DEER SEASON OPENS HERE SATURDAY

Deer hunting season will open in the northwestern Texas Territory with a limit of two bucks per hunter for most counties. Bucks are allowed in Harrison, Houston, Garza, Jasper, Newton, Polk, Robertson, Trinity and Tyler counties.

Hundreds of hunters are expected to take to the woods Saturday and in most sections deer are said to be fairly plentiful.

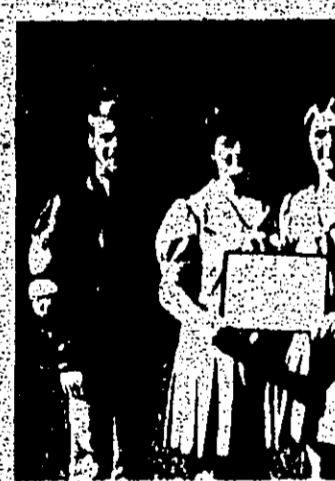
Deer tags in addition to other hunting licenses are required and a fee must be paid.

Liquor, Beer Seized In Raid By Police, LCB Agents

A large quantity of alcoholic beverages was confiscated Sunday by local police and Texas liquor board agents following a raid on the premises of a suspected bootlegger.

Police Chief John Crammer said that assistance of the liquor board agents was requested after officers of himself and Night Chief Kenneth Thymen to find enough alcoholic beverages on the premises to make a case had proven futile several times.

Two undercover liquor control board agents were sent here and one of them succeeded in making a purchase of wine. The bootlegger had a quantity on hand probably for weekend business.

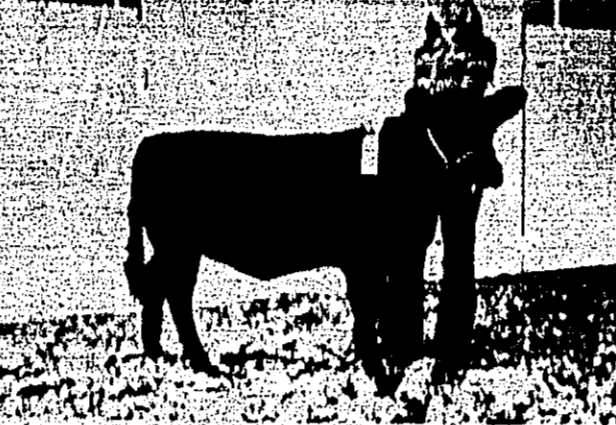

Raising the First American Flag On An American Man-Of-War, the "Alfred", Philadelphia, 1775
 The Cambridge, or Grand Union Flag was the first flag or ensign to represent the united colonies in rebellion. It was raised by John Paul Jones from the deck of the "Alfred", Dec. 3, 1775. A month later George Washington displayed this same design over his headquarters in Cambridge, Mass. It had seven red and six white stripes. In the canton were the crosses of Saint Andrew and Saint George, representing the union of Scotland and England.

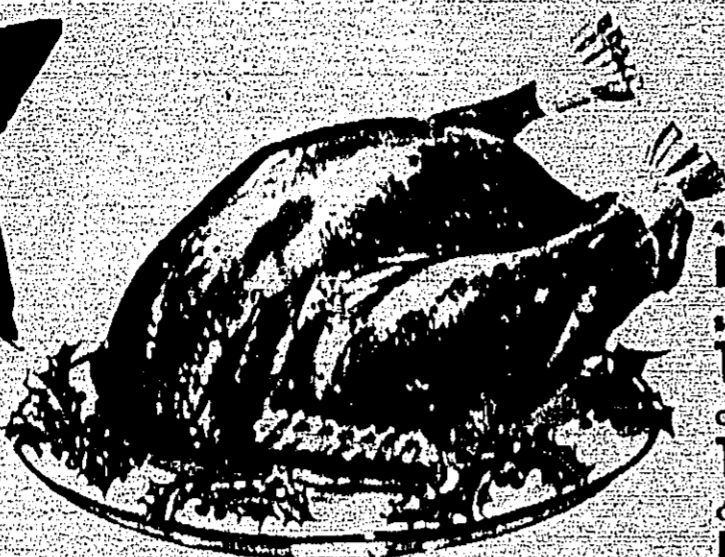
