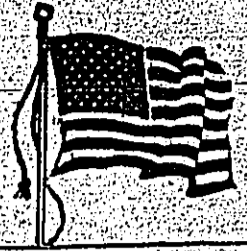

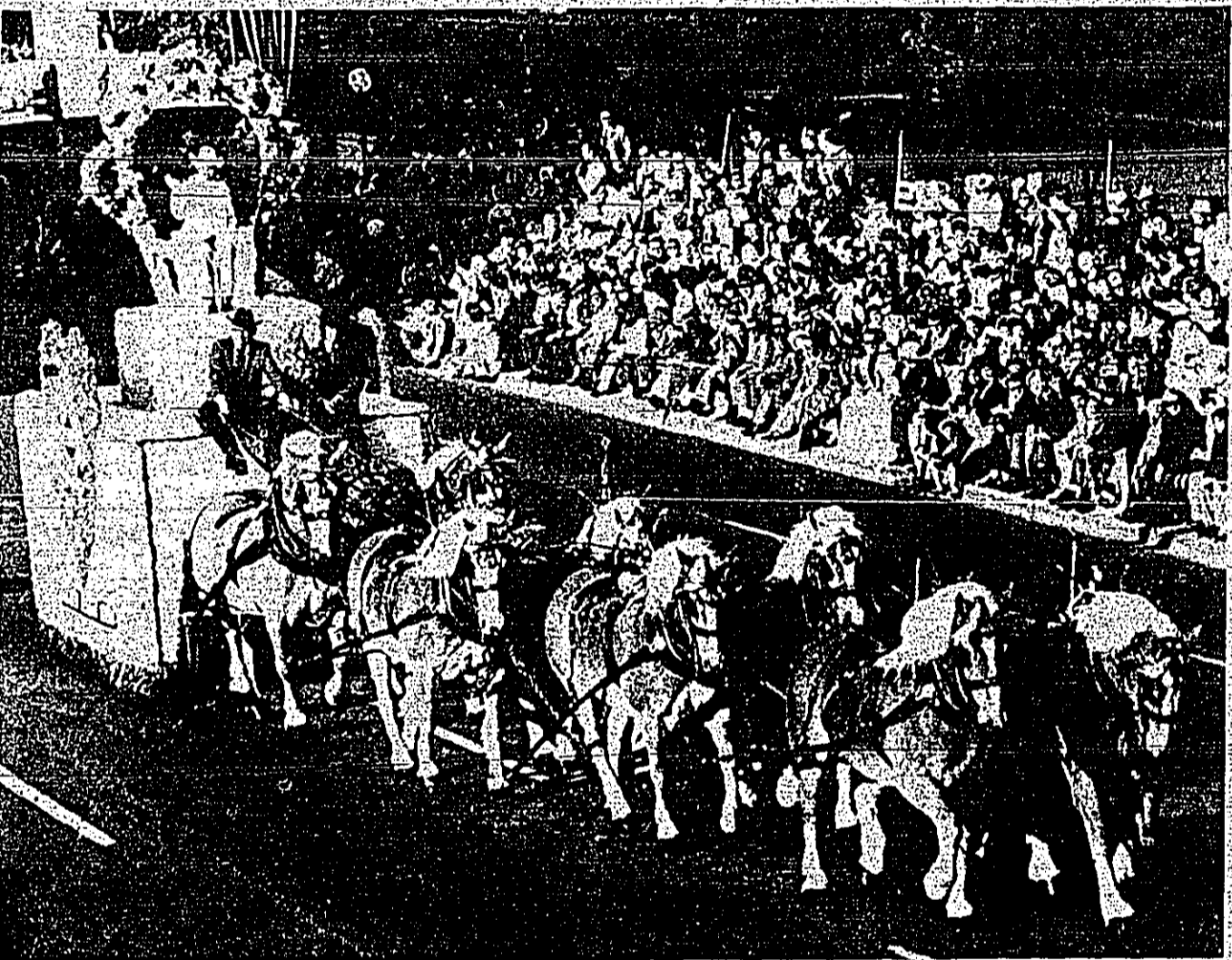
To Be In Western Parade

H. G. Branch Assigned Here By International

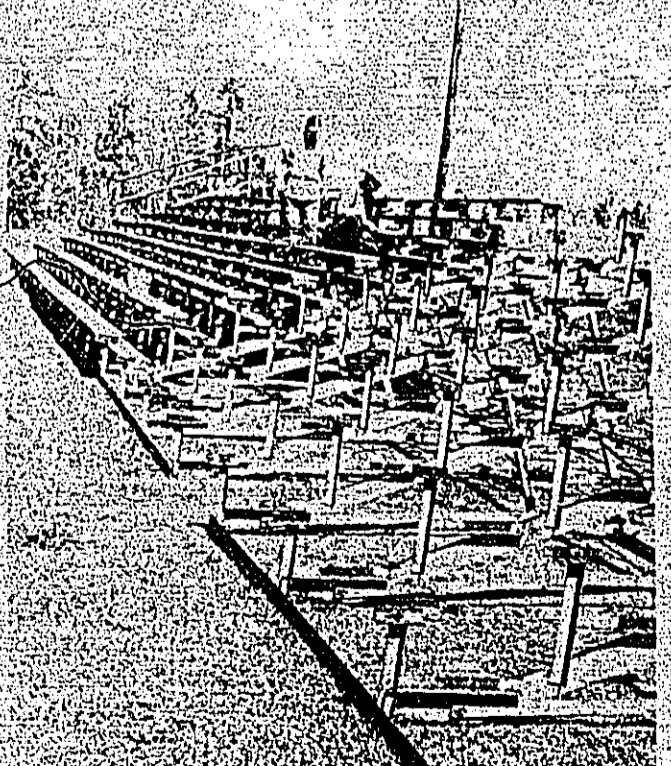

TRAIL RIDES TO HEAD FOR WESTERN DAY PARADE

11 File For Trustee In Woodville ISD

Eleven persons filed for the three positions to be filled on the board of trustees of Woodville Independent School District at the election April 7.

For position 3, the incumbent Dr. W.S. Nichols, Jr. and

R.E. Grammer, G.A. Williams, Jr. and Lewis H. Hudson all filed for a place on the ballot.

For position four, the candidates are Donald E. Gardner, E.L. (Gene) Boykin, Willie D. Jernie and W.D. (Doug) Tolbert.

For position five those filing are Bob R. Bell, C.E. Wright and Lloyd Fortenberry.

Absentee balloting will begin March 19 in the administration building on the Kirby campus.

Tyler County Youth Riders will again make their trail ride to the Western Parade in Woodville March 31.

As customary the group will leave Spurger at 3:00 p.m. Friday, March 30, and ride to the Youth Arena for the 'Play Day' events in which six place trophies are awarded in three age groups.

They leave Saturday, March 24 at 7 p.m. and arrive in Woodville for lunch. They take part in the Western Parade and attend the rodeo at the 4-H and FFA Arena west of Woodville that night.

Information about the trail ride may be obtained from Joe Jordan at 429-3647.

The trail ride by the Tyler County Youth Riders is only one of about a dozen trail ride groups which ride to the Western Weekend parade and other activities in 1972. Since the start of Western Weekend on March 23, 1967, it has grown until this year it will be one of the largest parades of its kind.

Trail riding to the Dogwood Festival had its start in 1958 when approximately 75 riders formed at Dickens County Life Store on Highway 150 west and rode into Woodville in time for the Dogwood Festival Parade that year. This actually started the trail rides and resulted in the now famous Western Weekend.

The 60 was a decade of expansion as new activities were added and as the traditional events were expanded, revised and improved.

The major expansion of this decade was the division of the Dogwood Festival into two separate weekends. Due to the increasing numbers of horse back riders who were coming to Woodville to join the Dogwood Parade, the Trail Bosses of the various Trail Rides requested a parade of their own. As a consequence the first Tyler County Dogwood Festival Western Weekend was held in 1967. Western Day was March 23, 1967. Bob Bell was named director and held this position until 1973 when Ben Worsham was named director.

In addition to the Western Day Parade the day's activities included a special show at 4-H and FFA arena near Woodville with performances by riding clubs and drill teams. A Western Teenage Dance and Western Adult Dance were held that evening. On March 27, 1971, Western Day featured the first Open Rodeo in addition to the usual events. In 1972, Western Weekend sponsored a Board Growing Contest and a selection of Western Weekend Sweethearts.

Seven File For Six Spurger Positions

Seven persons are seeking six seats on the Spurger Independent School District Board of Trustees that will be filled in the April 7 election.

All six incumbents filed for re-election. They are: position 2, Walter Cowart; position 3, Richard Jordan; position 4, James Chapman; position 5, Charles Hight; position 6, Raymond Wilson; and position 7, Clyde D. Hicks.

The only contest is in position 6, with Virgil Luther Savage filing to run for this seat.

Position 2 is a two year term, positions 3, 4, and 5 are for one year, and positions 6 and 7 are for three years.

Forest Trail Ads To Boost Area Tourism

Woodville, a major point on the Texas Forest Trail, this month will begin reaping the benefits of a major national promotion of the special East Texas route.

The Texas Tourist Development Agency disclosed that \$90,000 of advertising is being spent to promote the Forest Trail in the magazines.

It will appear in March issues of *Travel*, *Life* and *TV Guide*, in April issues of *Better Homes & Gardens*, *Camping Journal* and *Travel & Leisure*, and in May issues of *Holiday* and *Woodall's Trailer Travel*.

The TTDA is buying a combined circulation of 6.6 million in the magazines.

The ad's single dominant photo is that of a couple camping under towering pines near Angelina National Forest. It was shot specifically for the ad by the TTDA.

The copy mentions such other principal area attractions as the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation, a spring where Davy Crockett camped, and Heritage Village in Woodville.

Featured in a corner of the ad is a coupon inviting the reader to request copies of the Texas Highway Department's special pamphlet on the Forest Trail, and its 200-page travel guide, "Texas—Land of Contrast."

The ad, and subsequent highway department literature, will give the reader compelling reason to discover this exciting part of Texas," said Frank Hildebrand, TTDA executive director.

"We expect commuters and attractions all along the Forest Trail to benefit appreciably from this added promotion of their area as trail riders come their way."

The Forest Trail is one of the 10 Texas Travel Trails around which the TTDA has developed special ads. Other special ad subjects are the Brazos, Hill Country, and Plains Trails.
