



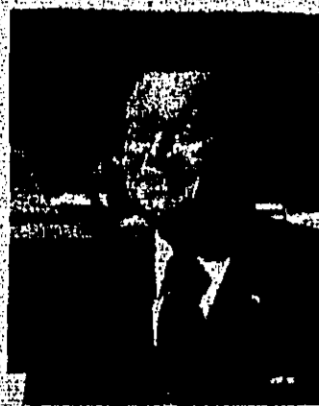

## DOLPH BRISCOE BRINGS CAMPAIGN HERE FRIDAY



Dolph Briscoe, (lyable rancher) and one of the leading candidates for the Democratic nomination for Governor of Texas, will bring his campaign to Woodville Friday. He will be in the courthouse square to meet voters beginning at 2:00 p.m., and the "to word from his campaign headquarters."

He has promised to set up a mobile field office to travel the state to keep abreast with the needs of the people.

While here Friday he would like to meet as many Tyler County voters as possible while he is conducting a grant of his campaign for Governor.

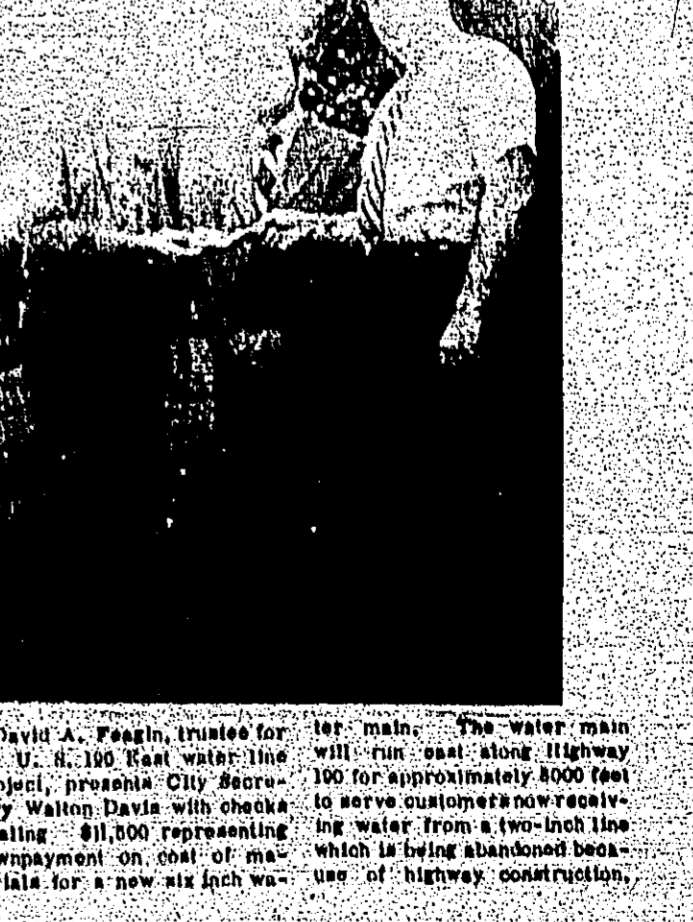

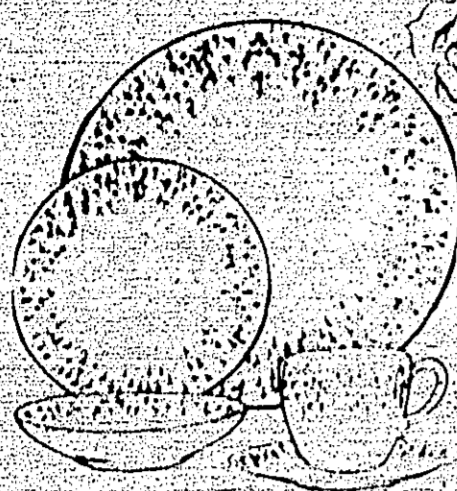

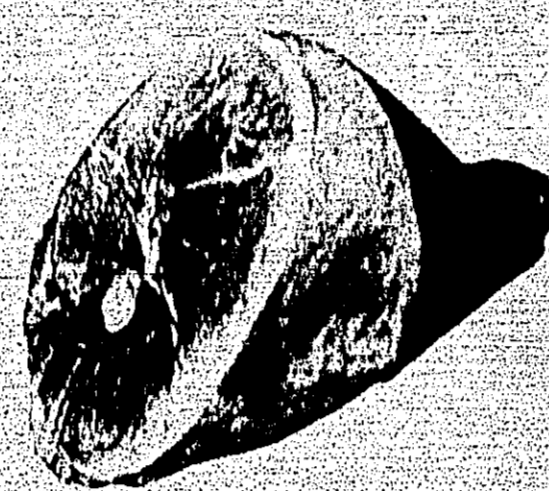
