



**Voters To Decide Fate Of 14 Amendments**

The Texas Constitution, which has been amended 201 times during its existence, may be amended up to 14 times after November 7, if Texas voters approve.

The 14 proposed amendments on the November 7 ballot probably will not all be approved since Texas voters have a habit of turning down a good many proposed amendments. Each with 14 this year, many voters may be confused about the merits of amending the constitution so many times and vote against most of them.

However, that may be, here is a quick rundown of the 14 proposed changes in the constitution:

Number 1: Amending Article III, Section 24, of the constitution to provide for the removal of judges for members of the judicial branch.

Number 2: Amending Article IX, Section 1, to establish the Lamar-Sammy Hospital District.

Number 3: Would require the commission on judicial counties in the state to recommend all justices of the peace to a salary panel beginning January 1, 1974.

Number 4: Granting authority to the legislature to establish a constitutional revision commission which would report to the November 7, 1974, and after that time, the members of the constitutional revision commission convened in January 1974 as a constitutional convention to serve 90 days for the purpose of drafting a new constitution.

Number 5: Amending Article I, Section 19, of the constitution to provide for the removal of judges for members of the judicial branch.

Number 6: Amending Article I, Section 24, of the constitution to provide for the removal of judges for members of the judicial branch.

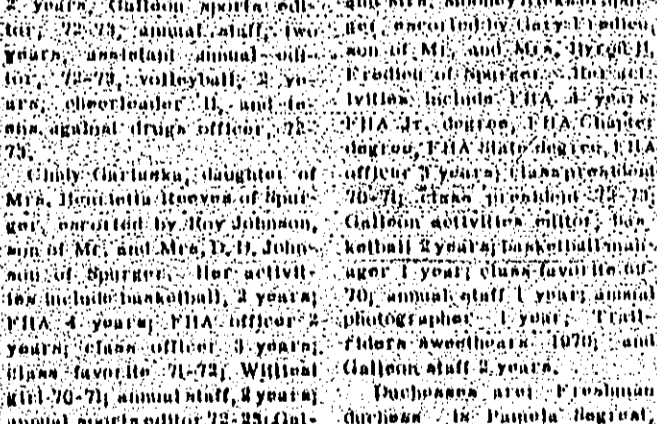
**School Set For Election Judges**

**HOW TO SEW KNITS**

**KNITWEAR**  
 Knitwear is made from a variety of fibers. Some are made from 100 percent wool, some from a blend of wool and synthetic fibers. The most common fibers used in knitwear are wool, acrylic, cotton, and rayon.

**CARE**  
 Knitwear should be washed in cold water. Use a mild detergent. Do not use bleach. Knitwear should be dried flat. Do not hang it. Knitwear should be stored folded in a cool, dry place.

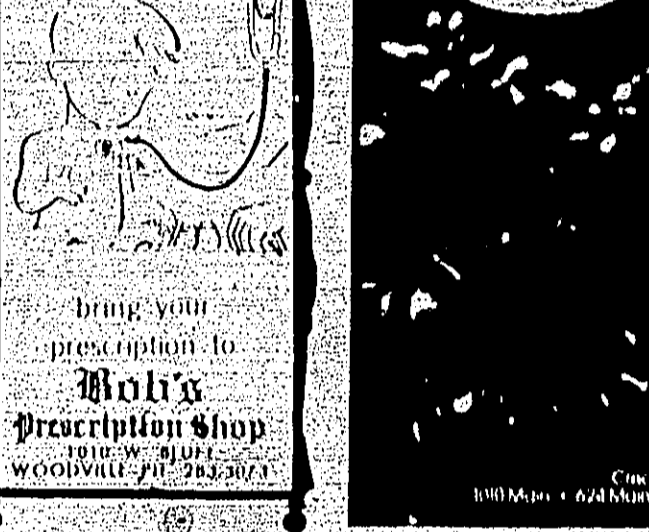

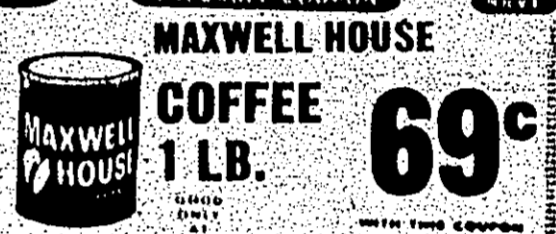
