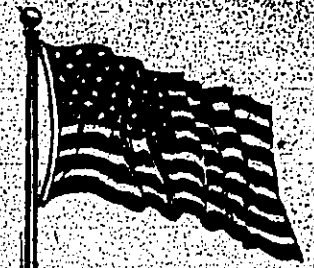

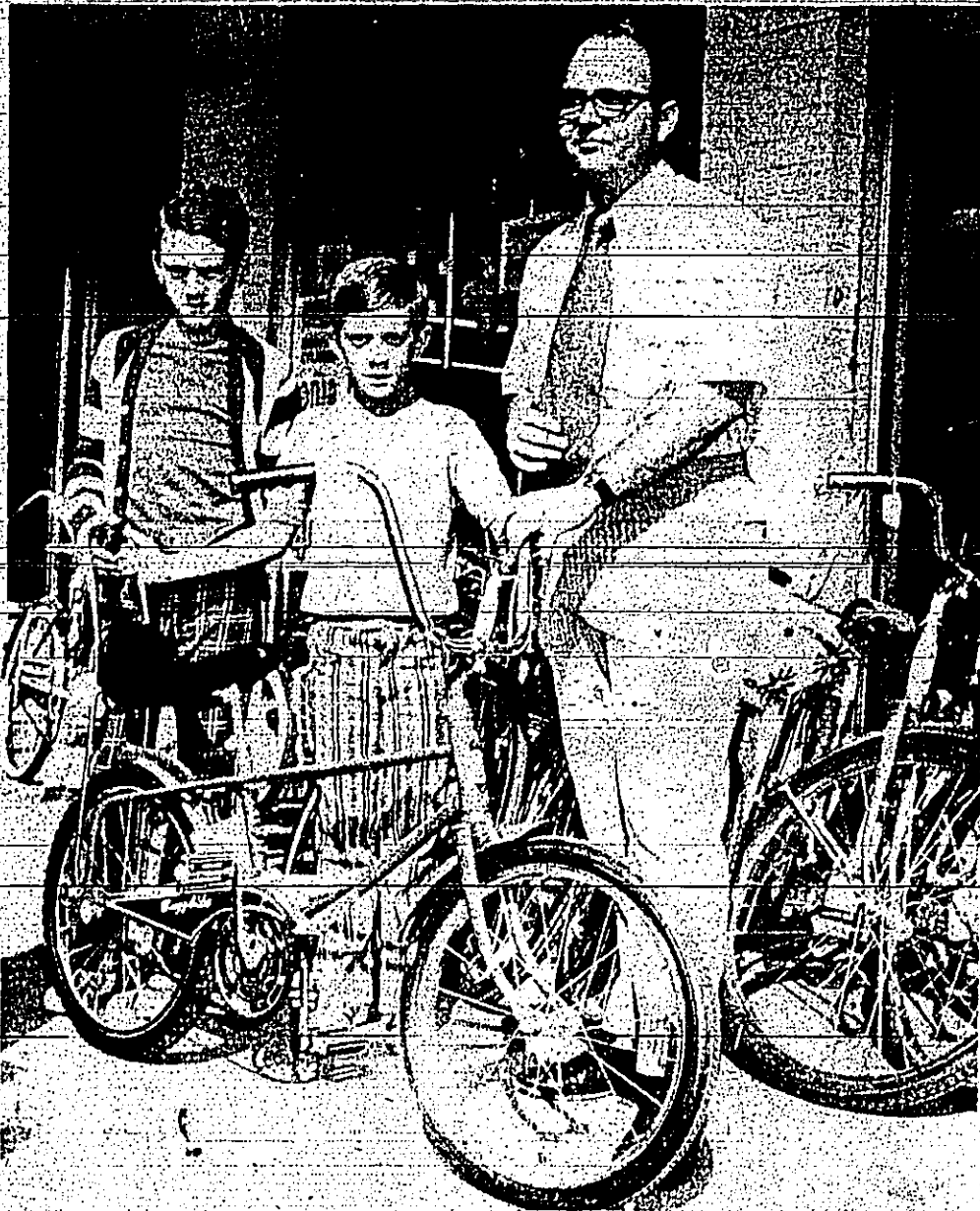

Chester Boy Is Second To Earn A Bicycle From Booster

Two girls and several boys have sold 12 or more subscriptions and each said they were trying to finish the required 25 new subscriptions in order to be the third boy or girl to earn a bicycle.

In order to earn a bicycle, boys and girls must sell 25 new subscriptions to the Booster.

Any person now receiving the "Booster" through the mail is not eligible to extend his subscription and have it counted toward a bicycle.

Any boy or girl in any Tyler County community may still enter the contest by picking up a receipt book and instructions at the Booster office at 704 South Charlton in Woodville. The subscription campaign will continue as long as any boy or girl is working to earn a bicycle for Christmas.

Eagles Play Bona In Final Home Game

Woodville's Kirby High Eagles will play their final home game of the season Friday night against Bona at Eagle stadium. Game time is 7:30 p.m.

Last Friday night the Eagles held vaunted, fifth-ranked Kirbyville to a 14 to 13 lead by scoring twice in the second half, once by Jimmy King and again by Ronald McCartney, after the Wildcats had taken a two touchdown lead in the first quarter.

Kirbyville scored again late in the second quarter to take a halftime lead of 20 to 13.

The second half was all Kirbyville as far as scoring went by tallying 19 points. Their all-state tailback, Earnest Bean, scored three touchdowns and passed for three more to lead the Wildcats attack to their seventh victory of the season.

Other Tyler County teams also will be busy this weekend. Warren Warriors will go to Hardin Friday night and Colman to Evadale Saturday. Chester, leading in its district's round robin play, will be at home against High Island Friday night.



PRICE DANIEL, JR., State Representative

Tyler County will be represented in the Texas House of Representatives by Price Daniel, Jr., of Liberty, according to redistricting lines drawn by the Texas Legislative Redistricting Board.

Daniel's District 6 has included Liberty, Chambers and Montgomery counties while Tyler County has been in District 7 which has been represented by Don Adams of Jasper.

Daniel's new district includes, besides Liberty and Tyler, Polk, San Jacinto and Trinity counties. Polk and San Jacinto have been in District 5 with Angelina County with John Hannah of Lufkin the representative. Trinity County has been in District 17 and was represented by James L. Lovell, Crockett rancher.

Liberty County with a population of 33,014 is the largest in Daniel's new district which has a total population of 74,218. According to the 1970 census, Tyler County has 12,417 people, Polk County 14,457, San Jacinto 6,702 and Trinity, 7,028.

Daniel is a 30 year old attorney. He is the son of former U. S. Senator, governor and attorney general of Texas, Price Daniel Sr. Young Daniel is a second term member of the Texas House of Representative and is an announced candidate for Speaker in the upcoming 63rd session.

"I am very pleased to have Tyler County added to my legislative district and look forward to working with and representing the people of the county in the Texas House," Daniel said this week.

The redistricting plan drawn by the last session of the Texas legislature was declared unconstitutional in a court suit, and under the statutes the task of redistricting became the duty of the Legislative Redistricting Board.

The Board consists of Lt. Governor Ben Barnes, Attorney General Crawford Martin, House Speaker Gus Mutscher, Comptroller Robert S. Calvert and Land Commissioner Bob Armstrong. All signed the new redistricting plan except Mutscher.

Earlier the redistricting board had redrawn the Senatorial District which is represented by Senator Charles Wilson to include, besides Tyler County, Jasper, Newton, Angelina, Hardin, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Nacogdoches, Cherokee, Anderson, Henderson, Rusk, Panola and Kaufman counties. The new district has Navarro and Polk Counties shifted into other districts and four counties added: Shelby, Rusk, Panola and Kaufman.

The slight change in this district is not expected to have much effect on Wilson's chances for re-election if he decides to run again. However, he is reported to be considering, and some say he has decided, to run for Congress.

There have been some indications that the House redistricting by the board may be challenged in Federal Court.

Supreme Court To Hold Memorial Service For Judge Clyde E. Smith

The Supreme Court will conduct a service in Austin Saturday at 10 a.m., honoring the memory of the late former Associate Justice Clyde E. Smith of Woodville.

Judge Smith began law study at the age of 17 in the Woodville offices of the late Judge Robert A. Shivers, father of former Gov. Allan Shivers, who was licensed to practice June 12, 1919.

He was a former Tyler County attorney, district attorney and was judge of the 75th Judicial District Court at Woodville. He was assistant Secretary of State in 1935-37.

Judge Smith was a past worthy grand patron of the Eastern Star, a 33rd degree Mason, a Shriner, a past president of both the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce and County Red Cross. He spent much time in work of the Boy Scouts of America.

He was a member of the original board of Baptist Hospital at Beaumont and was a member of the First Baptist Churches of Beaumont and Austin.

A son of Judge Smith is Clyde E. Smith, Jr., a sister, Miss Ruth Gillespie, and a brother, Clifford, all of Woodville; a son, Joe E. Smith of Dand-B and a daughter, Mrs. Audrey Ruth Kennedy of Frankfurt, Germany.

Six Divorces, Child Support Cases Heard In District Court

The regular Fourth Monday session of 88 District Court with Hon. H. A. Coe presiding turned out to be a busy one with seven divorce petitions, six contempt of court hearings in child support cases, and one plea of guilty by a defendant on a theft charge.

Judge Coe granted the seven divorces. In the contempt of court for non-support five of the defendants either paid back support due or reached agreements to pay. The sixth defendant was remanded to jail.

The defendant in the theft case was given to a two-year probationary sentence upon his plea of guilty.

The Tyler County grand jury held its regular monthly meeting Monday but returned no indictments.

Sunday Is Tims For Return To Central Standard Time

Good old Central Standard Time comes back to Tyler County and most of Texas at 2 a.m. Sunday when Daylight Saving Time officially ends its six months' reign over most of the clocks in the nation.

The easiest way to have the correct time when you arise Sunday morning is to set your clocks and watches back one hour at bedtime. Thus if you retire at 10 p.m. set your timepiece back to 9 o'clock and you will be in tune, timewise, with your neighbors Sunday morning.

The net result is that everyone will get up a little later each morning and that darkness will come too soon after the day's work is done.

Remember—this time turn the clock back one hour.

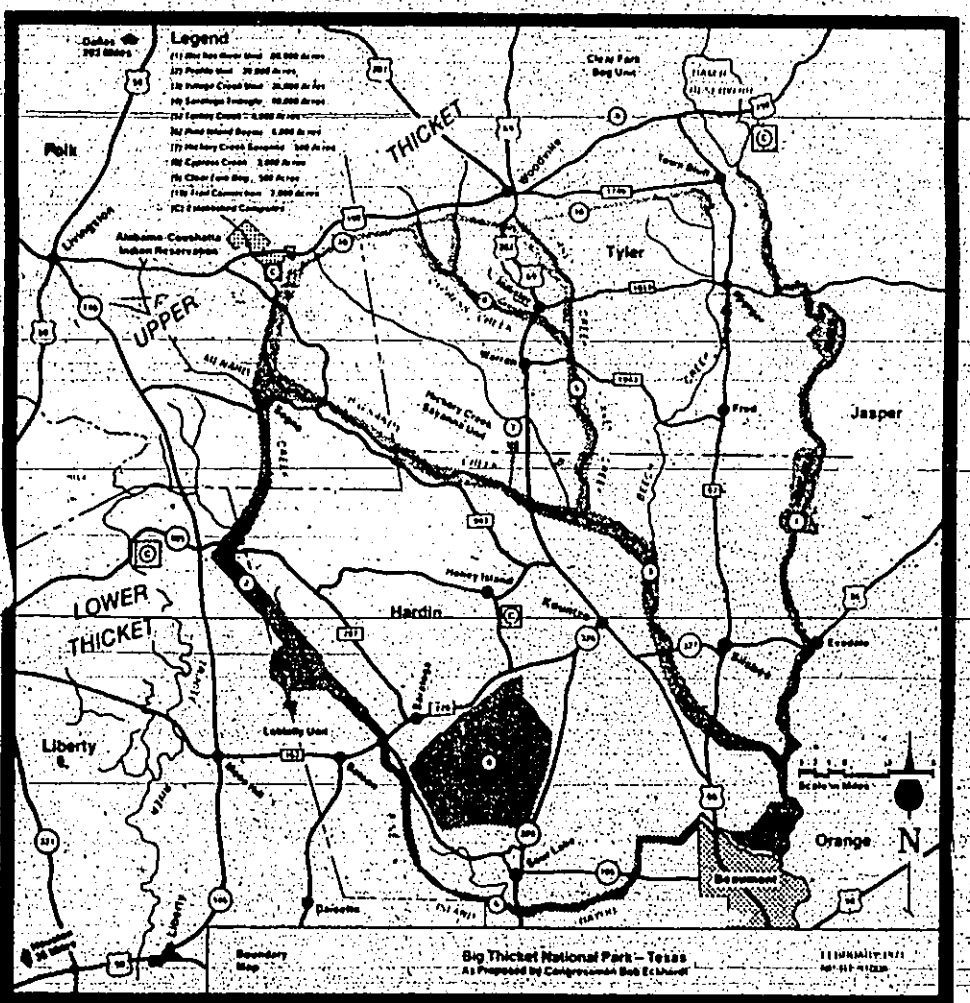
