Development Board Appointed By Woodville City Council

The Woodville City Council has created a city board of development to make appropriate recommendations to the Council as to the best method of advertising and promoting the City of Woodville and expanding the funds allocated for that purpose. This board is authorized by an act of the Texas Legislature allowing incorporated cities of less than 500,000 to appropriate an amount not exceeding one per cent of the general fund budget for advertising, publicity and promoting its growth and development.

The first board consisting of five members to serve for a two-year term has been appointed by the Council with Mrs. Faye Ward, chairwoman, M. F. Alford, J. H. Kemson, George Jarratt, and Fred Sullivan.

This board will act in an advisory capacity only and according to the statute are not to be deemed public officers or agents of the city.

One of the other favorite targets of tax reformers who do not do their homework is the oil depletion allowance. 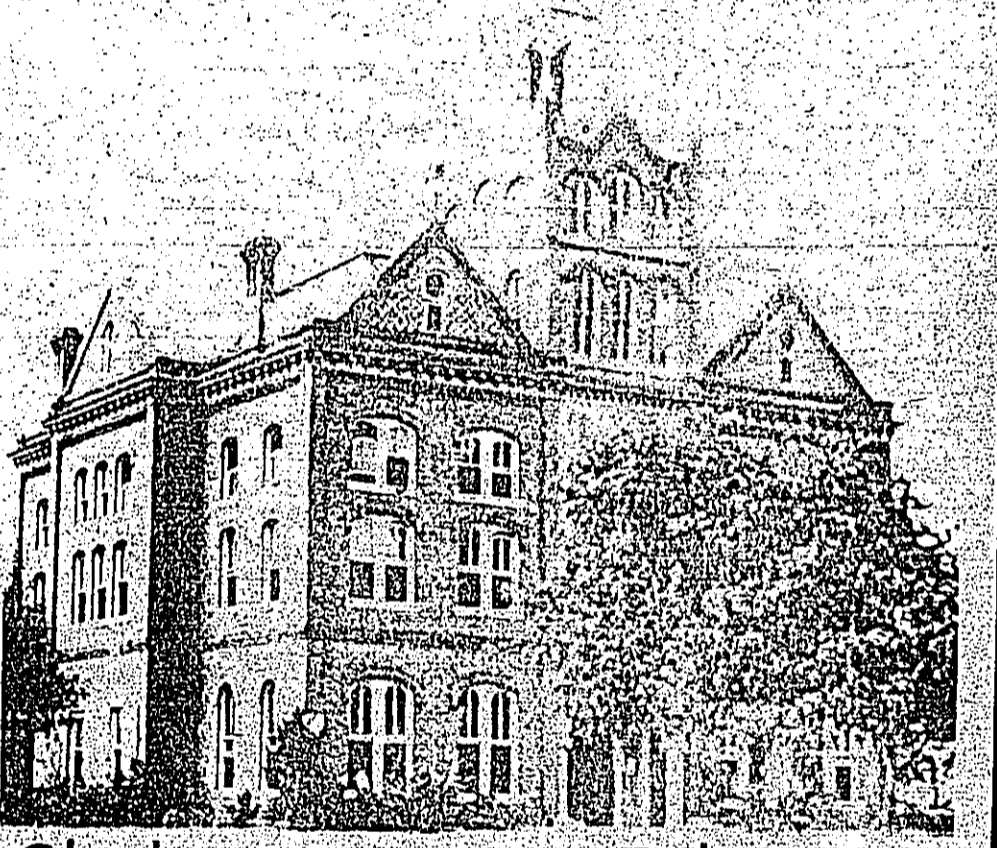
Clark to represent Tyler County at Folklife Festival

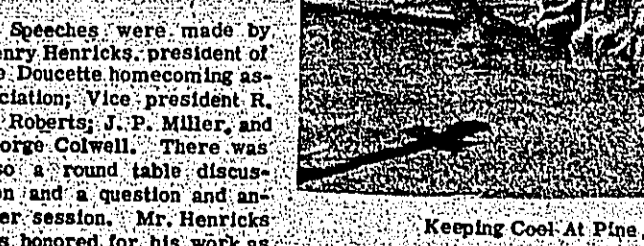
New Home For Jack Lane Ford

Jack Lane of Jack Lane Ford in Woodville said that the new show room, service department, and parts shop that is now under construction on the Chester highway north to the present Ford dealership should be completed and ready for use by July.

The blue metallic structure will contain 12,000 square feet of floor space. Much of the space will be used for an enlarged showroom; the new showroom will double the size of the one now in use and will be able to display between 10 and 12 new automobiles. Other features are a very large newly equipped service department and a greatly expanded parts shop.
