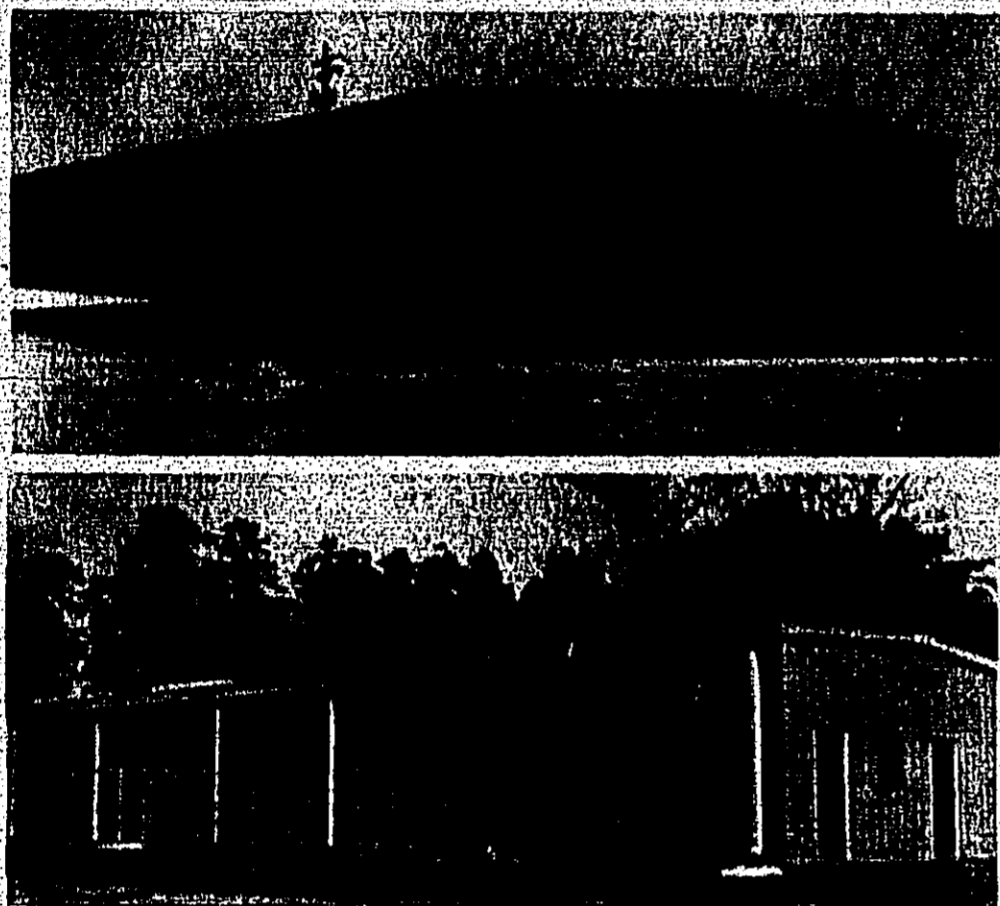

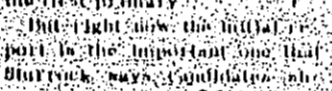

The first case of screwworms in Polk County in 10 years was confirmed in the novel of a calf near Goodrich, Texas on April 18. Immediate steps were taken by U. S. Department of Agriculture and Southwest Animal Health Commission personnel to bring the infestation under control. "Four fly drops will be made at one week intervals in the infestation area," said Dr. Dave Anderson, USDA veterinarian at Mission. "If other cases are confirmed in the area, four drops of sprays, namely 2 million sterile flies each will be made after the last confirmed case," Anderson urged livestock and pet owners to check their animals closely and send samples of any maggots from wounds to the Mission Laboratory. County agents will assist with the mailing of samples. It is not known how the screwworm infestation got to Polk County, but officials said that the flies have been known to travel 135 miles, and that 30 to 35 miles is common. "Texas has confirmed more cases of screwworms to date this year than during the entire year of 1971," Mission officials believe that the possibility of further infestations is great. Therefore, all precautions should be practiced.

Yesterday, today and Friday are important local elections who have opposition in the May 6 primary elections. They must file a detailed sworn statement of all contributions as well as expenses incurred so far in their campaigns. State law requires that the initial report be made between seven and ten days prior to the first primary election. That makes Friday the last day on which they may be filed. Secretary of State Bob Bullock, the state's chief election officer, has issued three fives about campaign spending and financial reporting which tighten the former loosely followed statute. Each contributor's name, address and city must be listed along with the amount of the donation. "Failure to file a sworn financial statement," Bullock said, "is a criminal offense."

Each county clerk in the state, including Tyler County, Allen Bullock, have been directed to make sure they are what the state law requires. Following the May 6 primary, candidates will have ten days in which to make a report of expenses through the first primary. "But right now the initial report is the important one that Bullock says candidates should keep in mind. Bullock says the report filed by each candidate must include the following information: "Amount and date of all loans, money or other things of value contributed to the candidate or to his organizational managers, at any time, including in this must be the full initials and last name of the full name of each contributor, as well as the candidate's address. A county of city that is not sufficient. "The amount, date and purposes of all expenditures whether by the candidate or by campaign workers on his behalf. The full name and address, provision applies here as well, but expenditures of less than \$10 need not be reported. "Contributions and expenditures of other kind raising questions, such as dinner sponsored by the candidate or his family. "The burden of compiling and filing the reports lies with each candidate, but anyone who contributes \$10 or more to a candidate is responsible for making sure the contribution is reported. "Late filing of the reports could cost a candidate a fine of between \$100 and \$500, or imprisonment ranging from one to five years, or both. "And any candidate who files a false statement can forfeit his right to appear on the ballot of general election ballots. "If a candidate fails to report all or part of a contribution, he shall be liable for double the amount or value of the unreported donation to each opposing candidate. "In the past, candidates could list vague names and addresses, but no more," Secretary of State Bullock has made it clear that the identities will be enforced, Bullock said.

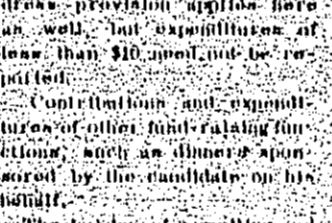

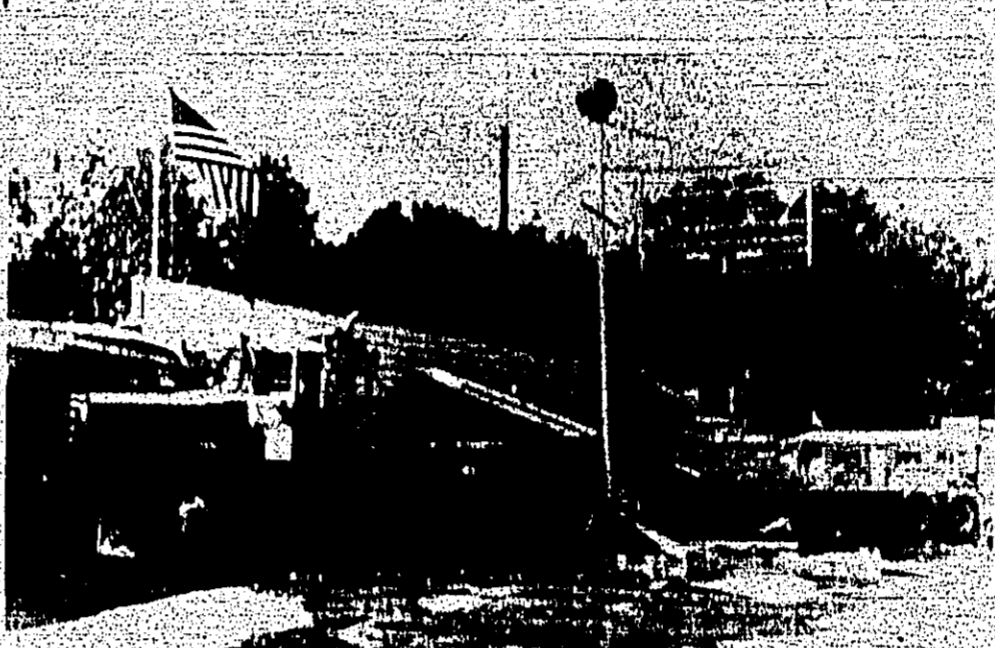
