## JACKETS GO FOR CHAMPIONSHIP

# Chester Meets Chilton In Regional Friday At Crockett

Chester Yellow Jackets, looking very impressive in a 20-7 win over the Danbury Panthers here Friday night, will meet Chilton in Crockett this coming Friday night for the Class B regional championship. The game will begin at 7:30 p.m. in Crockett's Bulldog stadium.

Woodville's Eagle Stadium was filled almost to capacity last Friday night for the bi-district game and all those who possibly can will make the trip to Crockett to boost the Yellow Jackets. In their bid for the regional crown.

Chilton drew a bye and did not have to face a bi-district foe. They have been idle for two weeks which has given them time to prepare for the regional game. Chester came out of the Danbury game in good physical condition and the regional championship game will match two of the outstanding Class B teams in the state.

Walls had been rated Number One in the state and had defeated Danbury earlier in the season. The Panthers came into the Chester game fresh from a 31-0 victory over Walls.

Chilton, the Yellow Jackets regional opponent, went through 10 games without a defeat. They scored 296 points while holding their opponents to 73 and an average of 7.2 yards per game.

They had a bye in bi-district and have not played a game in the last two weeks.

Their opponents during the season and the scores are: Holland 31-6; Bruce-Eddy 31-6; Showalt 18-9; Bremond (class A) 12-6; Wortham 55-6; Moody 24-18; Bartlett 22-16; Norman 60-0; Riesel 28-6 and Lola 24-0.

Chester played in a round robin schedule in District 23B in which each team played the others twice. The Yellow Jackets defeated Sabine Pass 42-0, Evadale 42-0, High Island 38-0, Goodrich 36-0, and were tied 0-0 by Colmesnell in the first round. In the second round they beat Sabine Pass 28-6, Evadale 8-0, High Island 44-0, Goodrich 53-14 and Colmesnell 30-0.

As can be seen from the record, Chester shut out eight of their opponents while Chilton had only two shutouts while holding five other opponents to one touchdown. Only against Class A Bremond did Chilton fall to score three or more touchdowns during the season. However, there is no way to compare the strength of the opponents of the two teams and both coaches are getting their teams up for the regional championship game.

## Jackets Defeat Danbury

Chester ripped the Danbury Panthers 20-7 in their bi-district clash in Woodville last Friday night.

The Yellow Jackets used their devastating ground game and alert defense to do in the Panthers.

Danbury came into the bi-district clash having defeated the number 1 ranked class B team Walls last week 30-0. The Panthers looked like they may have been more than was bargained for as they went into the lead with Ronnie Short galloping 78 yards for the first score of the night. With the extra point added Danbury held a 7-0 lead.

Chester rolled a little themselves getting to the Panther five yard line with fourth and goal facing them. Lynn Timbrook threw a jump pass to end Charles Ray Barnes for the touchdown. It was the first TD of the year for Barnes, but it was a big one for Chester. The try for extra points was no good and Danbury still held a slim edge.

Danbury's next possession might have been the turning point of the game. Reaching their own 19 yard line with fourth and about six inches, they elected to try for the first down. Fullback Randy LeCompte barreled his way for what looked like a first down, but a flag was thrown and an outside call was assessed the Panthers. This was a little too much to gamble for so the punting unit went in.

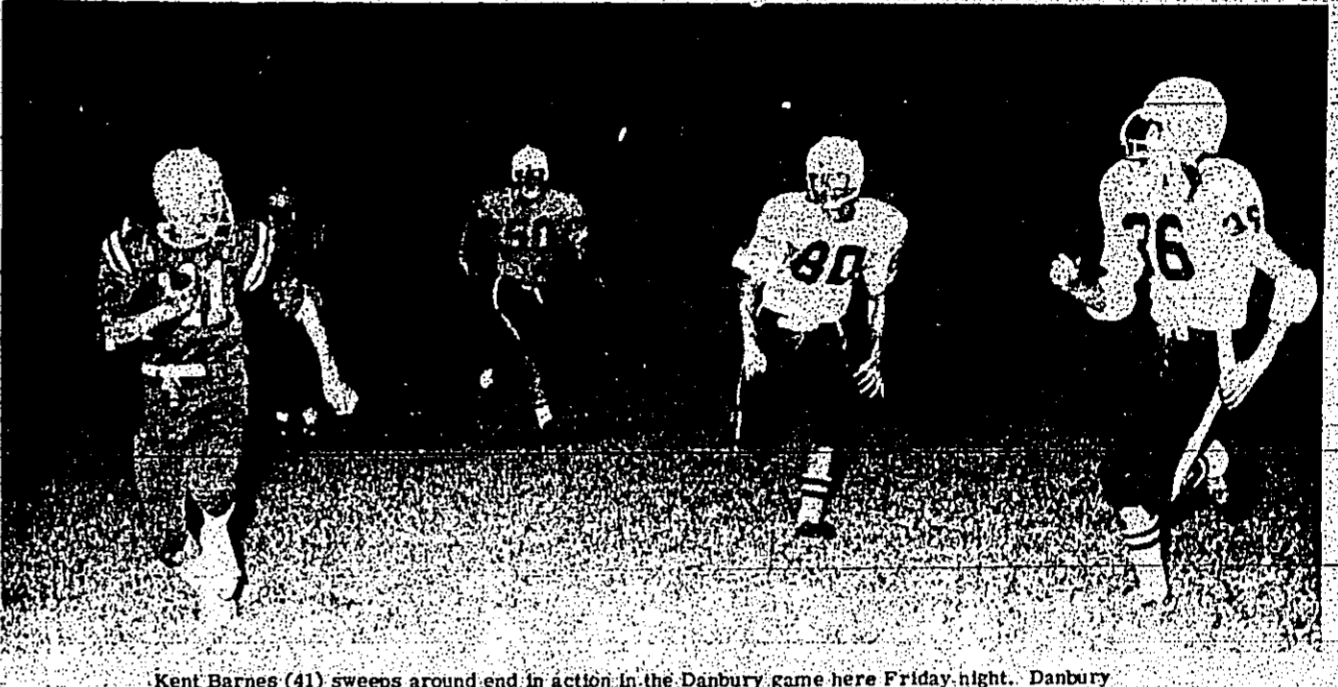
Donnie Bulanek, the Danbury punter, got a kick off the side of his foot that traveled about 16 yards and gave the Yellow Jackets the ball deep in Panther territory. It didn't take long behind the running of Waymon Berry, Kent Barnes and Al Bryan to get the ball close where Bryan pushed in from the one foot line on first down to give the lead to Chester. Barnes toted the ball across for the extra two points and Chester had command.

The Jackets defense rose to the occasion against any threat the Panthers had. Twice interceptions stopped drives and twice two sure touchdown passes were batted down by alert defenders.

Kent Barnes got the last touchdown in the third quarter with the try for conversion being no good.

## One-Fourth Of Easements Signed For Water Line

One-fourth of the easements for the Highway 100 East water line have been returned and others on the old water line which will be replaced are urged to return theirs as soon as possible.

The new six-inch line will be laid by the city with the residents furnishing the pipe and materials. The old line has furnished water for around 35 residences from the city limits past Woodville Lumber Company since the early 1950s, but will have to be moved because of the proposed widening of the highway.

The old two inch line was inadequate and several residents along the line proposed to the city that they will furnish pipe if the city will lay the new six inch line. Since the city has been furnishing water for around 20 years to these residences, the city council felt obligated to accept the offer. When completed the line will be turned over to the city.

bond election when a \$400,000 election had been defeated by a narrow margin earlier this year. We do not feel that way at all because the most common reason given for voting against the \$400,000 issue was that it was too small an amount to do the job adequately—and it certainly was.

By State Law, a registered architect has to certify school building plans. Just as there is no heart surgeon living in Tyler County, there is no registered architect. For this reason, a firm from out of county was hired. The construction would be done by the low bidder, wherever he lived. Hopefully, many local people, as well as local materials, would be used in this work.

The younger people bear the great majority of the financial burden for the expense of Medicare, Medicaid, and Old Age Assistance while raising their families. It doesn't seem fair that their families should be deprived of adequate educational facilities.

We all need to remember that good schools are important for everyone, even if you do not have any children or grandchildren in school here. How can we hope to get doctors, other professionals, or new jobs here if we do not have good schools? We do not want to stay a poor county!

Our school taxes have had to be raised because of new insurance required by State Law, raises in teacher pay (long overdue), general inflation, and a large increase in local fund assignment by Austin. The current net rate is enough to cover these bond payments for the present time. No one can predict the future enough to know what our taxes will be with or without bonds. In

any event, school taxes are deductible from federal taxes, and our school taxes here still compare very favorably with other smaller districts.

These plans have been drawn up after much expert study and work. They are adequate but not extravagant.

If these bonds are voted down, I will sincerely hope a delegation of those that voted "NO" will show up at the next board meeting and tell us what to do with all these children and not enough buildings. It's not fair to just be against something unless you can give a constructive alternative.

Please vote "FOR" on December 11th. Our children deserve it, and Woodville can't afford not to respond.
