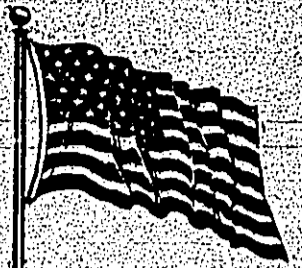

Big Land Companies, County Dispute Dropping Discounts

Timberland owners in Tyler County and other large acreage holders likely will protest the action of the county equalization board in removing the controversial discounts on land on the tax rolls.

The discounts, which range from one percent on small landowners to 20 percent for owners of 750 acres or more, was removed by the commissioners court sitting as the county board of equalization, at its meeting on June 8.

At a meeting held with representatives of the land companies on June 22 the board heard protests from representatives of the companies and one representative told the board that his company likely would refuse to accept the action and go to court.

About 85 percent of the land in the county is owned by large timber companies.

The board has meetings scheduled for July 7 with oil company representatives and on July 8 with individual property owners.

The controversial discount schedule which the board voted to discontinue gives a one percent discount on 15 to 25 acres, two percent on 25 to 50 acres, three percent on 50 to 100 acres, five percent on 100 to 250 acres, ten percent on 250 to 500 acres, and fifteen percent on acreage from 500 to 750. Over 750 acres the discount was 20 percent, or 80 percent of the regular valuation.

The land size discounts were in addition to evaluation discounts set forth in the discount schedule. These included the following schedules:

- Pipeline and Utility R. O. W.: If the ROW is an easement, determine the amount of acres involved and consider it 10% good.
- Ditches and Gullies: Determine number of acres contained within and use a 10% good factor.
- Mining operation that have been abandoned: Same as No. II above.
- Oilfield Damage: Discount determined by the degree of damage the land has incurred.
- Brush and Undergrowth: Determined by the thickness and density. Discount from 5% to 20%.
- Swamp or Marsh Lands: Land that will not drain off water, up to 50% discount.
- Low Lands: Land with poor slow drainage discount up to 15%.
- Inaccessible Land: Determine the degree of inaccessibility and discount from 10% to 25%.

Miss Texas Pageant Is Next Week

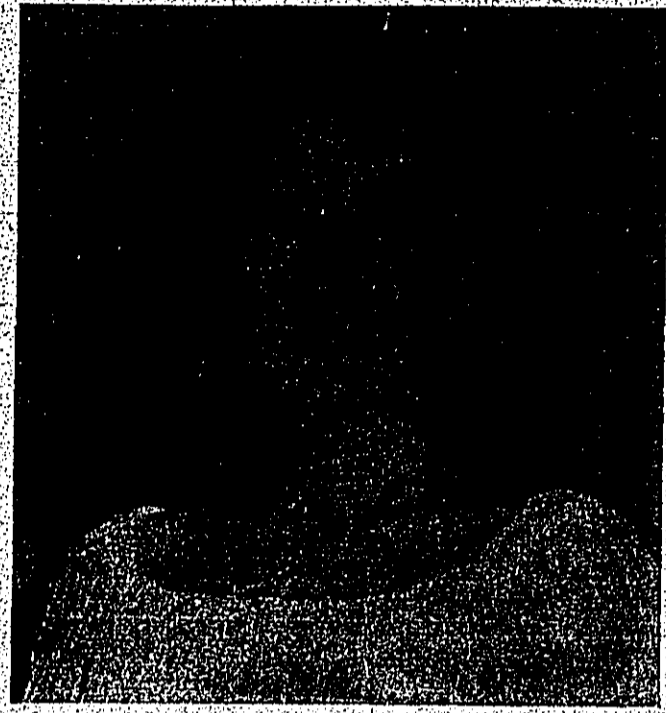

Postal Service Day To Be Observed At Woodville P. O.

July 1, 1971 has been designated Postal Service Day not only to commemorate the official inauguration of the United States Postal Service, but in hopes of the general public and the postal employees may begin a new era toward improving postal service and better public relations for all concerned, postmaster H. M. Durham said.

Every post office and station in the nation will have to distribute a new imprinted envelope showing the new postal service emblem and seal. This will inaugurate the new postal services. These envelopes will be given out free to the public so long as they last. A new United States postal service stamp will also be issued on July 1. For those who would like a first day cover, the post office will place a new US Postal Service stamp on the new envelope and postmark it.

This will be the first such cover in the history of the Postal Service.

A small quantity of booklets which will describe the new United States Postal Service and how it works, will be available. It is especially aimed at fostering mutual cooperation—telling how patrons can help the post office give the kind of service they need and want.

Stores To Close For Holiday

Tyler County's three banks, and stores, the courthouse and city hall, as well as state and federal offices will be closed Monday in observance of the July Fourth holiday.

The fourth comes on Sunday and will give many people a three-day holiday with the Monday closing.

The exception to agencies taking holidays will be the Texas Highway Patrol, county sheriff department and city police. They will put in many hours overtime in an effort to keep down the predicted number of highway fatalities. Countdown on auto fatalities will begin at 2 p.m. and continue through the weekend until midnight Monday.

With pretty weather the highways and byways are expected to be crowded with a record number of cars and people.

In Woodville all stores will be closed except the service stations, drive in groceries and cafes. This will include Griffin's Pharmacy and Bob's Prescription Shop. Although Jarrott's Pharmacy will be open part of the day on both Sunday and Monday.

Sales Tax Hike

The state sales tax takes a 4 cent jump today which means that buyers in Woodville and other towns with a city sales tax will pay up five cents in taxes each dollar spent.

The tax increase municipal areas will be four cents on the dollar.

Also going into effect is a tax of three cents per pack on cigarettes which, more than likely, will make the vice more expensive by five cents a pack.

The beer tax also will go up, but, naturally, that won't affect anyone in dry Tyler County.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

THE original author of the pledge was Francis Bellamy, who was born at Mount Morris, New York, May 18, 1855, and died August 28, 1931. He was ordained in 1879 at the Baptist Church in Little Falls, New York. The pledge he wrote was first used at the dedication of the World's Fair Grounds in Chicago on October 21, 1892, the four-hundredth anniversary of the discovery of America, and has been recited from that day to this, with some changes, by school children throughout our land. Reverend Bellamy's original wording was altered slightly by the First and Second National Flag Conferences in 1923 and 1924 and his work was officially designated as the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag by Public Law 287, Seventy-ninth Congress, approved December 28, 1945. On June 14, 1954, Flag Day, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed into law House Joint Resolution 243, introduced by Representative Louis C. Rabaut of Michigan, which added to the Pledge of Allegiance the compelling and meaningful words "under God."

Nine Plead Guilty In District Court

Nine defendants entered guilty pleas in 88th District Court Tuesday before Judge H. A. Coe. Four cases were dismissed and one probationary sentence was revoked.

Leading the number of offenses was driving while intoxicated, second offense, with seven defendants entering guilty pleas. Two defendants entered guilty pleas in theft cases.

Charges against four defendants were dismissed. Two of these were for DWI, one for removing mortgaged property from the country, and one for theft.

In the non-jury session held each fourth Monday, Judge Coe granted five divorces and approved two adoptions.
