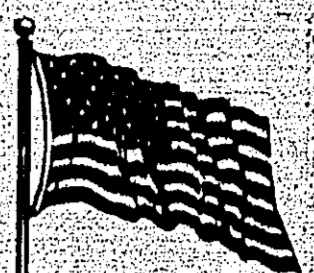

W. A. Coile will be on the ballot for Republican county chairman and James K. Grimes for precinct chairman, precinct two.

Republicans also have two referendums on their ballot. One asks voters to express their opinion for or against Daylight Saving Time and the other for or against a constitutional amendment which would prohibit forced busing of school children or forced consolidation of school districts to achieve racial balance.

Reptile Garden Opens Sat.

Formal opening of the Big Thicket Reptile Gardens at the Alabama and Coushatta Indian Reservation has been set for Saturday, April 22.

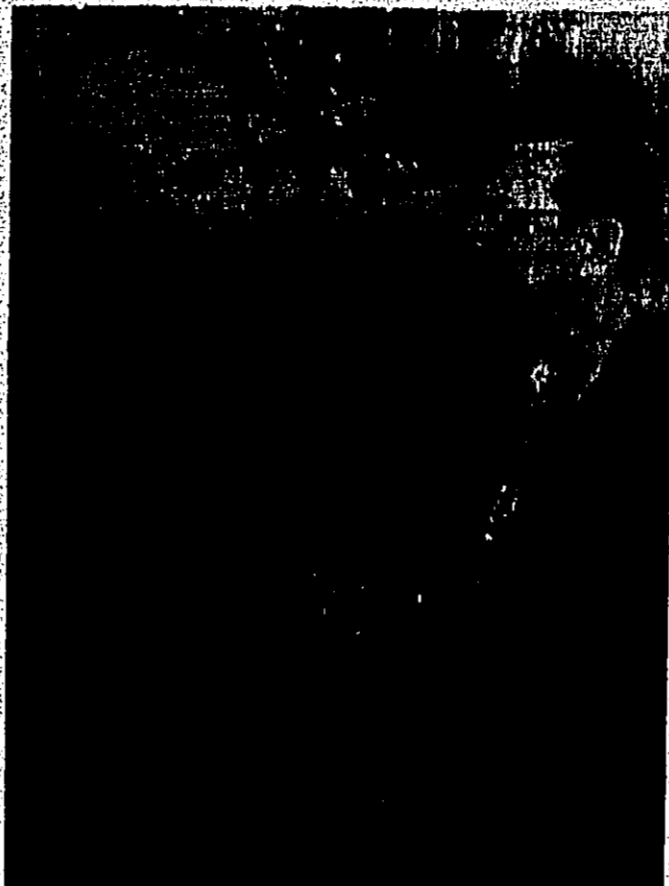
The reptile garden is the newest tourist attraction at the reservation. Other top attractions at the reservation include a Living Indian Village, tribal dances, Big Thicket Tours, Indian Chief Train Ride, Indian Country Tour, the "Inn of the 12 Clans" Restaurant, a museum and arts and crafts display.

Featuring a large number of reptiles which are native to East Texas, and some which are not, the reptile garden is expected to rapidly become one of the top attractions in East Texas. The Big Thicket Reptile Garden features alligators ranging in size to almost 18 feet, 22 species of snakes including a large variety of rattlesnakes, five species of turtles from the small musk turtle to the alligator-snapping turtle which weighs just under 100 pounds, and a rare American crocodile.

Tours of this attraction will be conducted daily and will last approximately 25 minutes. Indian guides will present an educational and amusing narration of the tour, relating the reptiles to Indian legend.

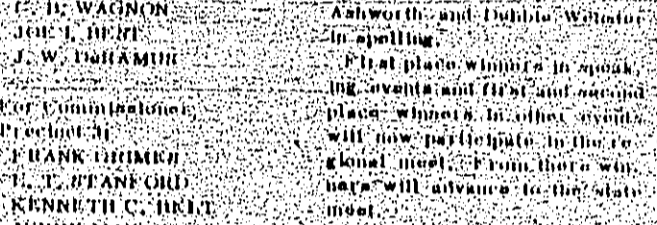

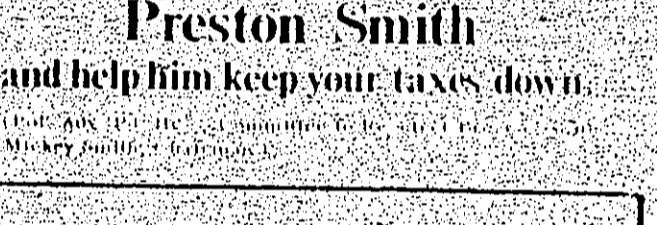

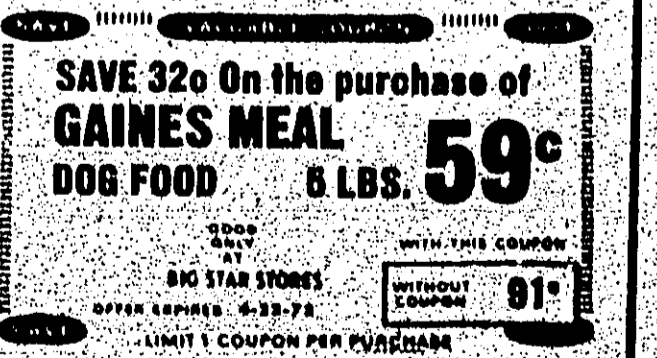
