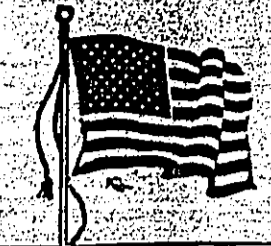

## Youth Riders Win Place at Nederland Diamond Jubilee



A beautiful dawn in East Texas was just breaking as several Tyler County Youth Riders made their way from Woodville to Nederland to participate in the Diamond Jubilee Parade. After having risen anywhere

from 4:30 to 5:30 a.m., the enthusiastic group looked forward to the first official representation of the Youth Riders in a parade this season. The riders were stunning and very well received, dressed

in the official Youth Riders attire of Navy jeans, white shirt, and red neckties. Carrying the Youth Riders Banner were Mark Currie and Eddie Klier. The American flag was carried by Bruce Worthy, the Texas

Grant, and club president Joe Jordan Sr. Ending a perfect March day the riders returned to Woodville, after competing with six groups, with the Diamond Jubilee certificate and \$25 for the third place winner.

## DOGWOOD FESTIVAL EVENTS PLANNED

Tuesday was the first day of spring and the dogwood are blooming all over Tyler County as heralds of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival which begins March 31 with Western Week-end.

On that day hundreds of trail riders, many of whom started the "ride" to Woodville the day

before, will arrive for the big western parade and rodeo which will be followed by western dances that night.

The following Saturday, April 7, will see the unfolding of another parade with floats, duchesses and the five princesses of Tyler County wending through Woodville in a tradi-

tional display of color and beauty. That night in the outdoor Dogwood Amphitheatre the splendor and pomp of the queen's coronation will be followed by the historical pageant which this year will depict Tyler County in the 1930's.

On Tuesday night the King's Men had made their final judging of the five princesses of Tyler County and one of them had been chosen as the 1973 Queen of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival. Her identity will be kept secret, however, until the night of the coronation.

The five princesses are Sherri Winters of Colmesneer, Charlotte Hancock of Spurger, Pam Glasscock of Chester, Roxann Spears, of Warren and Debbie Collier of Woodville.

More seating space is being added at the Tyler County 4-H, FFA Arena at the airport west of Woodville for the rodeo following the parade, March 31. Additional parking space has been added and the Western Weekend committee feels that everything will be in readiness for the parade, rodeo and other events.

The women who have been making the thousands of artificial flowers for decorating the amphitheatre on April 7 have been busy "tying on" or fastening the blossoms to tree branches (small) in preparation for placing them at the amphitheatre for the coronation and pageant. The artificial flowers are placed at the amphitheatre the last moment possible to protect them from any moisture.

Also being constructed are the "props" on the huge stage at the amphitheatre. At one end will be the large throne for the queen and king, princesses, and the 30 or more visiting duchesses and their escorts, will be seated following the coronation.

Other parts of the stage are used for store fronts, houses, or other things needed for the acts in the pageant. Just what they will be this year has not been learned by the Booster.

All in all, everything is progressing in order for the big two weekends of the 1973 Tyler County Dogwood Festival.

## Absentee Voting In School Elections Underway

Absentee voting began Monday in the trustee elections in the five independent school districts in Tyler County. It will continue through April 3 for the April 7 election.

There are 11 candidates for the three trustee positions to be filled in the Woodville district; seven have filed for the six positions to be filled at Spurger, and Warren school districts have five candidates for the two positions open there.

Voters will also elect three members of the county school board. Uncontested candidates are Donald Tolbert in precinct one, H.O. Seaman in precinct three and L.P. Hicks in precinct four.

Candidates for the two positions in Warren district are: Position 6: Frank L. Jones, Gene McCullum and Edward Spears.

Position 7: Newton Jordan and Britton Yawn.

There will be three voting boxes open in the Warren Independent School District on April 7. They will be located in the Warren Junior High School, Village Mills Methodist Church and Fred Elementary School.

The candidates in the Woodville and Spurger School districts were printed in last week's Booster. However, for those who may have missed it they are:

In Woodville for position 3: Dr. W.S. Nichols, Jr., the incumbent; R.E. Grammer, C.A. Williams, Jr. and Lewis H. Hudson.

Position 4: Donald E. Gardner, E.L. (Gene) Boykin, Willie D. Jerue and W.D. (Doug) Tolbert.

Position 5: Bob R. Belt, C.E. Wright and Lloyd Fortenberry.

In the Spurger district there are six positions to be filled due to terms ending and resignations during the year.

Incumbent trustees have filed for all positions to be filled with position six being the only one for which there is a contest.

Positions to be filled, length of term, and candidates are: Position 2: Walter Cowart (two years); Position 3: Richard Jordan (one year); Position 4: James Chapman (one year); Position 5: Charles Hight (one year); Position 6: Raymond Wilson, incumbent and Virgil Luther Segrest (three years); Position 7: Clyde D. Hicks (three years).

Taxpayers in the district who are 65 years of age or older will have to claim the exemption at the school tax office and present proof of age.

If you haven't purchased 1973 license plates for your car, time is getting very short, according to Tax Assessor and Collector Barbara Tolbert.

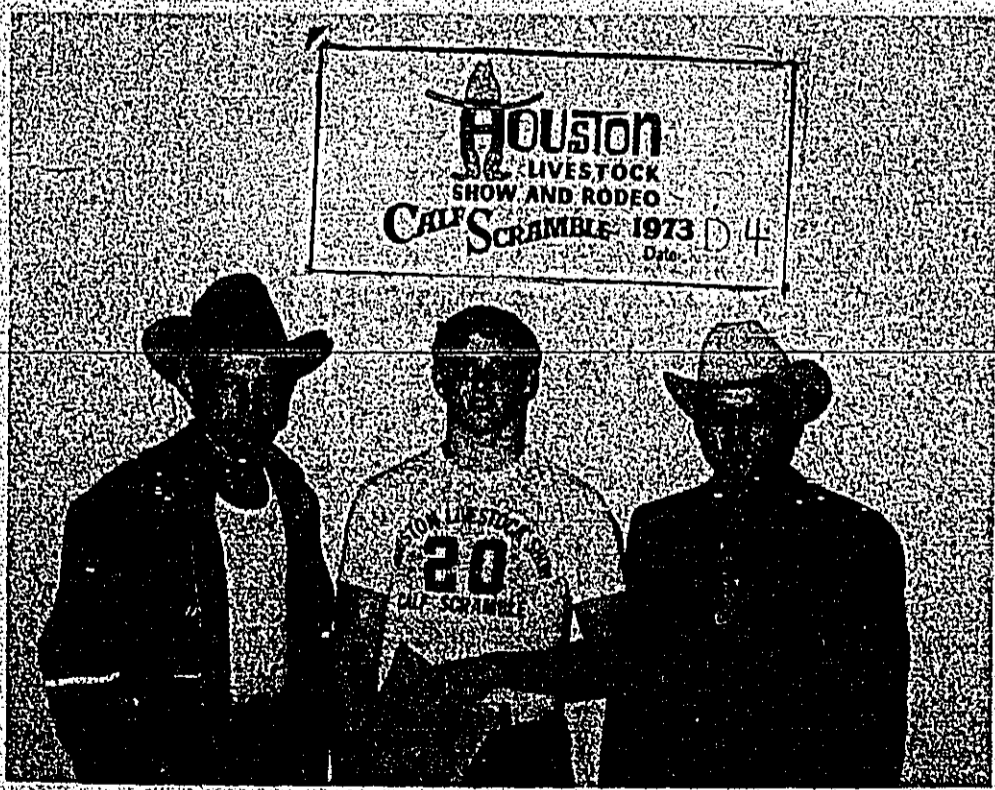
New 1973 plates must be on all vehicles by April 1. Mrs. Tolbert said it is too late to avoid some waiting by those needing new plates but the jam will get worse the longer car owners wait before the deadline.

Car owners who have received the three-part license renewal form should bring it intact when buying their plates. Those who do not have the three-part form should bring their car title and the 1972 license receipt, Mrs. Tolbert said.

The group leave the Youth Arena promptly at 7 a.m. on March 31 for the Western Week-end Parade and Rodeo.

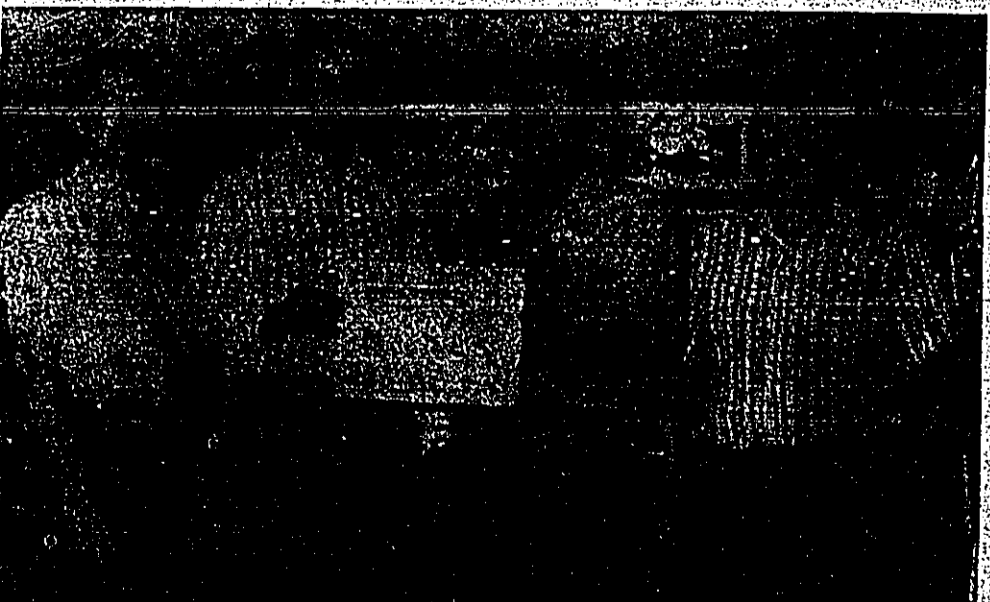

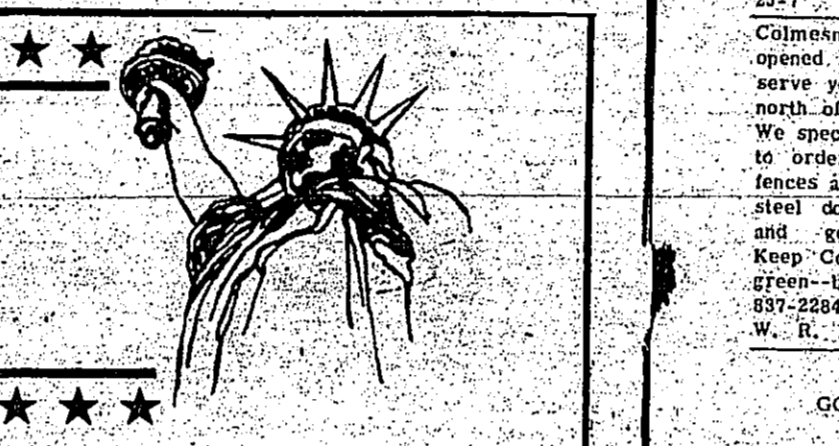
