Build East Texas Annual Meeting Set

The Student Center at Stephen F. Austin State University will be the site of the Build East Texas annual meeting, Thursday, March 8, according to S. P. Beck, Texarkana, chairman. Registration and coffee will be in the second floor reception lobby at 9:30 a. m. The annual meeting will highlight "BET Week", March 4-10. Texas Governor Dolph Briscoe proclaimed "BET Week" in recognition of the contributions agriculture makes to the economy of the state. Agricultural cash receipts for the 40 county BET area exceeded \$520 million dollars in 1972. Beck will open the meeting at 10:00 a. m. Alf Jernigan, executive vice-president of the East Texas Chamber of Commerce will introduce guests. Reports of each of the nine

BET Task Forces will include both accomplishments during the past year and goals for the future. Dr. E. M. (Ted) Trew, assistant director, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, is scheduled to discuss "Area Programs - Impact and Emphasis". New officers will be installed following a Dutch-treat luncheon. Tom Carothers, Palestine, current vice-chairman, will be the luncheon speaker. The afternoon session will include a presentation by personnel of the Texas Department of Agriculture, Ben Baldston, chief, Marketing Division, will discuss the TAP program and how it relates to East Texas agriculture. BET is one of six area economic growth programs in Texas, initiated in 1963. BET

currently has more than 250 members. Each of the 40 counties is represented on the general committee. A 21-member executive committee serves as the governing body. Articles of Confederation

ART. I. The Style of this confederacy shall be "The United States of America."
ART. II. Each state retains its sovereignty, freedom and independence, and every Power, Jurisdiction and right, which is not by this confederation expressly delegated to the United States, in Congress assembled.
ART. III. The said states hereby severally enter into a firm league of friendship with each other, for their common defence, the security of their Liberties, and their mutual and general welfare, binding themselves to assist each other, against all force offered to, or attacks made upon them, or any of them, on account of religion, sovereignty, trade, or any other pretence whatever.



A committee of the Continental Congress was appointed June 12, 1776, to prepare a Plan of Confederation. Congress approved the committee report on November 15, 1777. All states had ratified the Articles except Maryland which signed on February 27, 1781. The Articles went into effect on March 1, a few days later. The first three Articles set the direction and course of the new government. The Articles were a reflection of the fear that the founders had of a central government becoming too powerful, too far removed from the people.

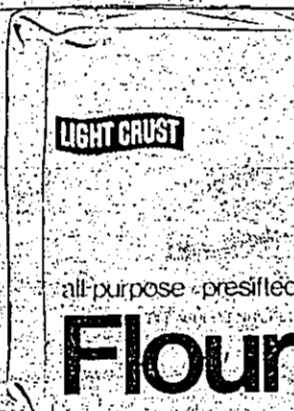
