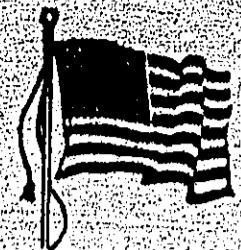

Duck Season Starts Slow

Hunters are not finding duck and goose hunting too easy except in areas along the coast during the first part of the split-hunting season which began Saturday.

Ducks and geese may be hunted until November 28 during the first part of the season. The second hunting dates are December 9 to January 24. The first part of the split season on geese and inland ducks November 28 and December 9 are the same dates as for ducks, December 9 to January 24.

Hunters will check for a permit system on which hunters should become familiar before taking up the hunt.

Hunting is going slow but better than last year. The million dollar silver for ducks and geese is being sold from December 9 to January 24 through this area.

Childrens Program Unit Classes Begin

A new regional program unit for children in Tyler County was opened Monday in the United Methodist Church under the sponsorship of the Lufkin State School and the Beaumont State Center for Human Development.

The program is for children who are not able to receive services from the public schools at this time.

Twenty-five children were enrolled. Loyd Knapfick, director of Regional programs at the Beaumont State Center,

coordinator for the new unit, said that 20 children were tested by the Beaumont State Center Diagnostic and Evaluation team October 30 and 31.

Two Farm to Market Projects Approved

The Texas Highway Commission has approved the local applicant for two miles of Farm to Market Roads in Tyler County as part of the 1972 Texas Farm to Market program.

District Highway Engineer F. C. Young said the estimated cost of the work is \$1,200,000.

One of the county projects is the construction of F.M. 1042 from Hwy. 69 at Bonaville, Okla. to Hwy. 69 at Bonaville, Okla. and surfacing of this 3.2 mile long 22 mile south-west of F.M. 256. It is estimated to cost \$600,000.

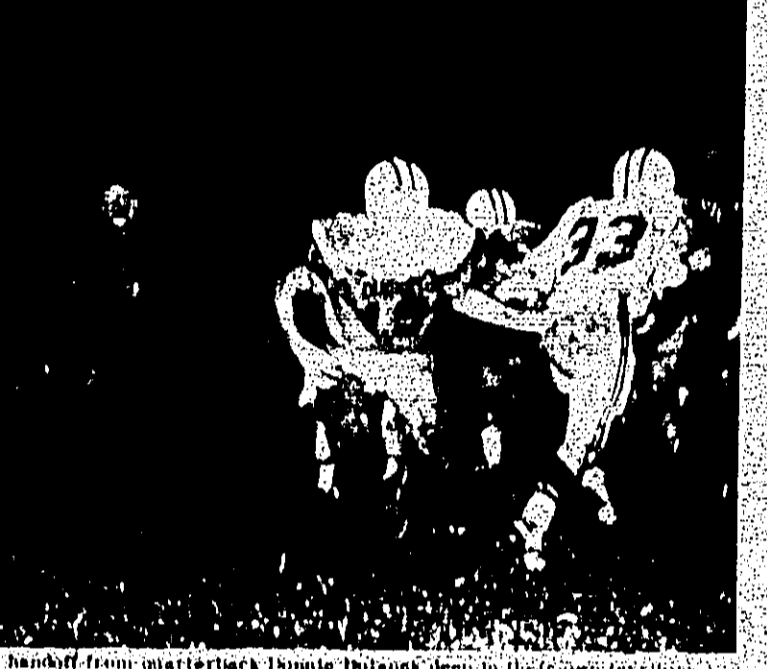

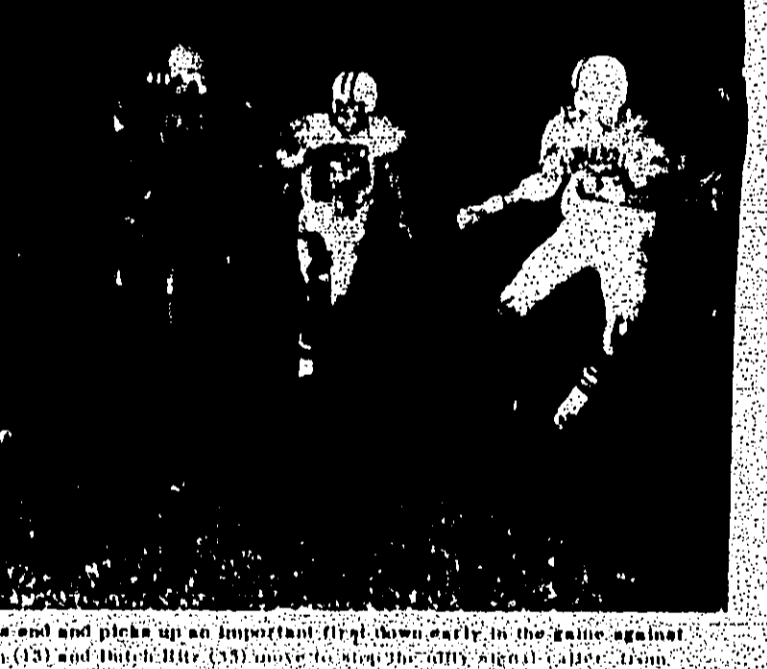
