DETCOG Gets Grant

Governor Dolph Briscoe awarded a \$9,999 grant to the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, Jasper, for establishing a regional drug central project.

The money will come from the Criminal Justice Council, which administers the state's block grant from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act.

The project will provide for planning, resource development, coordination, training, education and information, as well as evaluation of drug abuse programs in the 13-county region.

Counties in the region are Angelina, Hardin, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity and Tyler.

The Deep East Texas application was among 52, for funding of more than four million dollars, considered by the CJC Executive Committee July 18.

Marijuana Taken In Raid Tuesday



Sheriff's deputies and Woodville City police arrested a 29-year-old Lake Jackson man Tuesday morning for allegedly possessing marijuana. The suspect and house where he sometimes stayed had been under surveillance for approximately 25 days.

Taken into custody and charged with unlawfully and knowingly possessing a narcotic drug, to-wit: marijuana, was Ronald Graham 20 of 182 Oyster Creek Drive, Lake Jackson. The suspect arrived at the house in Ivanhoe subdivision before daylight Tuesday.

Officers were able to make arrest at 11:32. The officers took 11 plants believed to be marijuana from the yard of the house. An electric toaster believed to have been used by the suspect to dry the marijuana was also taken from the house. Two bags of marijuana were taken from the suspect's car.

Arresting officers were Chief Deputy Herman Nolen, Sheriff Lewis Craven, assisted by City Police Chief John Grammer.

the water Saturday according to witnesses.

Efforts to recover the body by dragging Sunday were in vain. Officers went back to the scene Monday to continue the search and found Vinlon's body floating on the surface.

Library cards are free if

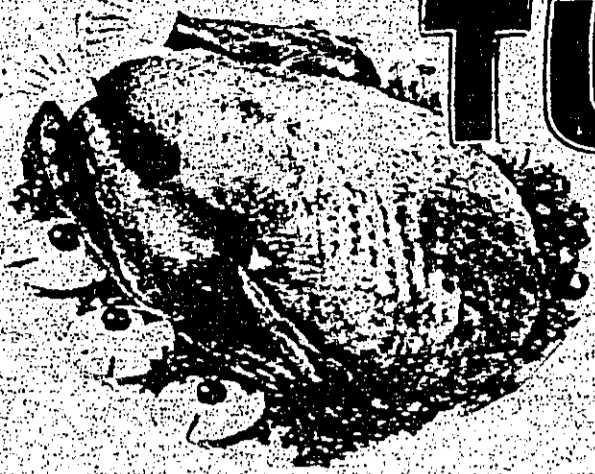
