Trainmen Alert Officers To Burglaries

An observant train crew alerted officers Wednesday morning of last week to suspicious actions of three men which resulted in their arrest and the clearance of at least 10 nighttime burglaries in Tyler County.

Arrested in an auto just east of the Southern Pacific railroad tracks were Archie Lee Holmes, charged in 10 counts of nighttime burglary, and Chester Lee Holmes and John Follie, implicated in seven of the break-ins. The Holmes men are brothers.

The chain of events leading to their capture began about 4:30 a.m. Wednesday, November 17, when G. O. Caver, engineer on a Southern Pacific freight train, saw the three men leave the railroad tracks and start walking east as the train pulled into the station here. Using the train radio, he notified H. D. Barnes, head brakeman of his suspicious.

H. A. Gardner, another brakeman, walked to the Texaco Service station at Magnolia and Bluff streets where he used a telephone to call the sheriff's office. The dispatcher got on the radio and notified the city's night chief of police, Kenneth Thyssen.

Thyssen responded to the call and met the trainmen at the depot. In the meantime, the trainmen had noticed an open door at Farmers Feed, located nearby, and then Thyssen investigated. He found that an attempt had been made to open a large safe with a cutting torch. Thyssen used his radio to summon assistance.

Thyssen noticed an auto parked on the wrong side of the highway, just past the road that turns to the gasoline warehouse along the tracks. Just as he pulled up, the car started to move and he pulled it over. About this time, Deputy Sheriff B. J. Varden arrived.

The officers found that two cases of oil were in the car along with a shotgun. These later were discovered to be from the Enco warehouse. The men also had entered the Gulf and Texaco warehouses which are nearby. However, the men evidently did not take anything from them.

In reconstructing the chain of events officers discovered that the men had broken into Birdwell's Machine Shop, located on East Bluff across from the feed store, where they took the acetylene welding torch which they used in the attempt to open the safe at the feed store. They also lifted a cash box from which around \$80 was missing.

The men had cut away the metal on the safe but were blocked from getting into it by a layer of concrete which they attempted to cut through with an axe belonging to the store. The axe later was found across the tracks where the men had thrown it on the roadside.

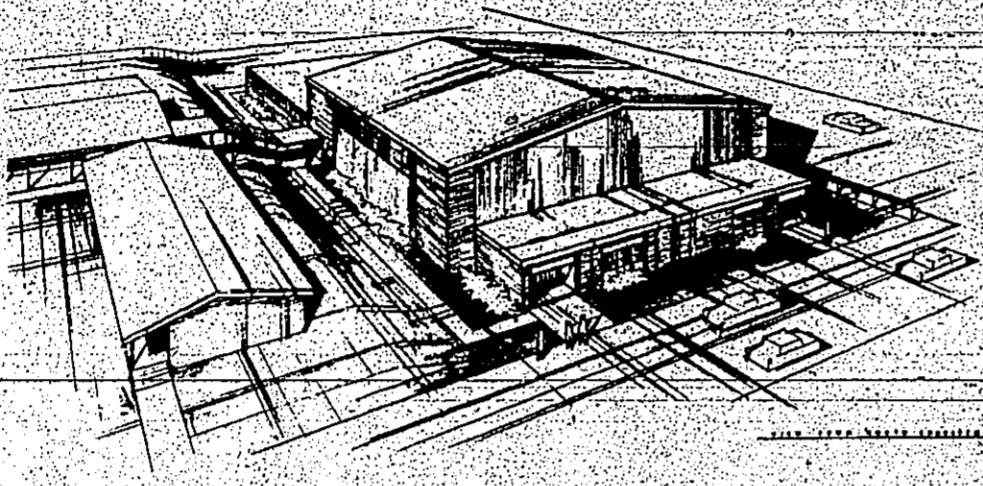
Bobby Birdwell, owner of the welding shop, said he had used a small cutting head on the torch the last time he used it or the men might have gotten into the safe.

Sheriff Grady Ray took charge of the investigation and implicated the men in other burglaries in the county besides the five on Wednesday of last week. One of the men made a statement admitting the burglaries of Tyco Feed Company and Jarrold's Pharmacy as well as other recent nighttime break-ins. Archie Lee Holmes admitted to 10 burglaries but said the other two men were not with him in three break-ins at Colmesnell.

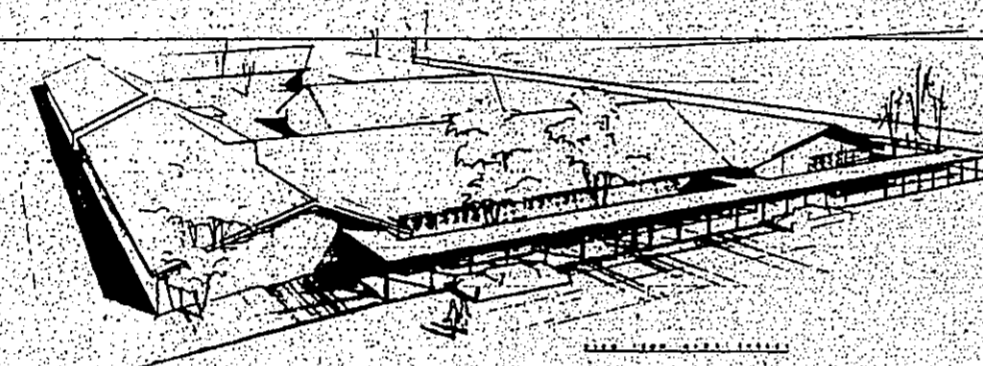
These included J. E. Riley Insurance, Freeman Drug and J. P. Dean Grocery. Chester Lee Holmes and John Follie were transferred to Hardin County Jail in connection with burglaries and safe jobs in that county. Archie Lee Holmes was being held in the Tyler County jail.

Sheriff Ray said that the investigation of the activities of the men is continuing. Officers praised the alertness of the trainmen in observing and reporting their suspicions. Mr. Barnes is a former Beckwith policeman who has been working with the railroad for a month.

Urgent School Needs To Be Met With Building Program

Woodville Independent School district has certain urgent building requirements that must be met to continue to comply with accreditation standards, and the \$800,000 bond issue to be voted upon at the December 11 election will enable the district to meet these standards, school officials said this week.

The district has not engaged in any major building program or remodeling activity since 1968. The condition of the existing buildings, the regrouping of grades as a result of the organization of a unitary school program and the beginning of a kindergarten program that soon will include all five year old children, among other things, makes it expedient that the proposed building program be completed at the earliest possible date, school officials say. The bond election on December 11 will determine whether the district will be authorized to issue \$800,000 in bonds to finance the proposed program. The election will be held in the Kirby High School building.

The Chester Yellow Jackets will meet the Danbury Panthers Friday night in Woodville Stadium in their bi-district play-off. Game time is 7:30 p.m. The Yellow Jackets swept their district without a loss although they had a tie with Colmesnell in the first meeting of the two teams in round-robin play. In the last game of the season the Yellow Jackets trampled the Bulldogs 30 to 0.

The Yellow Jackets ran up 317 points during the season while allowing only 92 points to their opponents. They gained a total of 3501 yards on offense.

Danbury, finishing its season a week later than Chester, defeated Wallis 30 to 0 last Friday night.

Supv. Aubry Bradley of Chester at once began work to get the bi-district playoff scheduled for the Woodville stadium, and finally succeeded in having the game played here.

The Yellow Jackets have two men who have each gained better than 1000 yards on offense this season. They are Waymon Berry who in 10 games has carried the ball 157 times for 1090 yards and 11 touchdowns, and Ken Barnes who in nine games has carried the ball 127 times for 1021 yards and 11 touchdowns. Barnes has scored four extra points for a total of 86 points while Berry has five extra points to his credit for a total of 76 points.

Others who have helped compile the Yellow Jackets massive scoring record are Al Bryan, who carried 39 times in seven games for 308 yards and two touchdowns and two extra points; Gus Marshall, 77 carries for 608 yards, six touchdowns and one extra point; and Quarterback Lynn Timbrook who has carried 37 times for 51 yards, three touchdowns and one extra point. Marshall and Timbrook have played in all 10 games.

The Booster has no data on the Danbury players except the sound teams and weights. Danbury has some heavy linemen and backs. Coach Gary Ganza of Chester said that it should be a good hardfought ball game and that the Yellow Jackets will play their hearts out to win in bi-district.

A standing room only crowd is expected to see the game at Woodville Stadium Friday night since this will be one of the best games of the year to be seen in the county.

Stadium Assails Bond Program

S. E. Stocum of Doucette, who heads a Citizens Committee in opposition to the proposed \$800,000 in bonds which will be voted upon December 11, this week accused the school board of disregarding the wishes of the taxpayers in the district by increasing the tax value from 40 to 50 percent of market value to pay for a bond issue which had not yet been voted.

He said that evidently the board has no respect or consideration for the taxpayers who earlier had turned down a proposed \$400,000 bond issue.

He said the board will pay a Bon Athar firm (architects) to draw plans and specifications; when local contractors would have made the estimates and plans at no cost. Forty-five thousand dollars would go a long way toward building classrooms, he declared.

Stocum said if this bond issue is forced upon the district the school board will employ outside contractors and labor to construct the facilities. A quarter of a million dollars will be spent for recreation facilities which is a luxury and will not help teach the three R's, he said.

For a poor county this is a luxury we can ill afford, he declared.

Ag Notes

USE CARE IN PLANTING TREES, SHRUBS. Do you've decided to plant trees or shrubs to your landscape this fall?

When planting bare-root or balled and burlapped shrubs, the first step is to dig a hole of sufficient size. If the plant has bare-roots, the hole should be large to allow the root system to spread out naturally.

As for as depth is concerned, plant the trees or shrub about the same depth it was growing in the nursery. This is often two to three inches above the uppermost roots. On a bare-root plant, the trunk or main stem is often discarded at the original soil line. Plant a balled and burlapped plant so the top of the soil ball is at the soil surface.

When planting small balled and burlapped plants, the planting pit should be about 1 1/2 times the diameter of the ball. The depth should be the same as the depth of the ball. Large plants will require an even greater hole size in relation to the ball diameter.

After setting the tree or shrub in its hole, backfill with a good soil mixture, using one-third soil, one-third peat moss, and two-thirds top soil. Then water the plant thoroughly. Fertilizer should not be used.

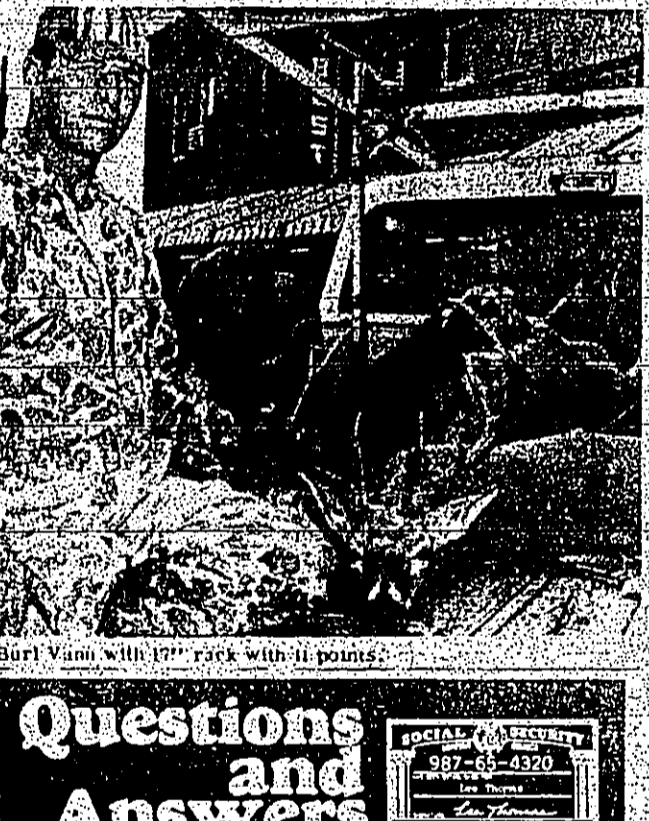

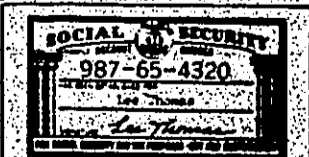
Q: I have been getting monthly social security disability benefits for a little over a year. Next year I will be 65. Will my disability benefits increase then?

A: No. When you reach 65, your disability benefits are changed over to retirement benefits. But the amount you receive each month will remain the same.

Q: My husband died just a few weeks ago. When I go to the social security office to apply for monthly survivors' benefits for my self and my two children, do I need to take any documents along?

A: Yes. You should bring along your husband's social security card or some record of his number, some record of his earnings during the past year (such as a W-2 form), the death certificate for your husband, your marriage certificate, your own birth certificate, and the birth certificate for each of your children.
