The National Miss Indian America Pageant Board of Directors of Sheridan, Wyoming, has authorized the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Tribe of Texas to crown Miss Indian America, a 21 year old Shoshoni-Paiute Indian beauty, as the new Miss Indian America XX on Thursday, March 14 at the East Texas Indian Reservation beginning at 11:40 a.m.

For the first time in the 20 year history of the Pageant a Coronation will take place outside of Sheridan, Wyoming. The coronation is ordinarily transferred to the new Miss Indian America during the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation in Sheridan each year in August.

Miss Manning is a Junior at Arizona State University majoring in counseling, graduated in Orysee, Nevada, she uses her Indian name "Aca" which means "Sunflower". In 1973 she was honored as Miss Indian Nevada.

The new Miss Indian America will travel extensively throughout the United States filling speaking engagements and doing her part to promote better understanding between Indians and non-Indians. She will be representing the more than 200,000 Indians from coast to coast.

Miss Manning will arrive with her chaperone in Houston on Wednesday March 13, and take a tour of East Texas before the special event on Thursday. Fulton Haines, Chief of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe will crown the new Miss Indian America. The public is invited to this rare event.

Tickets up - Woodville City Elections
