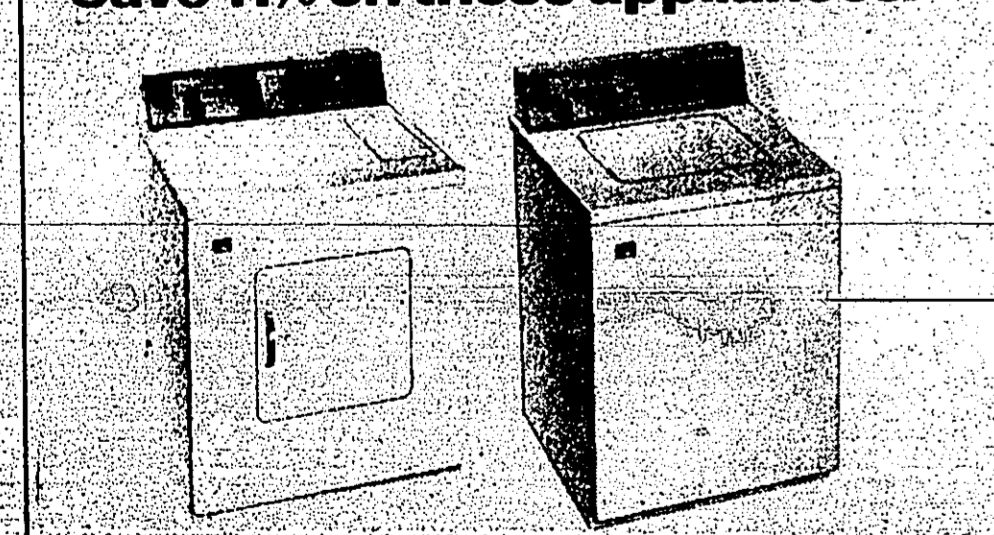

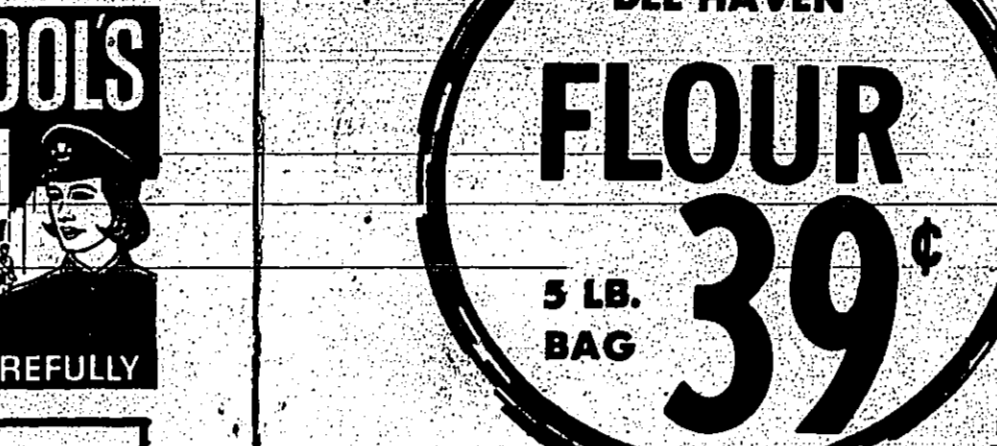

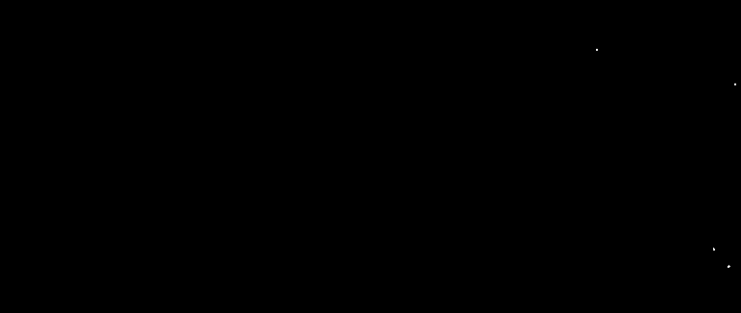

EAGLES PUSH WOLVES; BUT LOSE 25-18

This week we had a good first half. A fantastic one in fact. I hear people talk about the 20-18 loss to the San Augustine Wolves. The game marked homecoming for Kirby High School exes.

And San Augustine was a ranked team in Class A (that makes a difference). It looked like we were a ranked team the way we pushed the Wolves in the first half. We pushed them around so much that some players faked injuries just to get away from the head hunting Eagles. And it was just like someone had lit a fire under the Woodville football squad.

For they took the opening kickoff and on the second play from scrimmage, Jimmy King fired one into the midriff of tight end Tommy Daniel and the latter sped virtually untouched to the enemy goal line. The try for the extra point was wide to the right.

San Augustine came right back to tally the tying point with the big play of the drive being a pitch that looked like Wolves QB Bill Fuller pitched to a wide end who had a head start on the defense. Any rate, San Augustine tallied the two point try and led 8-6. But the fire still burned.

Woodville's offense generated more excitement mainly on the arm of quarterback Jimmy King and the flying foot of fullback James Moxie, but still didn't get into the end zone. Three He-man Jimmy passes into the red zone only to have the passes dropped by his receivers. And that is frustration. But late in the second period, Charles Latta and Eddie Miller followed a pitch and covered the opposing quarterback for a safety and a tie score. In the period King connected on a 28 yard field goal. And Woodville led at halftime 11-8.

Intermission took approximately 45 minutes.

And that must have done the flame for the Wolves took it right to the Eagles from the opening kickoff and quickly took a 10-11 lead with another touchdown and two point conversion, and they added another before the Eagles could get their fire lit again. But they did get it started again for the Wolves were put at the mercy of the Eagle defense. Led by Huddle Miller, Donald Brooks and John Peck numerous attempts were thwarted. They even caused so much confusion with their vigorous rush that an attempted screen pass was picked off by Stanley Mitchell and returned for 30 yards and a score with the help of a clearing block from Miller. After King added the extra point, it was 22-11 ball game.

Miller's broken pass pattern caused an interception and

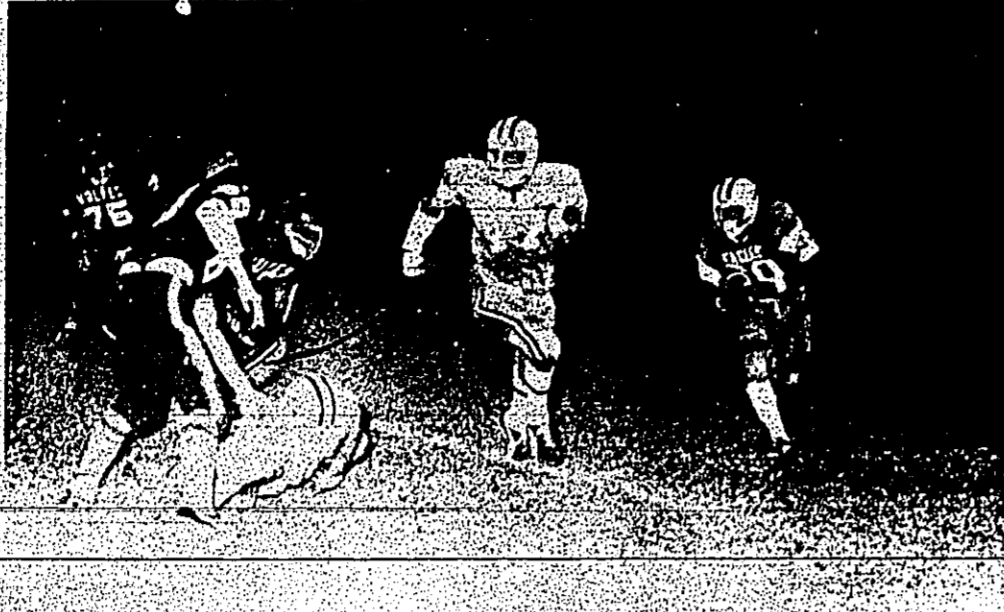

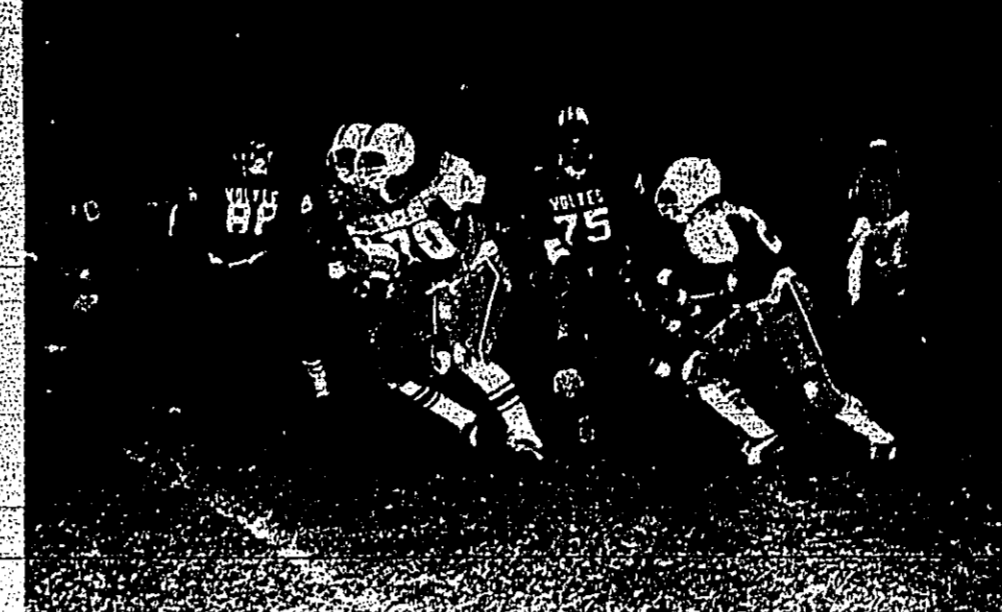
