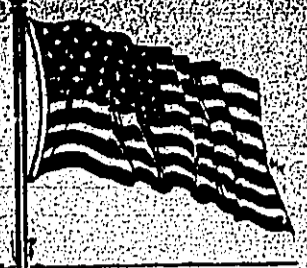

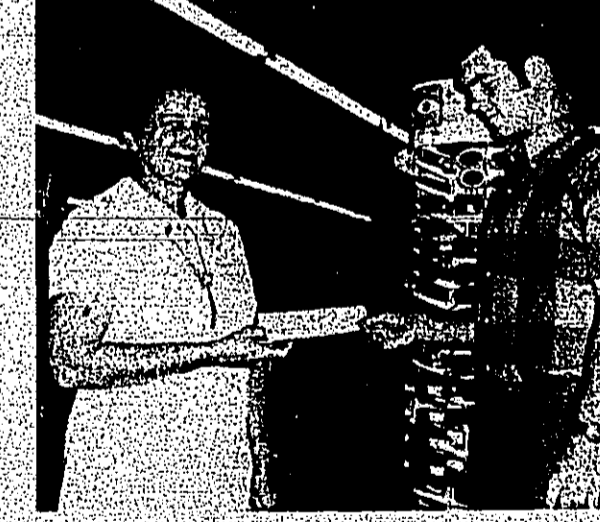

Dr. Lorton Gayle Burton of Woodville has been named a charter diplomate of the American Board of Family Practice as a result of passing a certification examination administered under the aegis of the ABFP. To achieve diplomate status Dr. Burton, through an intensive two-day written examination, proved his ability in the areas of internal medicine, surgery, obstetrics-gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry, preventive medicine and other traditional specialties...

You could have a better life taking care of people who are sick and need you. The life of a Licensed Vocational Nurse could be the one you have longed for.

Your hospital is making plans to select people who are interested in training for a Licensed Vocational Nurse.

If you are between the ages of eighteen and fifty, residing in Tyler County, have a 10th grade education or equivalent, and have a strong desire to help other people, be sure to investigate their career.

The only other qualifications that you must have to enroll in this twelve month course are to be a citizen of the United States and of good moral character; be able to furnish three references; be in good health, and be able to work all three shifts.

The tuition for this course has been in family practice a minimum of six years and has successfully completed 300 hours of postgraduate medical education.

The list of charter diplomates released by the ABFP the twentieth specialty board approved by the American Medical Association and the American Board of Medical Specialties includes successful candidates from the first certification examination given in 1970...

These specialists must continue to show proof of competency in the field of comprehensive, continuing care of the family by taking another exam and being re-certified every six years. No other specialty requires its diplomates to prove their competence on a continuing basis.

The ABFP is unique among certifying boards because it offered no "grandfather clause" which allows doctors practicing in the specialty when a board is created to become diplomates of that board without examination. To qualify for the examination each doctor completed a 3-year family practice residency, or

is \$100.00 payable in advance however, there are some scholarships available for those who qualify.

On entering the course, you must sign an agreement to attend all classes regularly and any person who terminates from the class after the first four weeks will forfeit all of the tuition.

After completion of the twelfth week, a stipend will be paid to each student by the hospital to help cover the cost of meals, transportation, and uniforms.

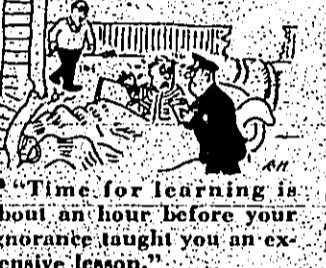
During the first twelve weeks, each student will attend classes from 8:00 a. m. to 3:00 p. m., with one hour for lunch, five days a week. Starting the thirteenth week the students will participate in floor duty along with classroom study.

Since the school is a Licensed Vocational Nurses Training Facility, those persons meeting the above qualifications will be required to take a special test that has been designed for this course.

The exact date and time will be issued at a later date. Final selections of students for this course will be determined by the aptitudes or by the scores of this test.

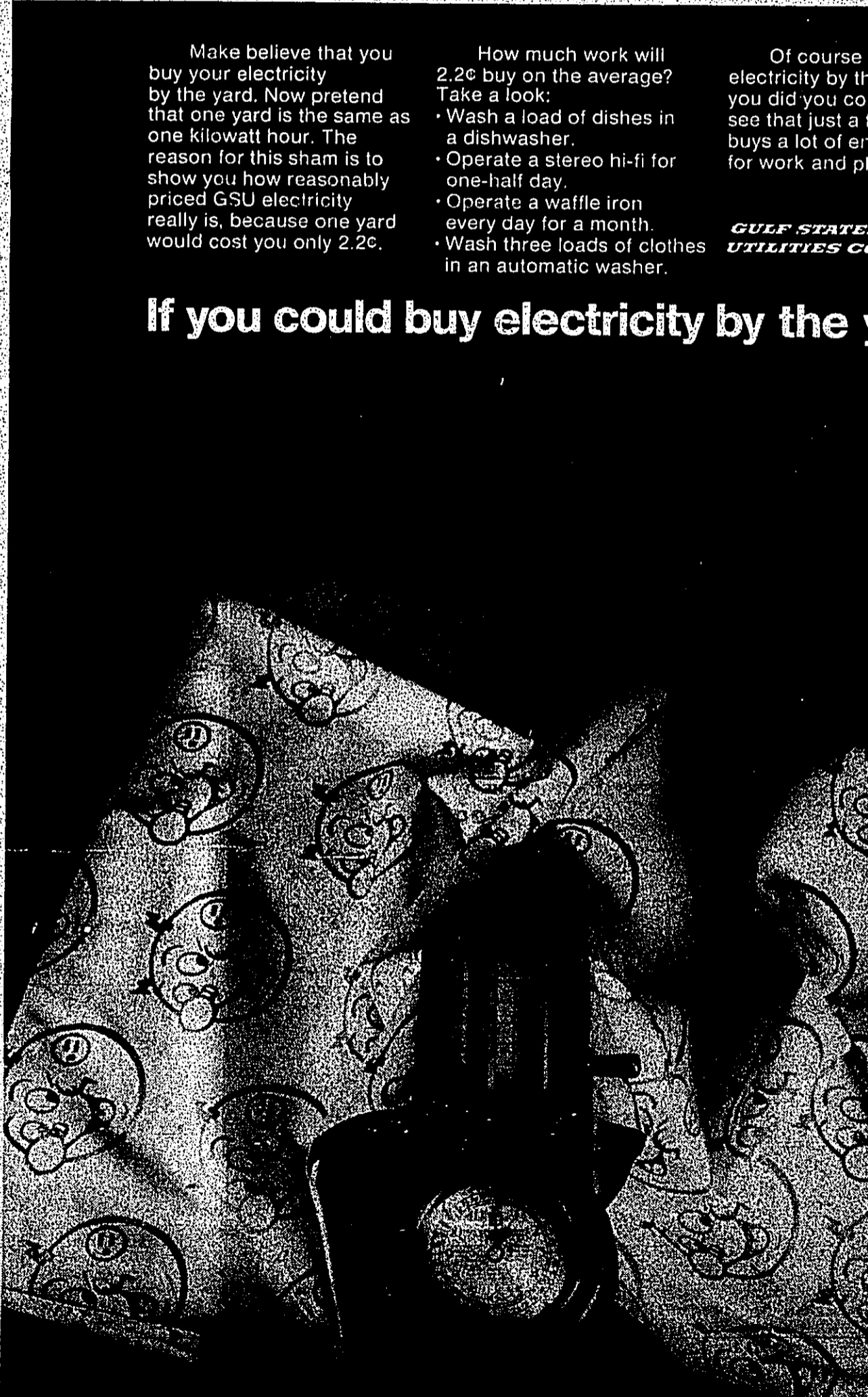

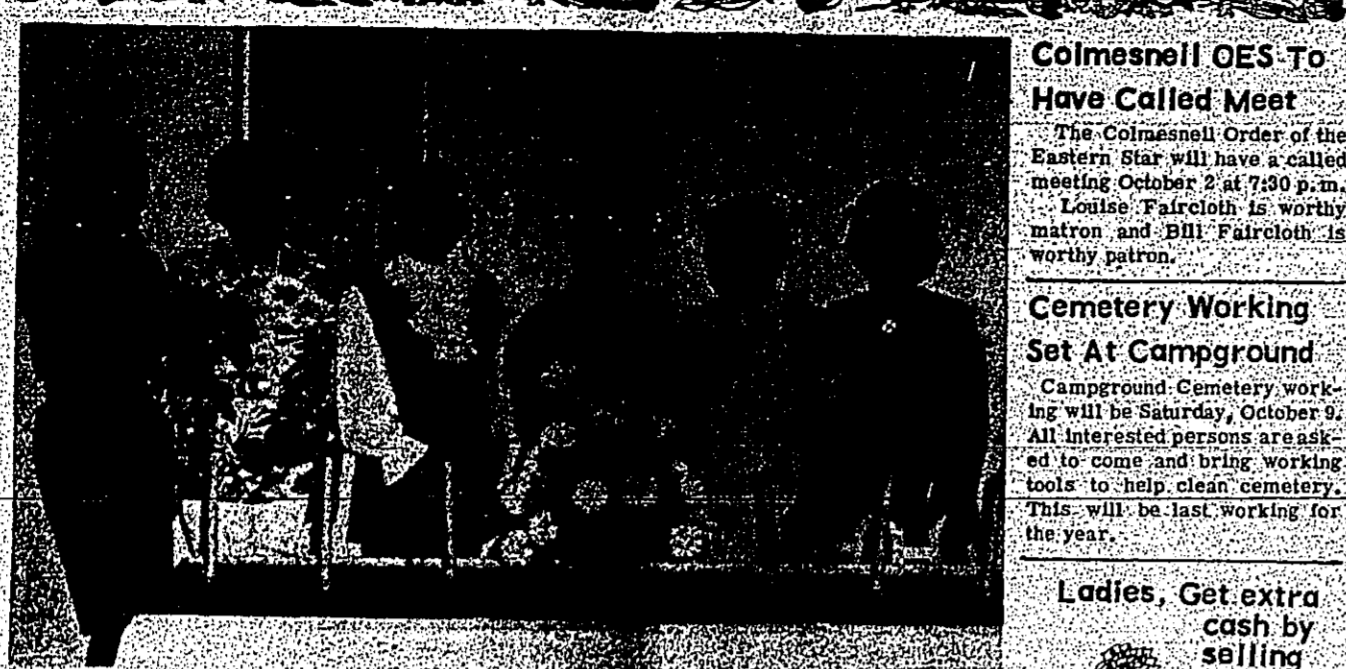

**KITCHEN REMODELING**  
Grandma's old-fashioned kitchen with its huge wood-burning stove and smells of good cooking, brings pleasant memories to most minds. However, her kitchen was originally big, inconvenient, poorly lighted and ventilated, colored above and a cabinet with a drawer below. Other centers, such as dishwashing, cooking and eating centers, should be planned in the same way.
