WILSON DEDICATES NEW WARREN HIGH SCHOOL

U.S. Rep. Charles Wilson delivered a dedicatory address at the new Warren High School building before an overflow crowd in the cafeteria Sunday.

Wilson was introduced by Grover Die, high school principal, and prefaced his address with some comments about the difference he found in living in Washington and Texas. He also commented that he had some difference of opinion with President Nixon on priorities for the school lunch program and in aid to the elderly.

Others on the program at the dedication included the Warren High School variety band which played the Star Spangled Banner following the presentation of colors by the Rev. Delbert Lamb, minister of the Village Baptist Church, who gave the invocation; Harold Davis, president of the board of trustees, who welcomed patrons and guests; Jack B. Daniels, superintendent, who introduced members of the board of trustees; and the Rev. Lewis Ringer, minister of the First United Methodist Church in Warren, who presided.

Work Begins On Big Thicket Gardens For Major Tourist Attraction

An ambitious project in which plant life native to the Big Thicket, along with natural minerals and rocks, will be concentrated in a six-acre major tourist attraction has been started by Clyde Gray and Carl Nichols, Jr. in a natural setting just past Heritage Garden Village.

To be known as "Big Thicket Gardens" the area now has many of the plants native to the Big Thicket and others will be found and transplanted within the six acres which has a small creek winding through it. According to Nichols, plans are to make it into a living botanical display of thicket flora in which tourists may walk the trails to view in special areas, and in a short time the unusual plant life peculiar to the Big Thicket.

Plant families will be grouped and labeled with both their botanical and common names for the convenience of visitors. Big Thicket Gardens is expected to become a major tourist attraction due to the great interest in the Big Thicket itself. In these six acres the visitor may see the unique plants which cannot be seen by the average visitor from roads through the Big Thicket itself.

Big Thicket Gardens is designed both for education and preservation, Nichols said. Guide service will be provided and eventually a bicycle path will be available to carry visitors who are unable to walk the trails.

Nichols and Gray plan to have the area open by early spring and by the time for the fall school sessions have educational displays and plantings ready for field trips by school and college groups.

In addition to plant life, Nichols said that natural minerals, rocks, tree leaves, and pine cones have been collected. Also in future plans are displays of unusual animals of the Big Thicket and a display under simulated natural conditions of plants that are fluorescent.

Insect devouring plants will be grouped into a "fresh eating plant pit" and daffy cacti will be grouped in "Cactus Hill." Nichols also hoped to create what he calls a hummingbird valley lighted so that the colors of the hummingbirds of these tiny birds may be seen as they dart from floral plant to floral plant. About 40 species of hummingbirds might be attracted to the gardens and most of them are seldom seen.

Big Thicket Gardens is expected to become a botanical wonderland for visitors and in a period of two to three years

should develop into an unbelievable collection of rare plants. It will constantly be improved with new plantings of plants and flowers native to the Big Thicket.

Nichols said he hopes to be able to begin accepting plants unique to the Big Thicket by March 10. He said contributions will be gladly accepted and may be in cans or pots. He will be unable to use bare root plants as yet.

Heritage Garden Village attracted over 100,000 visitors in 1972 with its collection of authentic Texas buildings, arts

and crafts and industries. New attractions are added there from time to time, too, and soon Gray will have a full-time newspaper office which will be moved into a building now under construction.

The operation and maintenance of Heritage Garden Village requires 12 employees plus from two to three part-time helpers.

With the addition of Big Thicket Gardens adjacent to Gray and Nichols are confident that the area will attract thousands upon thousands more visitors in the coming years.

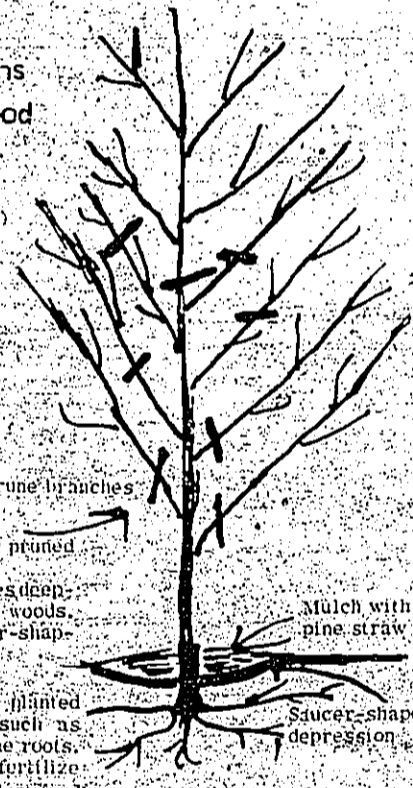
Bradford Ivy, rodeo producer, promises excitement with each and every rodeo event. Closing the day, in true Western style, a dance will be held at the Lions Den.

(1) Tree must be pruned back at least one third.

(2) Plant at least 2 inches deeper than it was in the woods.

(3) Plant in a saucer-shaped depression.

(4) Water trees thoroughly when planted.

(5) Use a mulch, such as pine straw, to cover the roots.

(6) After 2 weeks, fertilize with camellia or alba plant food.

Judge Dies was born in Hunt County and reared in Orange where he attended public schools. He graduated from Southern Methodist University Law School and attended Shipmen's School at Columbia University. He served aboard the USS Richard W. Sussessan in World War II.

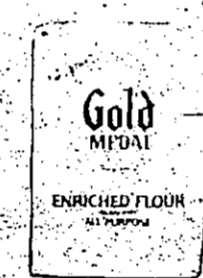
