Senator Harry Hilda of Arizona has always been noted for forthrightness and candor in discussing major issues. When asked during an interview with editors of U.S. News & World Report whether he favors an income tax on oil companies he replied "no" in his reply. In fact, regulations will not produce one more gallon of gasoline. The only way we are going to have lower priced gasoline is for the oil industry to produce more.

### Longer Life Span In Tyler County

Life expectancy for the average resident of Tyler County has reached an all-time high. A child born today to local parents has excellent prospects of living to the middle of the 21st century, even if there is no further improvement in the span of life.

The expectancy at birth in 1971 was 71.1 years, according to the statistics of the Social Security Administration. This compares with 69.7 years in 1950 and 68.2 in 1940.

Since the turn of the century, it shows, longevity has increased more than 23 years for the average person. Most of the gain was realized in the period between 1900 and 1920, when infant mortality was sharply reduced and communicable and infectious diseases were kept under control.

The widest life span is reflected in the rising proportion of people reaching the retirement age of 65 and beyond.

In Tyler County, some 100,000 men and 1,000,000 women, equivalent to 16.4 percent of the total population, are now in the 65 age group and over. In 1950, the total number of men and women in this age group was 7,000,000.

Many of these are contributing to the nation's active life rather than retiring. Approximately 16.3 percent of the men and 16.4 percent of the women are in the labor force.

The Social Security Administration reports that the average life expectancy at birth for males is 71.1 years and for females 74.1 years.

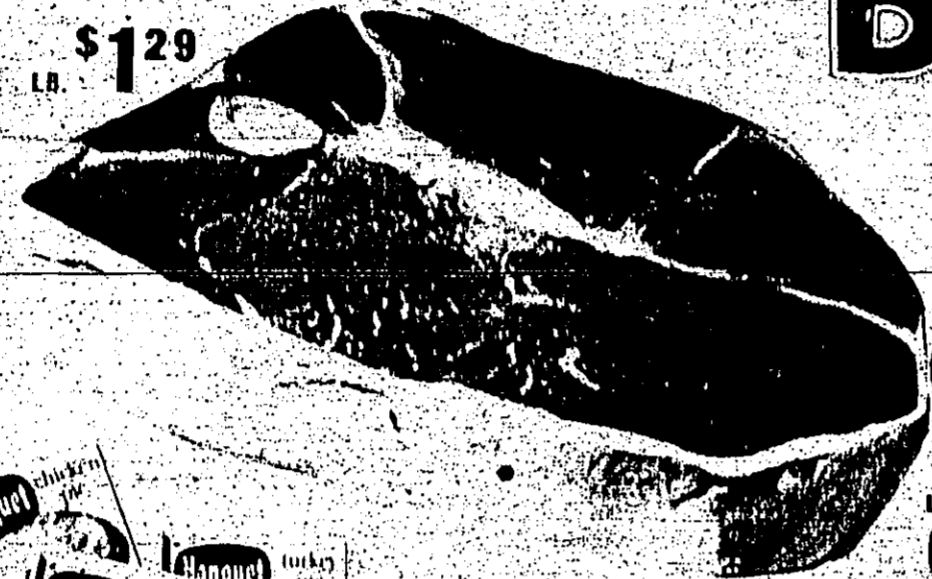
