## NEW LAW IN EFFECT

### Brands Must Be Registered

All cattle owners in Tyler County will be affected by a law passed by the 62nd Texas Legislature, according to Clinton Currie, county agent. The law is S. B. No. 249, an Act relating to the recording and re-recording of livestock brands and marks.

The new law goes into effect on September 1, 1971, and requires all cattle brands and their location on the animal be recorded with the county clerk in the owner's county of residence. Livestock owners with operations in more than one county must record their brands or marks in all counties in which they operate. Their brands and marks must be re-recorded every 10 years.

available for use on a first come-first served basis. Under the new law, it is illegal to brand livestock without first properly recording the brand with the county clerk in the county in which the livestock are held, Currie added.

There is no limit to the number of brands or marks which may be recorded in a county by a person, provided requirements of the law governing the recording and re-recording of livestock brands are met.

The law applies to all counties in Texas and takes precedence over any special statutes previously applying to individual counties and pertaining to recording and re-recording of brands.

## Enrollment At County Schools Shows Increase

Total enrollment in the five Tyler County school districts is up about 267 from last year according to preliminary figures in the office of B. M. Minter, county superintendent.

Total enrollment so far this year is 3290 which compares with 3023.

Woodville schools, which account for most of the increase, have registered 1074 students. Warren schools have registered 784 students. Other schools and enrollment in each are: Chester, 210; Colmesneil, 943; and Spurger, 260.

## Rural Water Supply Men Hold Meeting Here Friday Night

Detailed information concerning rural water supply corporations was presented Friday night at Woodville Inn to water system leaders from an eight county area which included Hardin, Jasper, Liberty, Newton, Polk, San Jacinto, Trinity and Tyler Counties.

Those present were told of the new Water Utilities Training School which is being developed by Texas A&M University and which will be presented this fall in various sections of the state. Results of efforts in the field of taxation by the Texas Association of Rural Water Corporations also was explained.

Bill Lawson, chief of Community Services of the State Office of Farmers Home Administration in Temple, discussed future development of systems throughout the state and answered questions system representatives had concerning their operations.

Jerry Johnson, Nacogdoches, and John Spinks, Crockett, District Directors of TARWC, emphasized the importance of the session stating, "Rural water supply corporations are new in the state compared to other rural services, and it is vital that meetings be held to allow an exchange of ideas and presentation of the services offered through the State Association."

## DPS Predicts 52 Traffic Deaths Over Long Holiday Period

Colonel Wilson E. Speil, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, estimated that traffic accidents over the long Labor Day weekend will claim 52 lives in the state.

Speil called for motorists to avoid drinking while driving, avoid fatigue, and modify their driving speed in accordance with expected heavy traffic conditions.

In an effort to hold the toll down, the DPS and local law enforcement agencies, in cooperation with the news media of Texas, will conduct "Operation Motorcade"—a public awareness program designed to focus attention on the traffic problem. Special reports on fatal traffic accidents will be prepared at DPS headquarters and released three times daily during the holiday period which runs from 6 p.m. Friday, September 3, to midnight Monday, September 6.

All available uniformed officers of the Department of Public Safety will be on the highways during the holiday to enforce state traffic laws, and maximum use will be made of radar and breath-testing instruments. Speil said DPS personnel would do all possible to keep traffic flowing smoothly and safely on this final holiday weekend of the summer.




