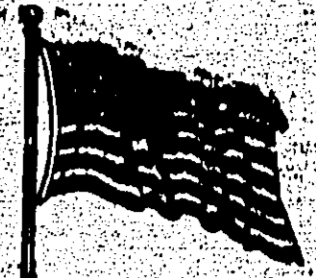

30 File For County Offices In Primary

Forty-four candidates for district and county offices filed for places on the Democratic primary ballot by the deadline Monday, according to Morris C. Clemmons, Jr., county Democratic chairman. Thirty of those who filed are seeking the Democratic nomination for county and precinct offices in Tyler County.

The other 14 filed for district offices in which Tyler County is a part. Statewide candidates are not required to file in each county. The most heavily contested races will be for sheriff and tax assessor-collector. If the number of persons seeking the nomination in any indication, there are four candidates for each
