NEW OWNERS TAKE OVER BOOSTER

Robert E. Jackson announces the sale of Tyler County Publishing Co., Inc., and Tyler County Booster to Raleigh A. Lamb of Trinity, Texas. Mr. Jackson bought the Booster in April, 1965.

Mr. Lamb and his wife Marlon, took over publishing the Booster this week. Their son, Larry, a senior at Trinity High School will join them after graduation. The Lambs also have two daughters; Carol, a home economics teacher at New Waverly and Mrs. Jerry (Barbara) Hinson. They live at Huntsville, Texas.

Lamb has had 27 years experience in newspaper work.

He has worked with a small daily newspaper and weeklies. The Lambs bought the Trinity Standard in April, 1967 and sold the newspaper to David Durham, president of Polk County Publishing Co. Prior to moving to Trinity he managed the Hempstead News, where they had resided for 15 years. Mrs. Lamb started the Credit Bureau of Hempstead in 1959 and operated it until 1967. They also owned and operated White Auto Store in Hempstead.

Their son Larry became interested in newspaper work at the age of 11. He was operating the Linotype by the time he was 12 and learned other

DOGWOOD FESTIVAL PAGEANT AND QUEEN'S CORONATION SATURDAY

Pageant Theme Is Tyler County During Thirties

The pageant, which will be presented Saturday night in the school amphitheater to entertain the queen's court and her loyal subjects, will carry out one of the original purposes of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival—the preservation and cultivation of interest in the history of the area.

"Tyler County During the Thirties", a time of simple joys and many sorrows, will be presented with Mrs. Karen Sullivan as pageant director, Jim Linnette, music director, and Monroe Prescott, narrator.

Highlighting each phase of the program will be appropriate music of the era with songs by Roger Shuemat, Keith McCafferty and Ruth Houston, soloists, the Harris Family, and "The Southernaires", 45-member choral group from Robert E. Lee High School of Houston with Miss Eleanor Grant as director.

Fred Sullivan is the operating director in charge of the pageant and George Jarrott of the stage set. Other chairmen are as follows: Becky Jimette and Kathy Kinnon, costumes; Barbara Allison and Peggy Burton, properties; Dede Cordes, special effects; Sue Brackon, decorations; A. L. Polk, lights; Phillips Sherrod and Wyatt Bell, sound.

"1929—The End of a prosperous Decade" will be the theme of the first episode where, against strong, happy family background, a horse auction will be staged. Following this will be a shocking report of the Wall Street collapse on the radios of the day.

The political influence of the women of the period will be portrayed in the second episode, "The Summer of '32". Also shown will be all of the hopes that were expressed in the music of "Happy Days Are Here Again" and in the outlook for a new president's administration.

"The New Deal in Tyler County" with C.C.C. and W.P.A. projects will be featured in the third episode, but even a visit from a family of migrant oakies fails to dampen the spirit of local citizens always seeking to look "Over the Rainbow".

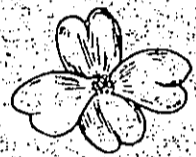
The Harris Family of Lufkin, well-known gospel singing group will have a real Sacred Harp Singing School in the fourth episode, "Escape from the Problems of the Day".

"He has never forgotten the place of his birth and has been responsible for played a major part in the location of numerous businesses in San Augustine which have provided employment and contributed to the welfare of the area. Additionally, as a progressive banker in that city, he and his institution have given impetus to the growth and development of existing local businesses and industries. It is, therefore, appropriate that the Tyler County Dogwood Festival, the oldest outdoor historical pageant in the Nation, honor this world famous native son as this year's "Mr. East Texas."

Civil cases will continue in the second week next Monday.

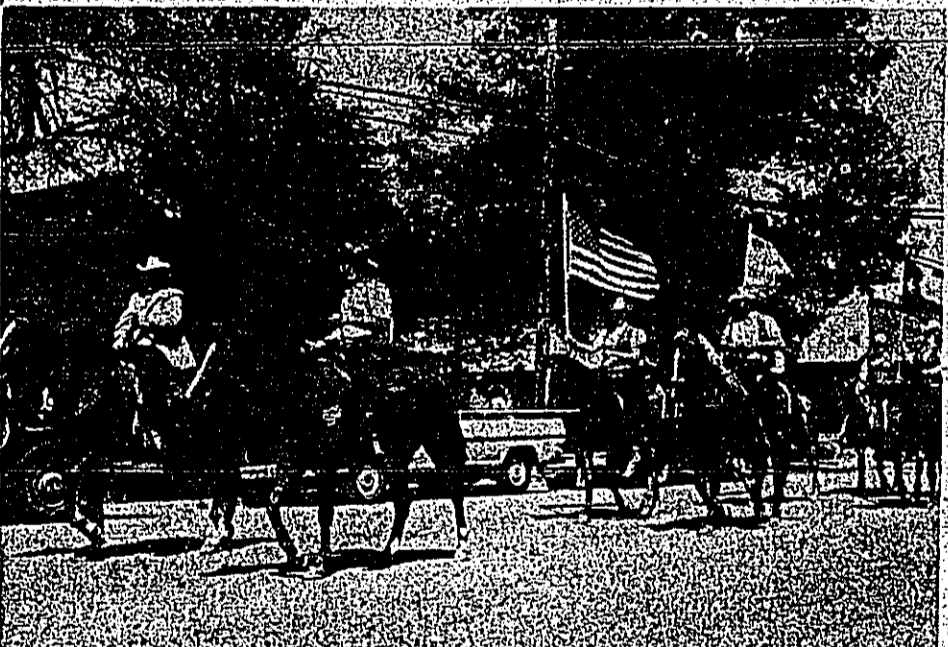
Western Weekend A Success

Saturday Also School Election Day

School trustee elections will be held Saturday to elect school board members in five independent school districts in Tyler County. Voters will elect three members of the county school board.

Eleven candidates for three positions to be filled in the Woodville district, seven for the six positions to be filled at Spurger and five candidates to two positions in Warren.

For position 3, the incumbent Dr. W.S. Nichols, Jr. and R.E. Grammer, C.A. Williams, Jr. and Lewis H. Hudson.

Candidates for position four are Donald P. Gardner, E.L. (Gene) Boykin, Willie D. Jarvis and W.D. (Doug) Roberts.

Bob R. Bell, C.E. Wright, and Lloyd Fortenberry. Seven candidates are seeking six seats on the Spurger Independent School District Board of Trustees.

All incumbents are running for re-election. They are: position 2, Walter Cowart; position 3, Richard Jordan; position 4, James Chapman; position 5, Charles Hight; position 6, Raymond Wilson; and position 7, Clyde D. Hicks. The only contest is in position 6, with Virgil Luther, Sr. and Raymond Wilson.

Position 2 is a two year term, positions 3, 4, 5 and 7 are for one year and positions 6 and 7 for three years.

Voters will also elect three members of the county school board. Uncontested candidates are Donald Tolbert in precinct one, H.O. Seamans, precinct three and L.P. Hicks in precinct four.

Three voting boxes will be open in the Warren Independent School district. They will be located in the Warren Junior High School, Village Mills Methodist Church and Fred Elementary School.

Voting in Woodville will be held at Kirby High School. Poll will open at 7 a.m. and will close at 7:00 p.m.

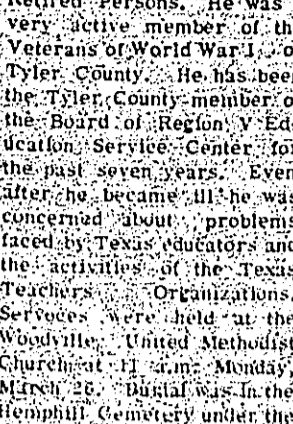

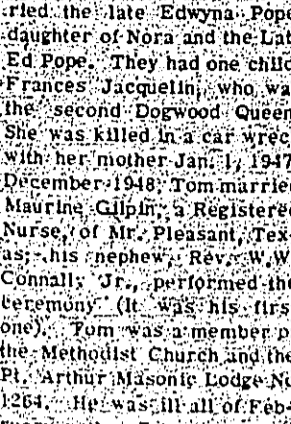

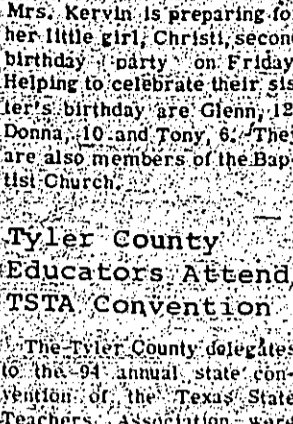
