged collateral of \$100,000 for performance of the depository contract. It was accepted by the board with R. E. Swearingen, L. G. Burton and Harold Allison, Jr., voting for it. Abstaining from voting because they were on the bank's board of directors were W. S. Jarrott, W. S. Nichols and F. M. Archer.

The depository agreement will go to the Texas Education Agency for its approval.

Other items on the agenda were the May financial report and the tax collector's report, also for May, an attendance report for the past school year which showed the system complying with the required classroom teacher ratio to average daily attendance of 14.9 pupils, and the adoption of a policy for admittance to kindergarten.

Board member F. M. Archer said he was glad to get the attendance report which showed the number of pupils in each classroom. He said some patrons had complained of too many pupils in certain classrooms which is refuted by the report.

Thunderstorm Brings Light Rain

The thunderstorm early Monday night did not result in too much rainfall in Woodville. The Texas Forest Service station at the district headquarters south of town measured 0.6 of an inch.

At Spurger, where winds tossed some trees around between Grady Waldrop's and the Methodist Church, rainfall totaled .45 of an inch. Tornadoic winds whipped some limbs from trees and one large tree fell

on a car belonging to the Methodist minister, according to George Smith, who lives in the area.

Spurger and Tyler County were under a severe thunderstorm alert at the time, but no other damage was reported in Tyler County.

A resident of Dam B said he measured two inches of rain as the storm swept through there. June has been another dry month with less than an inch of rain measured at the Texas Forest Service gauge at Woodville. More rain has fallen in showers at some scattered places but pastures, gardens and stock ponds are in critical need of moisture. The TFS gauge here measured no rain until June 10 when .17 of an inch fell. On June 17, .08 of an inch was measured and on June 18 the gauge showed .34 of an inch.

More thundershowers were forecast for Tuesday but as the Booster deadline passed, no rain had fallen in Woodville.

Woodland Trail To Open June 25 Near Camp Ruby

A woodland trail bordered by 200-year-old bottomland hardwoods and also upland pines will be opened June 25 near the old Camp Ruby logging townsite.
