Affordable Housing for Elderly Nears Reality

Adequate housing at affordable prices for many of the nation's older citizens came a step closer to reality recently with the signing of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The bill includes renewal of the popular Section 202 housing program and contains other provisions designed to benefit retired Americans and families with low and moderate incomes.

One of the Association's primary legislative objectives in recent years has been enactment of legislation which would provide better housing for older persons whether they are purchasing or renting.

The new omnibus housing bill encompasses 11 of 12 recommendations approved by the AARP/AAARP Legislative Council at its annual meeting last January. The only Association recommendation not included in the Act (S. 3066) was creation of an office of assistant secretary of housing for the elderly in the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Legislators pointed out that substantial changes had to be made in Section 202, which was phased out in 1969, to overcome growing opposition by some Congressmen. However, it is estimated that 45,000 new housing units can be constructed in the next three years under Section 202 if all funds authorized for the program are used. This would match the total number new housing units built under Section 202 since its inception in 1959, until it was discontinued.

Section 202 makes available low-interest loans to non-profit sponsors for the construction of new housing for the elderly. Formerly, the interest rate was three percent, but the new bill provides for the HUD secretary to borrow up to \$800 million from the Treasury to make direct loans to eligible sponsors at the prevailing government interest rates (currently 8.5 percent) plus a nominal amount to cover administrative costs.

In addition to the \$800 million authorized in the bill, more than \$100 million has accumulated in a revolving fund under the old Section 202 program. This money also will be available for direct loans. All recipients and commitments under the revised 202 program will be excluded from the federal budget where as formerly all appropriations were limited because of the direct budgetary impact.

The bill also stipulates that all housing under the new 202 program will be eligible for assistance under Section 8, a new federal housing plan which guarantees that eligible tenants will not have to pay more than 25 percent of their incomes for rent. Under Section 8, formerly Section 23, HUD leases units from private owners and subsidizes rent down to 15-25 percent of a tenant's income. Although preferences are given to projects with less than 20 percent of the units subsidized, elderly can have the same preference with 100 percent of the units subsidized.
