Bureaucrats in Washington are still toying with the idea of a Federal Tax increase on gasoline from 10c to 20c per gallon. ABSENTEE VOTING BEGINS OCTOBER 16

Secretary of State Mark W. White, Jr. today announced that all voters wishing to cast an absentee ballot for the November 6th General Election may do so beginning October 16th. According to Secretary White, the proper absentee voting procedure will depend upon each individual voter's situation. Those persons who expect to be absent from their county of residence on the day of the election may vote by personal appearance during regular office hours at the county clerk's office.

In addition, those persons residing within the county 140 statute 14, state on election day, due to sickness, physical disability, religious belief, or incarceration for less than a felony, can also make application to their county clerk requesting an absentee ballot if he is qualified.

The county official will be involved in the general election and County Judge, District Clerk, County Clerk, County Treasurer, County School Superintendent, County Commissioner, Precinct 2 and 4, Justice of Peace, Precinct 1, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, and Constable of Precinct 2.
