## Top of the Morning

Let heaven and earth praise him; the seas and everything that moves therein. Psalms 69:34.

According to the latest polls President Richard Nixon's popularity has reached the lowest point to date. 40 percent in the latest nationwide survey said they approve of the way he is handling his job as chief executive with 49 percent registering disapproval. This is a five point drop from a previous poll taken in June and 28 points lower than a poll taken in January after the Vietnam peace settlement. The President's popularity took a drastic drop presumably because of the Senate Watergate hearings. The American people have allowed themselves to be influenced by the big Ultra-liberal Press of the North and Northeast. Nixon has never gotten along very well with the press simply because he was man enough to stand up to them. We will withhold our opinion of the President until it has been proven that he has done anything illegal.

Some people wonder if the 40,000 lives and millions of dollars spent in Vietnam were wasted. One former U.S. prisoner of war replies emphatically, "No!" Major Edward W. Leonard of Winlock, Washington, who spent almost five years in a North Vietnamese prison camp, believes that, "It was not waste of lives and money to give the Vietnamese a chance for freedom, a choice of forms of government." Then he lays down a basic truth, "If we refuse to help others gain freedom, we are in danger of forfeiting our own freedom."

The major and hundreds of other returned POWs are proud Americans—proud of their country and its accomplishments. We can learn much from these men. If each of us makes a concentrated effort to hold onto that "never-say-die" spirit which pushed the United States to the top from its humble beginning in 1776, our nation will continue to move ahead as a world leader with wisdom and purposefulness, carving a future worthy of our past.

## Pitts Testify On Big Thicket Park

Mr. and Mrs. Henry K. Pitts of Warren recently testified before the subcommittee on National Parks and Recreation in Washington, D.C. Hearings were held July 16-17 to determine the establishment of a Big Thicket National Park.

Three bills presented by members of the House of Representatives call for a park area of at least 100,000 acres. U.S. Congressman Charles Wilson's bill limited the acreage to 75,000. The Department of Interior also presented its bill calling for 68,000 acres.

Congressman Wilson's bill included the Neches River Corridor for recreational purposes, but excluded other streams to avoid taking of many private residences, and because of limited recreational value.

Portions of Tyler County acreage in the bills include Hickory and Turkey Creek units. Pitts' testimony discouraged the taking of 100 square miles of land and pointed out that streams are already free to all under the Constitution of 1836. He said that excluding a large amount of acreage from tax rolls would increase taxes of private individuals to a great extent.

Mrs. Pitts drew attention to the fact that four national forests in the area already cover some 658,000 acres. In addition to this there are numerous state parks and forests including the seven state parks in the Texas Forest Trail set up by the Texas Highway Department.

Mr. and Mrs. Pitts were among 45 witnesses across the state and nation to testify.

## Disaster Aid Claim Office In Woodville

Farmers and ranchers in Tyler County who suffered crop or property losses because of severe storms and flooding beginning about June 11, 1973 may apply at the Farmers Home Administration County Office located at 411 Pine Street, Woodville, Texas.

Initial Emergency loan application will not be received after September 1, 1973 from applicants having physical damages. (Damages or losses not compensated for by insurance or otherwise to farm dwellings and service buildings, land and water resources, farming supplies or equipment, or livestock essential to normal farm operations are considered to be physical damages.) Initial Emergency loan applications may be taken until April 11, 1974 from applicants having economic injury.

Loans may be made to those otherwise eligible applicants who have qualifying losses because of the adverse conditions described above and who are unable to obtain sufficient credit elsewhere to finance their actual needs at reasonable rates and terms, taking into consideration prevailing private and cooperative rates and terms in the community in or near which the applicant resides for loans for similar purposes and periods of time. Interest will be charged at 5 percent annum. No forgiveness be-

nefit (principal cancellation) will be granted in connection with these emergency loans. Emergency loans can be made for the purposes of meeting essential operating expenses and the repair or replacement of farm property. Additional information concerning these loans may be obtained from Erwin Maclean, county supervisor, whose office is located at 411 Pine Street, Woodville, Texas.

## Colmesneil School To Raise Taxes

For the first time since 1967 the Colmesneil Board of Trustees found it necessary to have "an across the board" increase in taxes. The Board set the rate at 30% of Market Value with the rate of \$1.60 per \$100 evaluation. This increase was necessary at this time because of the loss of revenue from Title I money, the loss of taxes due to the elderly exemptions, and

the rising cost of salaries, supplies, and equipment. The net result will be about a 20% increase in taxes to each tax payer in the district. The Board of Equalization will be in session Aug. 1, 9:00 a.m. until noon and on this increase was necessary at 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. for individuals. All persons who wish to discuss their evaluation with the board are invited to attend.

## Woodville Schools To Open August 20

The schools of the Woodville Independent School District will open for the 1973-1974 year Monday, August 20, according to B. H. McGuire, superintendent. A pre-school registration for senior high school pupils, for pupils who are in the Wheat Intermediate School, Grades 5-8, who have now previously attended the Woodville schools, and for pupils who will be in attendance in the Kindergarten and First Grade will be conducted Friday, August 17. In order to make it possible for pupils who live in the rural areas of the school district to register Friday, if such registration is indicated, as stated above, the school buses will operate a half-day schedule Friday, August 17, from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m.

Monday, August 20, will be the first full day of classroom instruction. All pupils who have not pre-registered or who have not previously attended the Woodville schools are urged to register on the dates approved for this purpose.

The lunchrooms of the district will begin operation Monday, August 20. Lunch tickets will be available for pupils in Grades K-4 for \$2.00, or 40¢ per day. Lunch tickets for pupils in Grades 5-12 will be \$2.25, or 45¢ per day. All lunches if paid for on a single day basis will be 50¢ per lunch.

Fupus who register in the Kindergarten and First Grade will be required to have birth certificates in order to establish eligibility for registration. Pupils new to the Woodville schools should have grade and credit records and vaccination records from previously attended schools ready at the time of registration.

State law requires that all pupils entering and attending the schools of Texas must have been immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, rubella, pertussis, and small pox, subject to provisional admittance if the required immunizations have been begun, as certified by a physician. Attendance in the schools of Texas is compulsory for all pupils ages seven through seventeen for a minimum of 165 days of the regular school term. Attendance in Kindergarten is optional for five year old pupils, born on or before September 1 of the year of entrance. The Kindergarten program of the district will operate on a single semester basis with the oldest five year old pupils attending the first semester. The faculty of the school district will begin a series of in-service activities Wednesday, August 15. (Continued on Page Two)

## Indians Provide Motorized Big Thicket Tours

On the adventurous Big Thicket tour, a colorful Indian guide drives his guests deep into the virgin pine and hardwood forest in a special vehicle which allows him to drive through swamps, bays, and literally ford streams with the heavy four-wheel drive.

The guide points out huge state and national champion trees, all of different species, as well as other plants and animals unique only to this biological crossroads. More than 80 plant species may be seen, and for those with discerning eyes, several of the more than 300 known species of birds which make the Thicket their home may be seen. The jury-billed woodpecker, the gaily-plumed flicker, the blue-headed vireo, and the scarlet tanager are just a few of the many birds which nest in the Thicket.

The Indian Chief Train Tour gives an entirely different view of the Big Thicket from a different vantage point. The train is a motorized bus which carries up to 20 passengers. 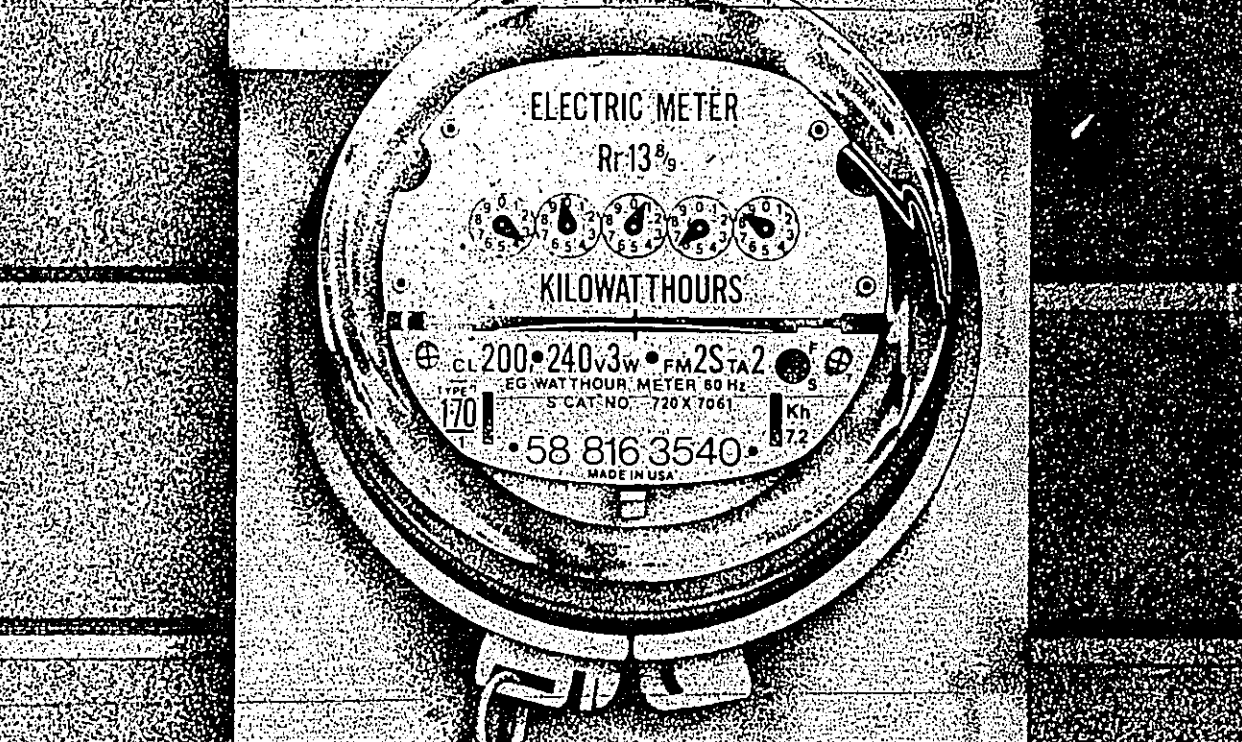

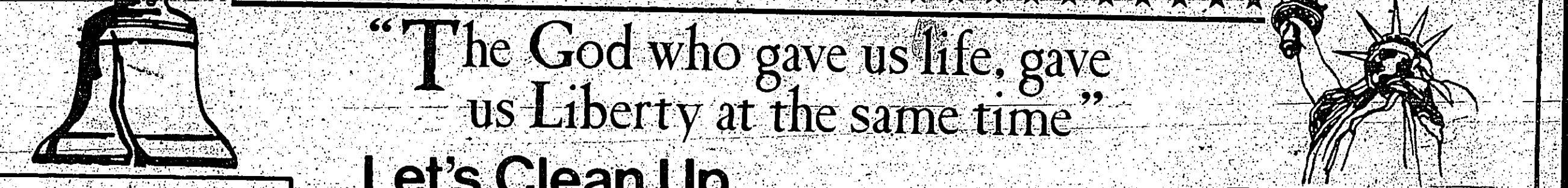
