### C of C Challenged To Develop Tourist Industry

A challenge to develop the great tourism potential of the area was given members of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce at its membership banquet Saturday night at Woodville Inn.

Jim Battersby, executive vice president of the chamber, told members and guests of the great growth in the numbers of visitors to Texas and the added dollar volume which it generates. He urged the chamber of commerce and individuals in this area to take steps to attract more visitors through promotion of the scenic beauty, the great lakes and man-made attractions.

He urged them to work in concert with surrounding attractions such as Lake Livingston in promoting tourism since all working together can help get tourists off the freeways. He had special commendations for Heritage Garden Village in Woodville and the Indian Reservation as examples of what can be done in building tourist attractions.

He said that surveys had shown that one cannot predict just what a tourist might want to visit. For that reason he said the trend is toward complexes of attractions and sites the Dallas-Fort Worth area which has the Zoo, the Lion Safari, a Marine attraction, football and baseball stadiums, etc.

Jim Gainey was master of ceremonies at the banquet. The retiring president, Webb Ashworth, told of a number of things the chamber had accomplished during the past year. The incoming president, Jim Clark, made his acceptance speech in which he asked for the cooperation and help of all the members during the coming year.

### Spurger ISD Adopts Homestead Exemption

The Spurger I.S.D. Board of Trustees in regular monthly session January 25, voted unanimously to grant \$3,000 exemption to all homestead owners 65 years old and older. Eligible persons must file notice with the tax assessor-collector office by April 30, 1973. Notice of this exemption is to be mailed during the next two weeks.

Other business in the meeting concerned the resignation of three teachers and the hiring of three new teachers for the second semester. New personnel are Mr. Barbara Myers, high school home economics; Mrs. Mabyn Day, high school English; and Mrs. Ellen Nash, special education. All three new teachers are December graduates of Lamar University and live in Silsbee.

A report on the recent Texas Education Agency Audit was costly to the district. Superintendent A.B. Crank just returned from Austin where he was informed the district will

have to reimburse the Agency approximately \$1,700 from funds paid to Spurger in 1970-71 school year. One teacher was hired in August 1970 but the school administration failed to request a Texas permit until December 1970. The Agency granted a permit dated November 1, 1970, however, the teacher's salary from August and September was disallowed and the district must pay back \$1,244. Another teacher hired in 1970 was paid on 13 years experience but records indicate he only had 12 years experience. The district must pay back \$480 for this error in longevity payment.

The board set April 7, 1973 for School-Board Election. Due to several members being appointed during the past year and the regular expiration of two terms, there will be six positions for election. Position 2, two year term; Position 3, 4, 5, one year terms; and Position 6 and 7, three year terms.

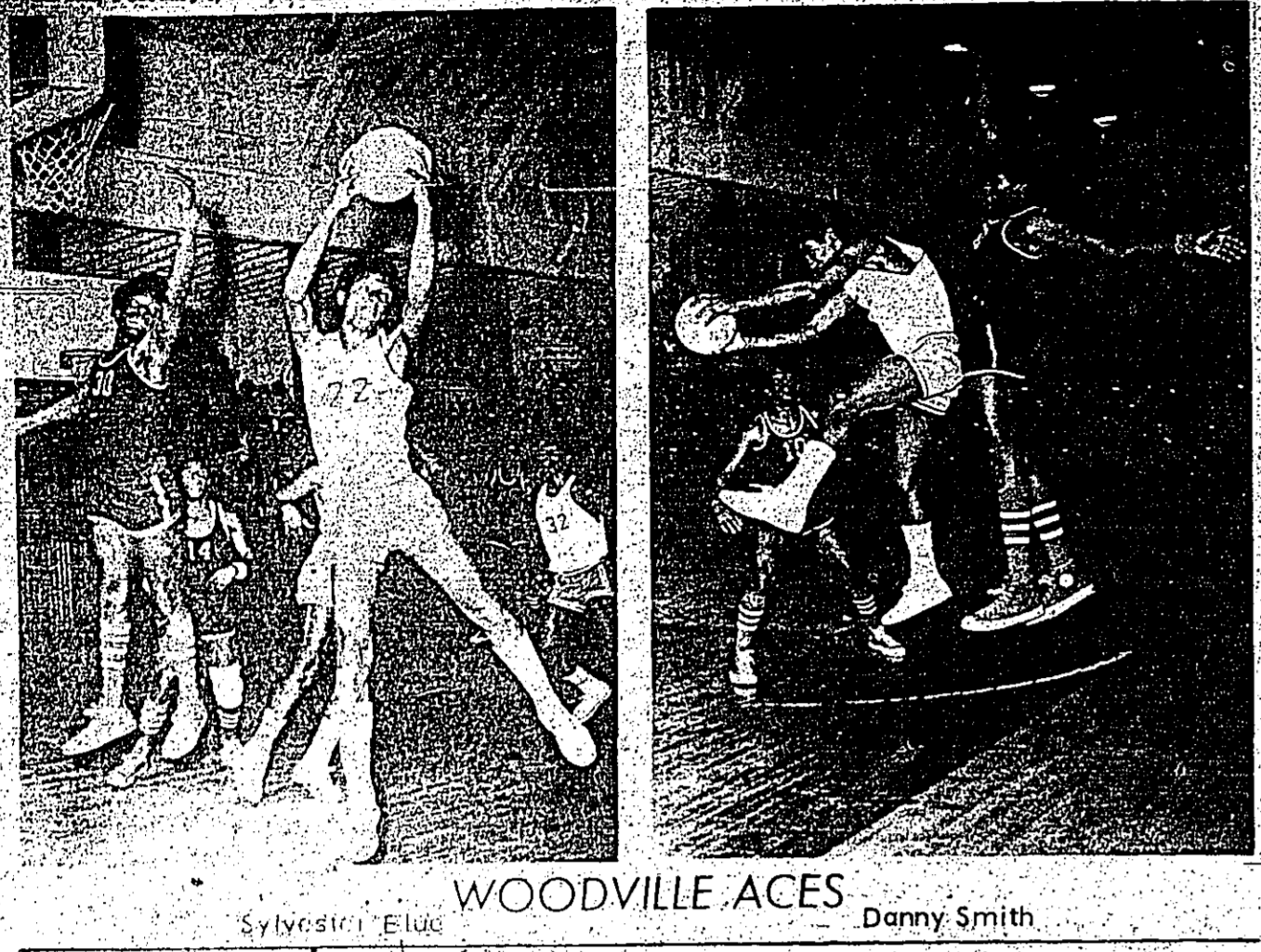
