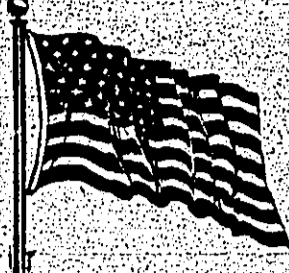

## NEW LAW IN EFFECT

### Brands Must Be Registered

All cattle owners in Tyler County will be affected by a law passed by the 62nd Texas Legislature, according to Clinton Currie, county agent. The law is S. B. No. 249, an Act relating to the recording and re-recording of livestock brands and marks.

The new law goes into effect on September 1, 1971, and requires all cattle brands and their location on the animal be recorded with the county clerk in the owner's county of residence. Livestock owners with operations in more than one county must record their brands or marks in all counties in which they operate. Their brands and marks must be re-recorded every 10 years.

## Enrollment At County Schools Shows Increase

Total enrollment in the five Tyler County school districts is up about 267 from last year according to preliminary figures in the office of B. M. Minter, county superintendent. Total enrollment so far this year is 3293 which compares with 3023.

Woodville schools, which account for most of the increase, have registered 1074 students. Warren schools have registered 794 students. Other schools and enrollment in each are: Chester, 210; Colmesneil, 943; and Spurger, 269.

## Rural Water Supply Men Hold Meeting Here Friday Night

Detailed information concerning rural water supply corporations was presented Friday night at Woodville Inn to water system leaders from an eight county area which included Hardin, Jasper, Liberty, Newton, Polk, San Jacinto, Trinity and Tyler Counties.

Those present were told of the new Water Utilities Training School which is being developed by Texas A&M University and which will be presented this fall in various sections of the state. Results of efforts in the field of taxation by the Texas Association of Rural Water Corporations also was explained.

Bill Lawson, chief of Community Services of the State Office of Farmers Home Administration in Temple, discussed future development of systems throughout the state and answered questions system representatives had concerning their operations.

Jerry Johnson, Nacogdoches, and John Spinks, Crockett, District Directors of TARWC, emphasized the importance of the session stating, "Rural water supply corporations are new in the state compared to other rural services, and it is vital that meetings be held to allow an exchange of ideas and presentation of the services offered through the State Association."

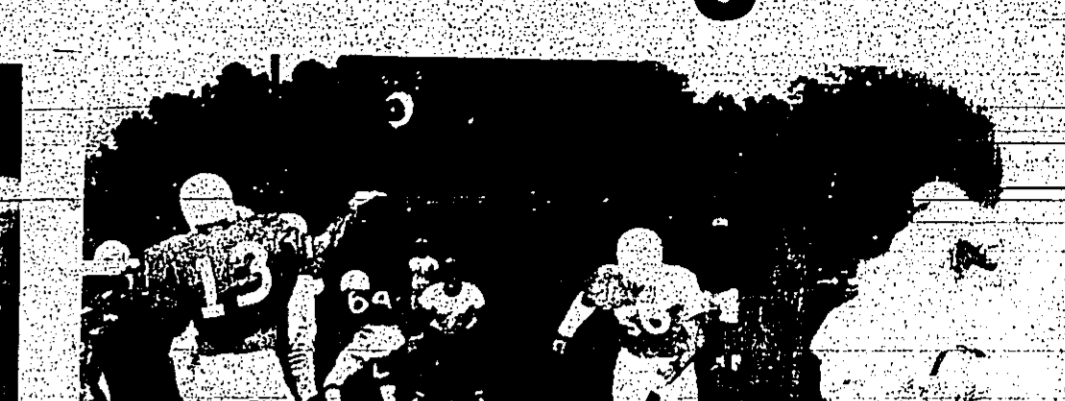

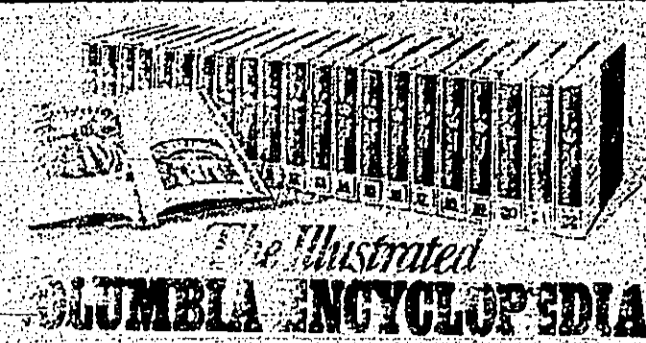

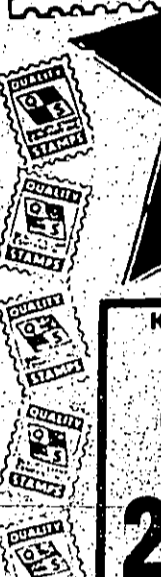
