

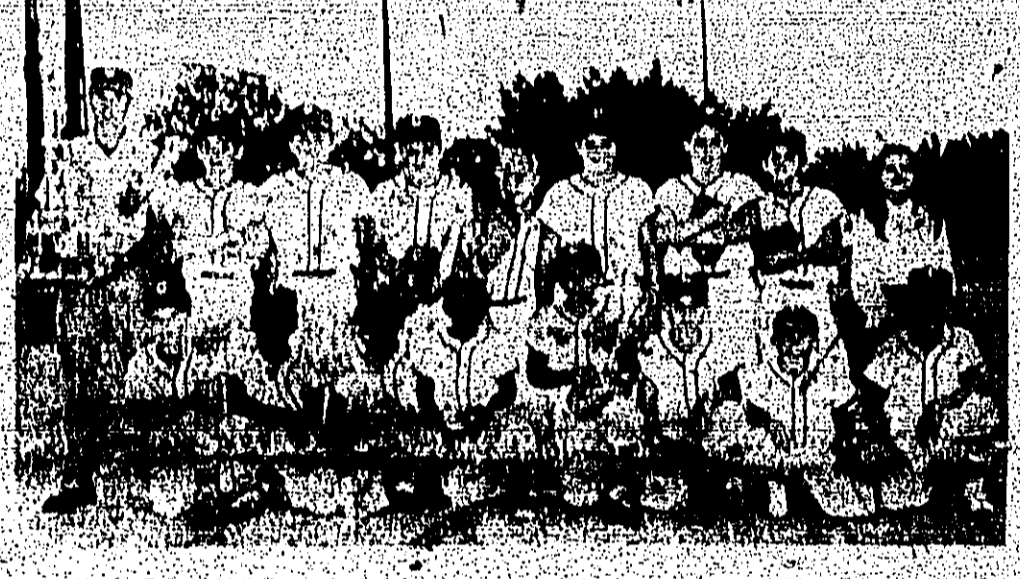

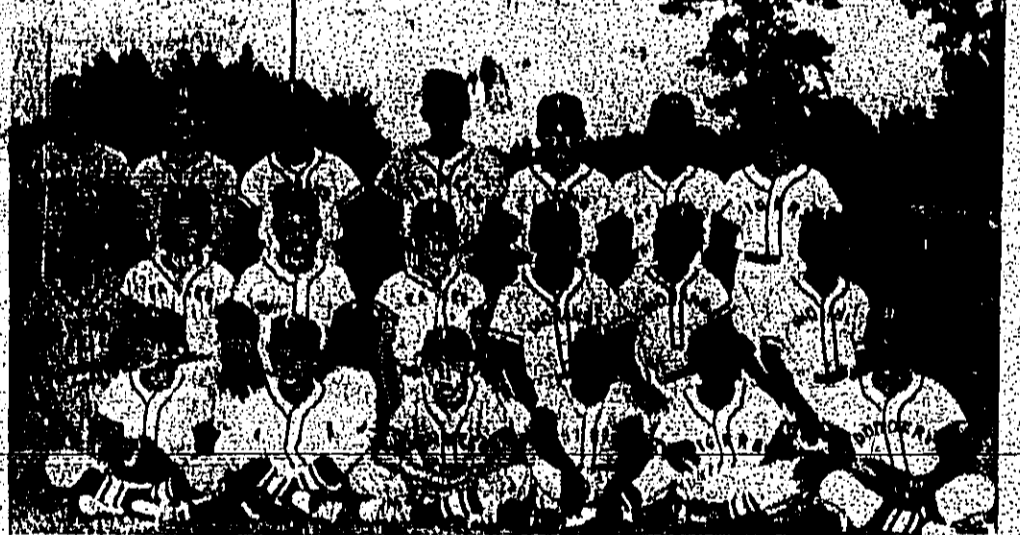
Little Queen, Champs, All-Stars

School Bonds Lose

A total of 836 voters turned out for the \$600,000 school bond election Saturday. Although the issue was defeated, it was favored 440 to 394 by all voters. One ballot was nullified and not counted.

Property owners turned the proposal down by 16 votes, 378 against and 362 for, it carried in the non-property owners box 70 to 16.

School officials said that the vote of property owners on the issue was decisive.

The reason for two losses, one for property owners and the other for non-property owners, is because of two federal court rulings in other states in which all voters, whether owners of property or not, were judged eligible to vote. However, the question of whether all voters can be tabulated to determine the outcome in a situation where non-property owners vote in determining the outcome of an election has so far not been ruled upon by the federal courts.

Texas law has required voters in tax bond elections to be owners of property.

Shooting, Knifing Charges Filed

In all, the jail door swung shut behind 16 persons since last Monday. A total of 20 persons have been booked so far in July.

The board members of the board also have resigned. They are George Mitchell, Earl Glenn, Sheffield and Robert Strimling.

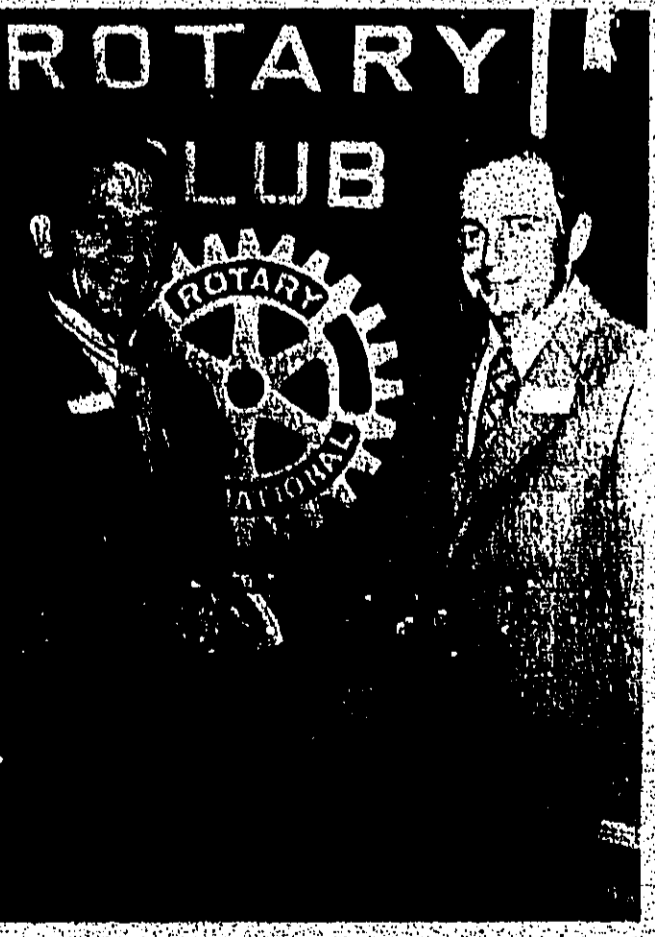

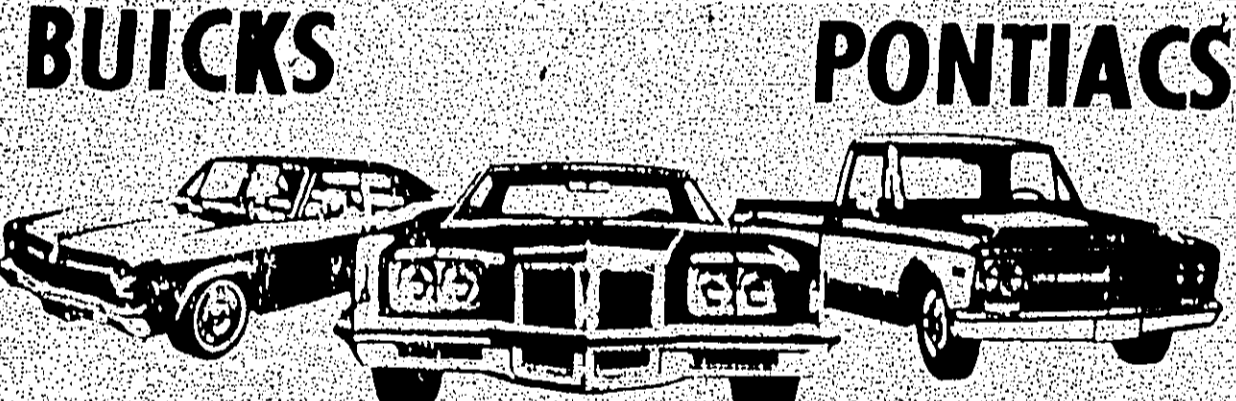

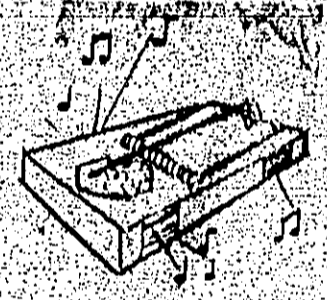
