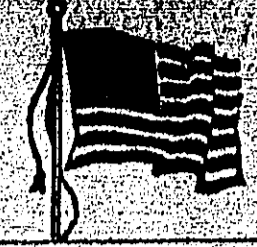

Patrol Investigates 17 Accidents In November

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 17 rural highway accidents in Tyler County during November, according to the monthly summary by Sgt. C.J. Taylor. There were no fatalities throughout the month. Through November of this year, Sgt. Taylor reports, there have been 178 rural accidents in Tyler County, 151 fatal, 15 non-fatal, 100 killed and 97 injured. This compares with 170 accidents during the same period in 1977, in which 148 persons were killed and 92 injured.

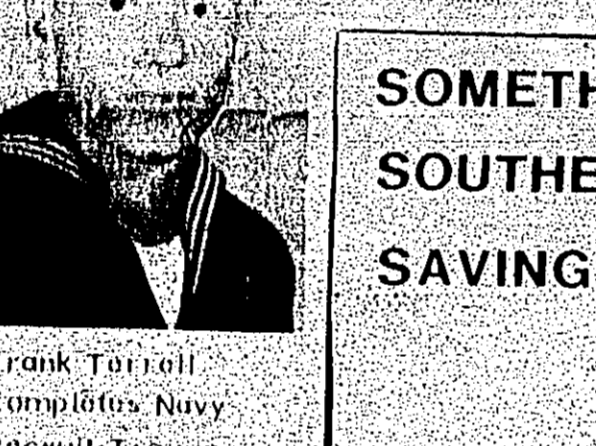

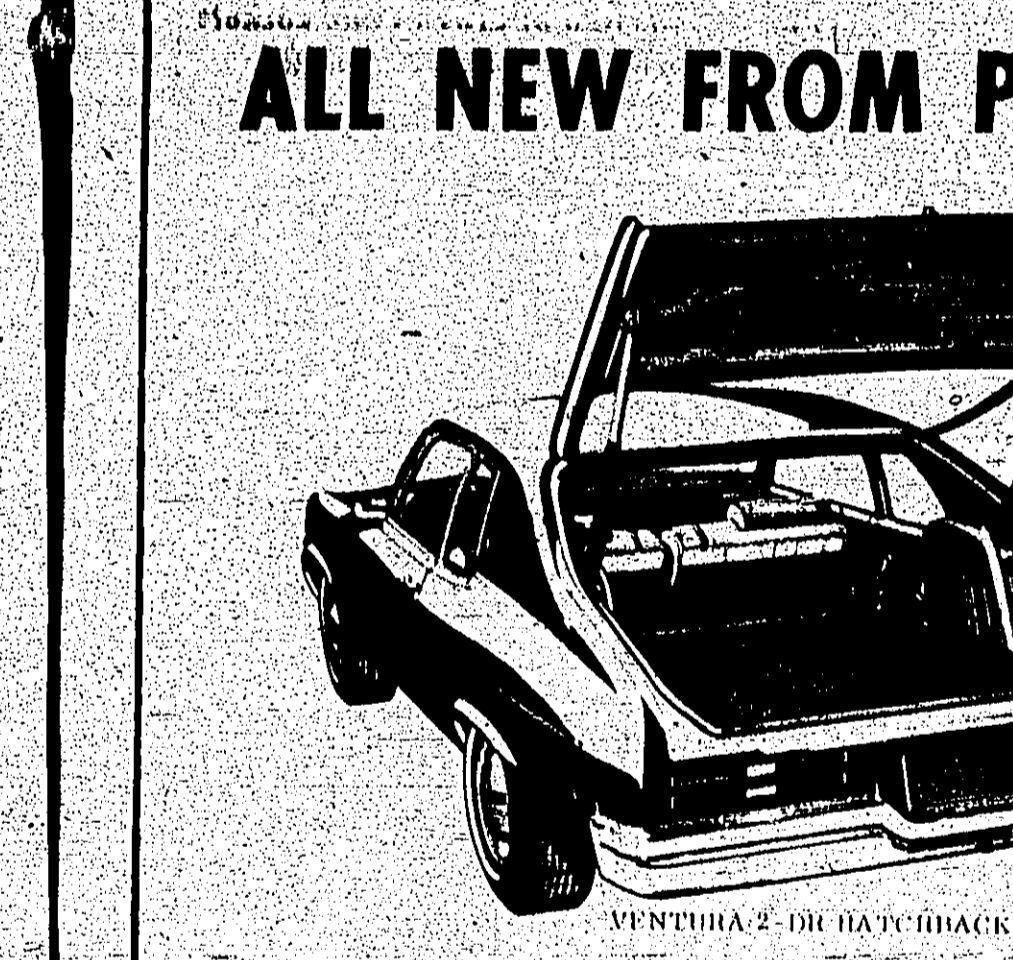

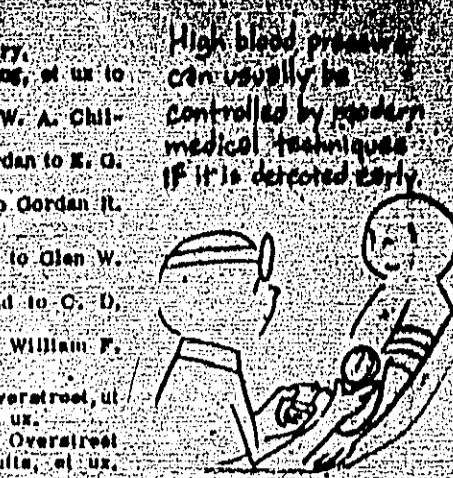

A Living Symbol of Liberty, our beautiful Capitol of the United States is magnificent. In 1791, a site known as Jenkins Hill was chosen for the Capitol Building. Two years later, while serving as President, George Washington laid the cornerstone.

The first section was ready in 1800, and for the next sixty years the Senate used an oval shaped room near the center as the main assembly room. It was in this room that Samuel P. B. Morse tapped off the first telegraph message on a line direct from the Senate Chamber to Baltimore in 1844. The Capitol was completed in 1863.

In this great building have echoed the voices of such men as Henry Clay and John C. Calhoun, and the stirring words of Daniel Webster: "Liberty and Union, now and forever, one and inseparable."
