Shoplifting is on the increase in the United States, and it is not confined to the larger cities. There have been several cases of shoplifting reported in Woodville recently, with the guilty persons being turned over to local law enforcement agencies. What is needed to curb the increase in shoplifting is more severe penalties, such as the state of Nevada has recently enacted. The Nevada law provides that the shoplifter pay all legal fees, as well as civil fines ranging from \$100 upward to \$200 to the merchant who files a complaint. Under the Nevada law, juveniles of minors found guilty of shoplifting must assume payment of all fines and fees. Shoplifting costs consumers hundreds of millions of dollars every year in the United States, because the costs of goods stolen by the shoplifter is passed on to the consumer.

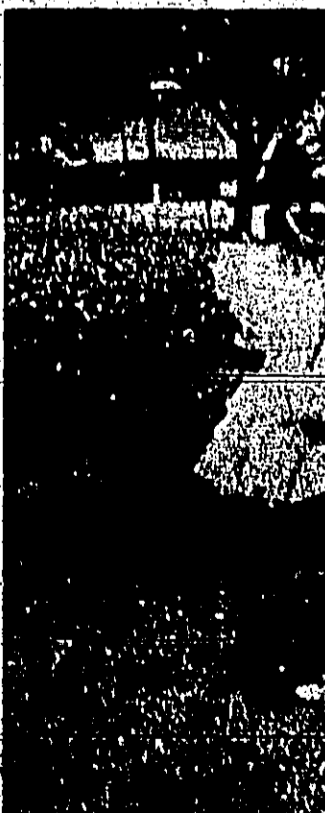
ABSENTEE VOTING

Abbott was last seen leaving against a car talking to an unidentified man shortly before the shooting, according to a witness.

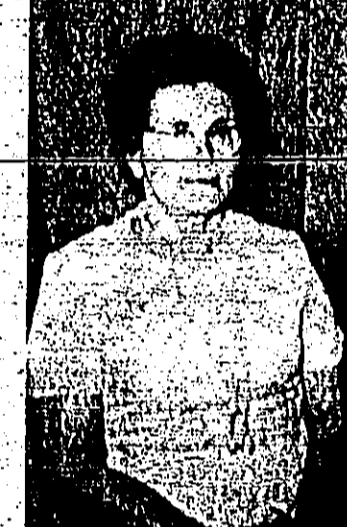

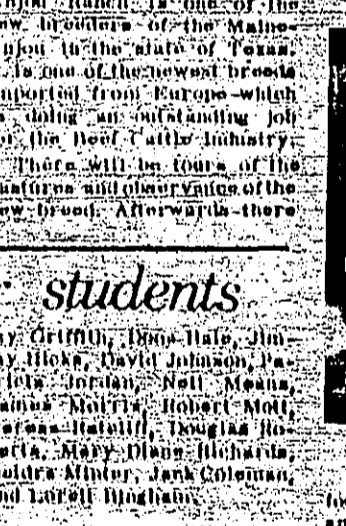

City of Woodville Raises Tax

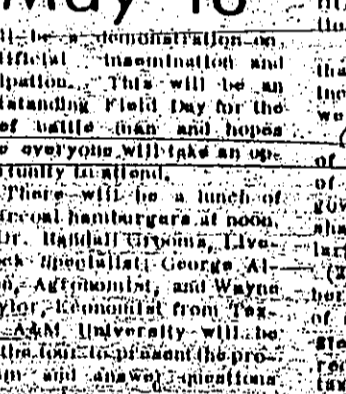
The Woodville City Council voted unanimously May 6th to increase 1974 property taxes. The increase, which will take place immediately, raises the rate of taxation from .007 to .008 per \$100 of appraised property value. Mayor Jerry James noted that this is the first increase in city tax rates since 1969.

James also stated reasons that prompted the council to increase the rate, among them were:

- (1) The fact that the amount of money allotted to the city of Woodville by the federal government's fiscal revenue sharing program was not as large as had been anticipated.
- (2) The increase in the number of persons over 65 years of age who applied for home-ward exemptions, which lowered the amount of collectable tax.
- (3) The increase in the cost of running the city services and salary increases that have been given to some city workers.

James pointed out that many Woodville citizens 65 or over can qualify for increased exemptions, such as: single, widowed, divorced, etc.
