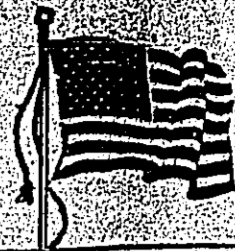

Toby Spurlock, County's Easter Seal representative, reported today that the 1973 Easter Seal Appeal of the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults is going well.

The 1973 Easter Seal Appeal will finance the Easter Seal Society's rehabilitation program for crippled children and adults in Texas. Last year the Society helped 16,572 disabled persons through its program of assistance in finding and making effective use of services for the disabled and their families.

The Easter Seal Society helps support 18 treatment facilities in Texas where children and adults not eligible for other assistance are treated. These centers offer physical therapy, medical diagnosis, speech and hearing programs and related services to help the disabled build happier and more useful lives.

Commissioners Accept Bid For Re-roofing Courthouse

Tyler County commissioners court at its regular March meeting on March 12 (Monday) and March 14 accepted three bids, including one to re-roof the courthouse, and attended to several other matters on the agenda.

County Judge, Tom D. Mann presided with Commissioners Joe L. Best, H.M. Parks, Kenneth C. Belt and James R. Jordan present.

At the session March 12 the court accepted the bid of East Texas Paper Company of Lufkin for mimeograph paper. The company bid \$1.05 per ream for 8-1/2x 11 inch, 20 pound paper and \$1.52 per ream for 8-1/2x14 inch, 20 pound paper, both in 200 ream lots.

Also accepted was the bid of Story-Wright of Lufkin for adding machine paper. The company bid \$16.50 per case on two cases of 2 1/4 inch rolls and \$22.50 per case for two cases of three inch adding machine rolls.

The commissioners tabled a bid on microfilm equipment for the county clerk's office for further study.

The court adopted a motion by Best seconded by Jordan to require bids on any purchase from revenue sharing of county funds when the expenditure is over \$300. This is to include capital expenditures only.

In other business, the court approved the signatures of county auditor Earl King and Ann Fenderson on county treasurer's checks in the absence of Fletcher Boyd, county treasurer; approved the monthly reports of Extension Agents Maurine Mooney and Clinton Currie; and to sell the used wire and post taken up around the old disposal dump in precinct two to Mrs. Hutto Wallace for \$35.

On motion by Jordan which was seconded by Belt the court voted to store the old Hallod-Xerox machine from the county clerk's office in the precinct one barn. The court had advertised for bids on it but none were received.

The meeting was recessed until Wednesday, March 14, when the following items were acted upon.

The court accepted for filing purposes the plats of Woodland Hills, designated number 174, and Magnolia Square on the Josiah Wheat survey in the City of Woodville, designated plat file 175; and was presented plans by Doyle Chandler the plans for a city park in Chester.

The bid of Fran-Mar, Inc. to re-roof the courthouse, was accepted at this meeting. Fran-Mar is to post a roofing bond and be responsible for cleaning up all trash and waste materials from the courthouse area. The contract is to be paid out of the revenue sharing funds. Fran-Mar Inc. bid \$8,980 on the re-roofing job.

The court approved a motion by Jordanto table bids on painting the courthouse for further study.

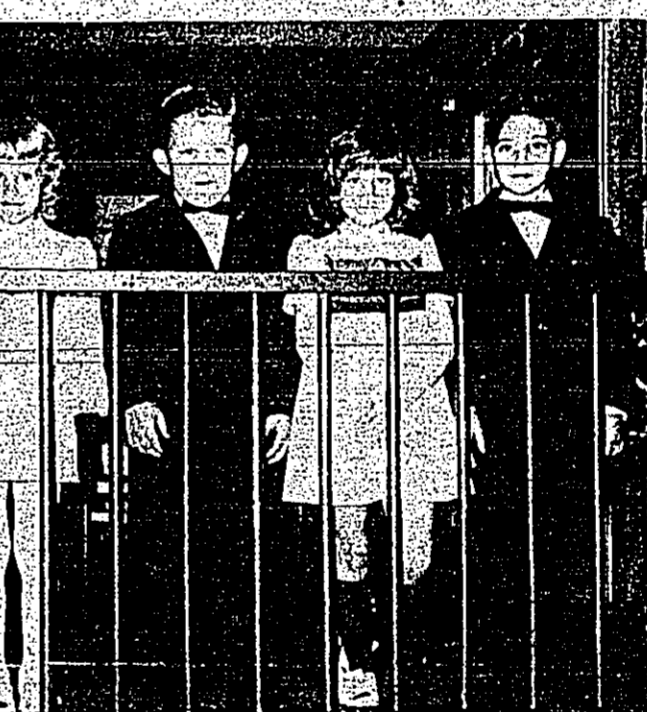

Friday Last Day To Get License Plates

For all practical purposes Friday is the last day to get 1973 license tags.

And to help those unable to make it to the tax office during regular hours, Barbara Tolbert, tax assessor-collector, will keep her office open until 8 p.m. Friday.

The state law sets the final vehicle registration date as April 1. This falls on Sunday this year, and the 1973 license plates must be displayed on vehicles Monday, April 2.

So that makes Friday until 8:00 p.m. the last chance car owners will have to register vehicles and have tags on by Monday.

And if you don't like standing in line, maybe it would be a good idea to get to the tax office first now. The line will be shorter than it will be later in the week.
