Assistant DA Needed In 88th Judicial District

Tyler County is on the look-out for an assistant district attorney.

Tyler County, along with its neighbor Hardin County, is a recent recipient of an \$18,788 grant from the Criminal Justice Council. The grant is for Prosecutors Aides and Assistance for the 88th Judicial District, which consists of Hardin and Tyler Counties.

Infant Dies In Wreck

Melissa Haynes, 18 month infant was dead on arrival at Tyler County Hospital following a collision, a mile north of Woodville on U.S. 59 Monday. Six persons were injured when the car they were riding in struck a parked truck at a construction sight.

Driver of the car was reported to be Ruby Haynes of Lufkin. Twelve people were reported to be in the car. Investigating officers were Gary Hennigan and William Braubury with the Department of Public Safety.

Sutton Re-elected

Mayor H.G. Sutton and Councilmen Kenneth Brown and Billy Joe Faircloth were re-elected without opposition in the Colmesneil city election Saturday.

The grant provides for an assistant district attorney to work with the present district attorney for the district, R. Stanley Coe.

Hardin County Judge Emmett Lack realized some months ago the need to additional help in the district and he, along with Tyler County Judge Tom D. Mann, sought help from state and federal agencies. Judge Lack made the application, which was granted near the beginning of the year.

"The original grant called for both an assistant district attorney and an investigator, but the investigator was dropped due to lack of funds," the judge said. "But we're glad to be getting some help."

The new assistant district attorney must hold a law degree and be a member of the Texas Bar, but there are no regulations as to sex, race or creed.

"An assistant will be very important in these counties, especially in briefings and preparing cases for trial. He can help make the office more efficient and also help reduce case backlog," Judge Lack said.

Coe added that an assistant can become the district attorney's good right hand. "Often an attorney can't be as prepared for a case as he'd like," Coe said. "So having two people thinking about the same case can often uncover points that one man might have missed."

The 1973 baseball season begins in a few weeks for some 200 Tyler County youngsters between the ages of 9-12. The Tyler County Little League Association, a non-profit organization, was formed in an effort to have better facilities and equipment for the Little Leaguers. The organization consists of 10 teams from Woodville, 1 from Pinedale, 1 from Spurger, 1 from Warren, 1 from Colmesneil and 1 from the Alabama Coast Indian Reservation.

The association buys all uniforms, makes sure that each team has a uniform for each player, furnishes all equipment, such as balls, bats, catchers' equipment, batting helmets and other safety equipment for the Little Leaguers. The association also furnishes insurance for each player, pays for the upkeep of the park, such as lights, etc. They hire official umpires and scorekeepers. In other words, ALL of the expenses of the Little Leaguers are paid by the association.

The Tyler County Little League only means of support is YOU, the public. Many of you will receive a form letter in the mail explaining our needs. All contributions will go into the association and will be spent on the Little Leaguers in our county. Please do not disregard this plea. We need your help.
