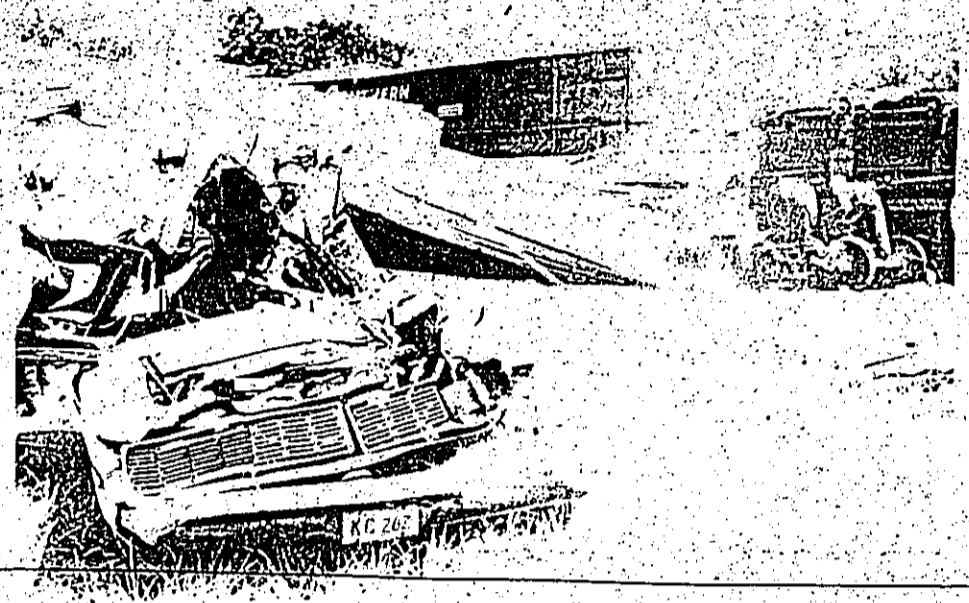

Three Injured In Car, Truck, Train Wreck

Pipeline To Cross Tyler Co

A preliminary design and feasibility study is in progress to construct a 26-inch crude-oil pipeline from Corpus Christi, Nueces County, Texas to a point near Cushing, Payne County, Oklahoma. The tentative route has been selected and is being distributed to all Federal, State and County regulatory agencies and authorities. Aerial surveys of the proposed route, regulatory agencies and authorities may require route adjustments. The crude oil transported may be domestic or foreign.

The pipeline will be constructed through Tyler County starting at the Hargim County Line East of the Beaumont Highway and continuing on a north-south northeast line to Angelina County and on to Oklahoma.

Woodville Kindergarten Registration July 12-18

Children eligible to attend kindergarten in the Woodville Elementary School this fall, who have not registered, must do so July 12 through July 18.

Registration hours will be from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the school, announced L. C. Lowery, principal.

All children who will be five years old before Sept. 1 are eligible regardless of the financial condition.

The Woodville kindergarten will be divided into two semesters with children attending a full day for one semester.

The first semester will start on August 20, and children who were five years old prior to March 1 will attend that semester.

The second semester will begin on January 14, 1974 and children who were five years old after March 1 will attend that semester.

The school districts in Texas were given four options for the operation of their kindergarten programs, said Lowery, and Woodville chose the two-semester plan.

Future Homemakers To Meet In Dallas

Future Homemakers of America will hold their annual national meeting at the Fairmont Hotel in Dallas, July 9-12. Fourteen hundred youth delegates, representing a national membership of half-a-million from all fifty states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, will be accompanied by some four hundred home economics educators who serve as their state and chapter advisers.

This year's meeting is designed to promote active involvement through the new Program Action Impact. The four-day program will revolve around the theme IMPACT '73.

Texas will be represented by 199 delegates, and 50 adult advisers. Mrs. Betty Romans will head the delegation which leaves for Dallas on July 8.

Presiding at the opening session on Monday evening, July 9, will be FHA National President Nancy Hodgkinson, a high school senior from Garden City, Kansas. During the four-day meeting officers and delegates will conduct and participate in "talk-in" sessions and "action" labs exploring ways to use the Program Action Impact Kit in planning and carrying out in-depth projects that relate to their home economics classroom work.

Each state delegation has a particular assignment to carry out at the national meeting. Texas delegation will be in charge of hostess duties, information practices.

Miss Louise Roy of New York, National Director of Youth Activities for the National Foundation, will set the tone for the meeting in her keynote address at the Monday night opening session when she speaks on "Change - Coping or Coping Out".

Major piece of business to come before the assembly is the election of twelve national officers to serve during the 1973-74 year. Election results will be announced at the Wednesday morning session (July 11).

There will also be time for sight-seeing, and attendance at a real Texas barbecue and rodeo.

Future Homemakers of America is the national organization for students in home economics and home economics related occupations in the secondary schools. A self-supporting non-profit organization, it is sponsored by the Division




FATHER OF MASS PRODUCTION



Most Americans think of Eli Whitney as the first to utilize mass production in the manufacture of a product. But a hundred years before his time, was Eli Whitney, 1765-1825, who probably started the whole idea.

His fame as the man who invented the cotton gin is secure, but Whitney's importance extends far beyond that famous contrivance of 1793. He really started the "Industrial Revolution" in America.

It was Whitney who developed standard interchangeable parts for the musket, not only inventing the specific tools, but also pioneering in manufacturing process and in using unskilled labor.
