## Eight Killed In Traffic Accidents First 6 Months of '73

The four persons killed in rural highway accidents in Tyler County in June of 1973, the county's highway fatalities up to eight for the first six months of 1973, which ended June 30. Three of the victims were killed in one accident north of Coltonville and the other fatally occurred south of Bourgeois on FM 93. Sergeant C. L. Taylor, in his monthly summary of accidents investigated by the Highway Patrol, reported that 10 other accidents were investigated in June in which eight persons were injured. The June figures showed a total of 96 rural auto accidents in the county during the first six months of the year in which 33 persons were injured in addition to the eight fatalities. During the same period in 1972 there were 875 rural traffic accidents in which five persons were killed and 40 injured. In the 16 counties comprising the Deason District of the Texas Highway Patrol there were 449 rural accidents during the June in which 22 persons were killed and 241 injured. The Highway Patrol stands a rural accident as one which occurred outside the limits of incorporated towns.

## Women To Participate In Texas Prison Rodeo

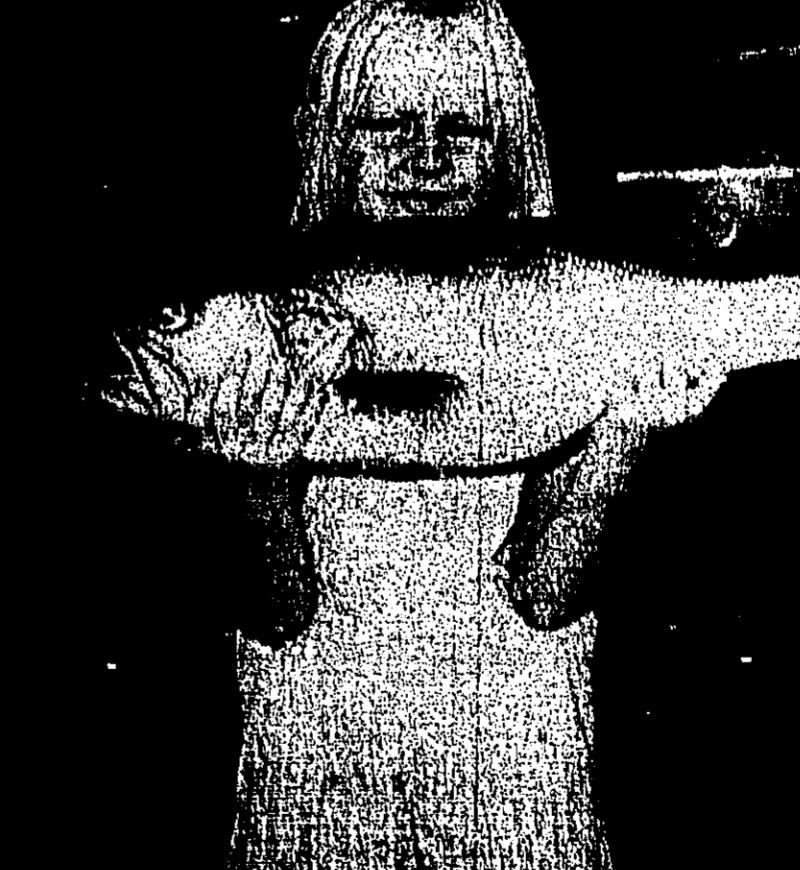
HUNTSVILLE For the first time in the 41-year history of the Texas Prison Rodeo, the competition events will include contests for convict women at the Texas Prison Rodeo, Texas Department of Corrections, said Jim Dalton, rodeo supervisor. In fact, everything during the fast-moving two-hour show held here in the prison stadium each Sunday in October will feature TDC convicts, with few exceptions. The exceptions will be the Sheriff's posse of Houston, a riding group, and the usual girl's barrel race. These events will be highlighted each Sunday along with thrilling convict rodeo contests plus the best inmate entertainment groups of the state's sprawling prison system. The convict rodeo contests will include the Mad Scramble, saddle and baraback bronc riding, wild horse race, wild cow milking, and the unusual and exciting Hard Money event. The Hard Money event pits 25 convicts against a charging Brahman bull with a sack worth \$50 in prize money tied between its horns. Bull riding and the traditional convict race are also a part of the rodeo, which begins at 8 p.m. each Sunday in October.

**Social Security Disability Program Pays 3 Million People in 15th Year**

Fifteen years ago this month, the first social security disability payments were made to 36,500 disabled workers. Today nearly 3 million disabled workers and members of their families receive monthly cash payments according to the social security disability law.

When social security disability benefits were first paid, the program was a pilot project to determine the feasibility of paying cash to disabled workers and their families. Today the program is a permanent part of the social security system and has become one of the largest cash payment programs in the United States.

By 1972, the total number of disabled workers and their families receiving disability payments had increased to over 3 million. This increase is due to the fact that the number of disabled workers is growing steadily each year.



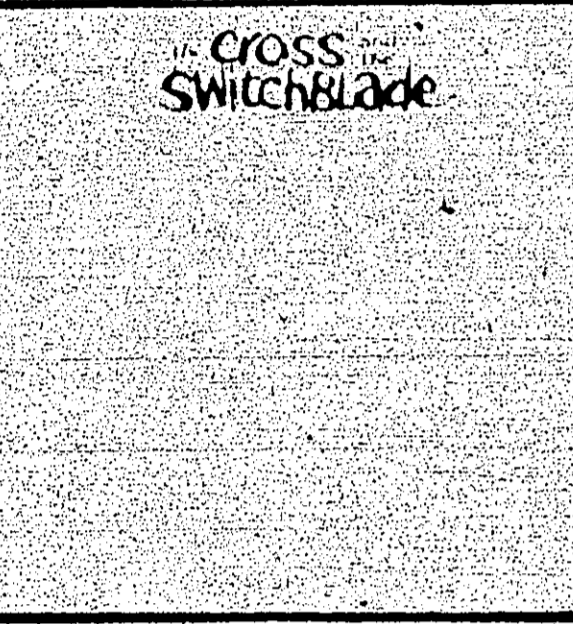
