## Rain, Cold Slow Deer Season Opening Weekend



His First One

Birdwell, was hunting with his father. He said he will have the head mounted as a trophy of his first deer.

Over two inches of rain and forty degree temperatures Saturday put a slight damper on the opening day of the deer season in the Southeast Texas counties under the regulatory authority of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission.

However, all parts of the counties hunters were having good luck regardless of the weather and the conditions for hunting. In fact, about 100 deer were reported to have been killed during the season opened with good weather conditions the number of bucks in season was of the first weekend.

In Tyler county, a large number of hunters were out early Saturday but with the heavy rain some started home and the number of bucks brought in for points was about a third less than in the 1973 season opened.

The first buck brought in was by Robert Bates, a student at Sam Houston State University, who was hunting with his father, J.C. Bates, on their place in the Dies community. It was a seven pointer and the photograph made the picture with Robert posing in a heavy snow. It was a nice young buck.

R.G. Dammann of Nederland brought in the next one which had a large set of antlers. He counted 21 points including those in which a ring could be placed. He killed it Saturday morning in the Clear Creek pasture just west of Chester. He had by far the most points of any brought in.

Tom Graham and his hunting party came in with a good 11-point buck late Saturday which Tom killed on the A.D. Graham place in Mount Carmel community. It had well-shaped antlers and was a nice specimen.

David Birdwell killed a 9-point buck on the Kavel place in the Dies community. It was a large young buck which he brought down with one shot from a 30-30 rifle. David is the 14 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Nobby Birdwell. He was hunting with his father.

Two men hunting on open land of Kirby Lambeth Company east of Warren brought in a buck each Sunday. One was a large 10 pointer killed by Jiggs Evans while Jimmy Evans had a smaller 9 pointer. The large one brought in by Jiggs was so large he had to weigh and it tipped the scales at 142 pounds. Jimmy's 9 pointer weighed 96 pounds.

David Waldrop killed an 8 pointer buck Saturday in the Wolf Creek area west of Woodville near Sam. He brought in the heavy antlers for a picture.

Hunters are welcome to bring any legal buck by the newspaper office at 104 South Charleston for a picture and as many as possible will be printed in the paper.

The deer tags should still be on the antlers when brought in for the picture.

While the heavy rains Saturday did not come again Sunday the weather remained cold and overcast here. Monday morning the temperature again was down to the low forties and the clouds hung on. The National Weather prediction Monday did not promise any improvement for the next few days. Snow was forecast for west Texas with possibility of rain and cold over the rest of the state through Wednesday.

### Daniel To Push Legislative Reform

State Representative Price Daniel, Jr., announced candidate for Speaker of the Texas House of Representatives, revealed a comprehensive and detailed reform program of an Austin press conference last week.

Daniel's program includes the passage of the new Administrative Code Act, the new Texas Legislative Code, and the new Texas State Code of Ethics.

Two other statutes introduced by Daniel would reduce the powers of the Speaker, who presides over legislative sessions and controls the agenda.

Daniel said these two statutes, providing one term for the Speaker, and the House, and a prohibition against House members making their own staffs, favor a speaker candidate.

He would also, by cutting about \$50 million in state government by cutting "pick and choose" items.

Daniel said that the plan bill, limiting the power of conference committees, would save the taxpayers millions of dollars each year.

For example, he would limit the number of members of the House and the members of the Senate from asking millions of dollars in the budget without the approval of the full House and Senate.

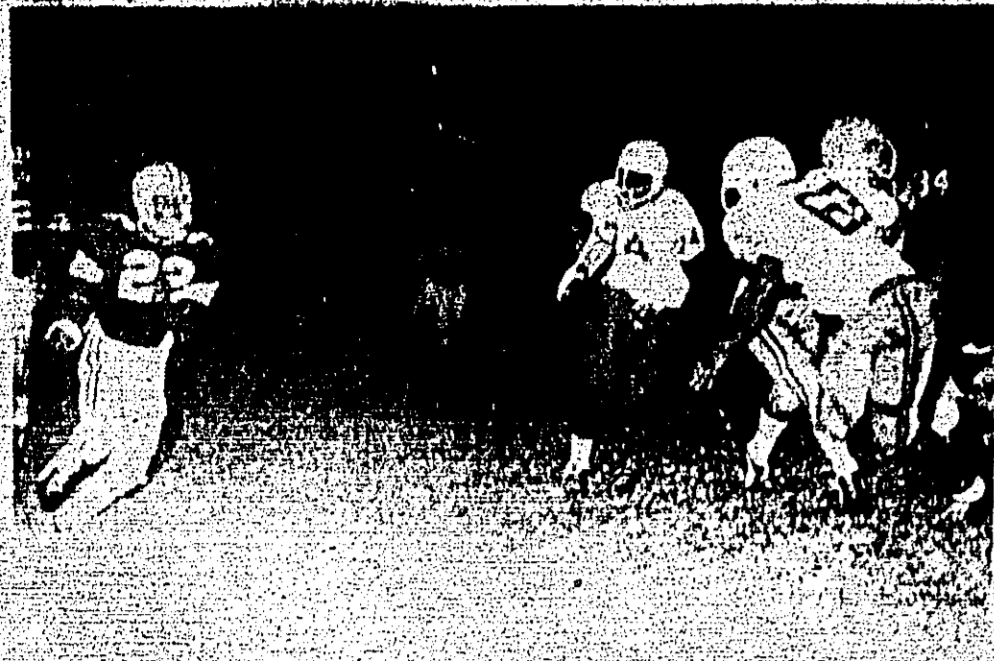

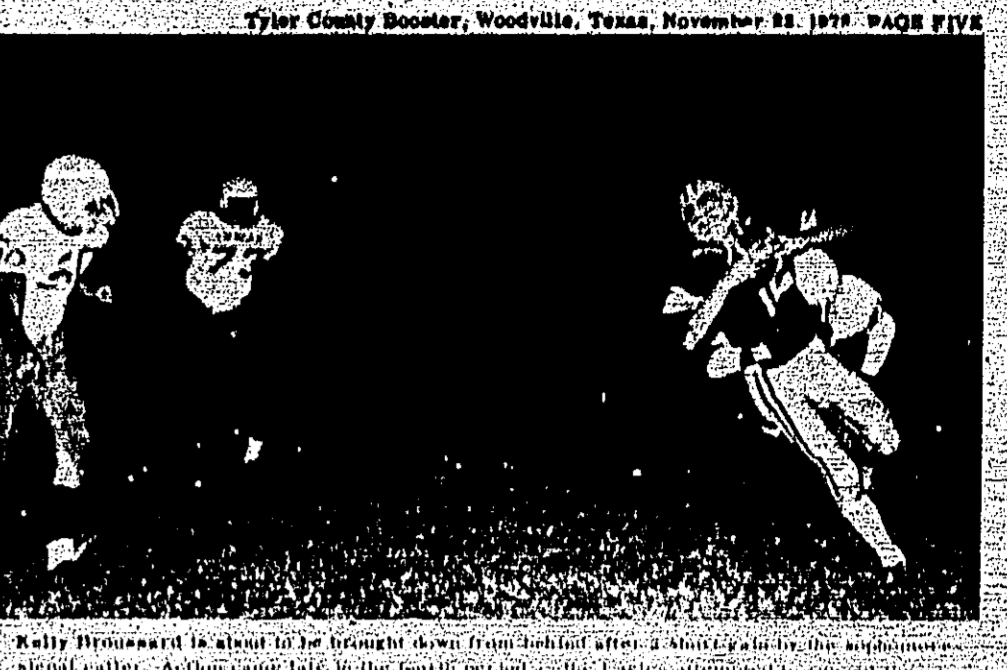

Dear Mr. Martin:  
I want to start an investment program and am curious about the different kinds of mutual funds. Can you help me out?
