The United States has spent \$100 billion in aid and credits to the foreign countries since the end of World War II.

According to the Senate Committee on the Budget, that amounts to over 40 percent of the \$247 billion national debt that hangs like a millstone over every American. It is estimated that 1974 will see some \$11 billion more go to the cause of foreign aid.

The problem is that much of the assistance given to other nations shows up in sections of the federal budget other than that designated as foreign aid. As a result, Congress can never consider total appropriations being made and balance expected benefits against total costs. Some of the items that are usually included and appear instead in Defense, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, spending in the Department of Agriculture, State Department, and any number of other places. A final accounting of all foreign aid spending is given to Congress several months after it is too late to do anything about it, and long after many appropriations for the following year have already been considered.

If America is to continue foreign aid, it should be limited to friendly nations. There is no reason to feed and arm our enemies.

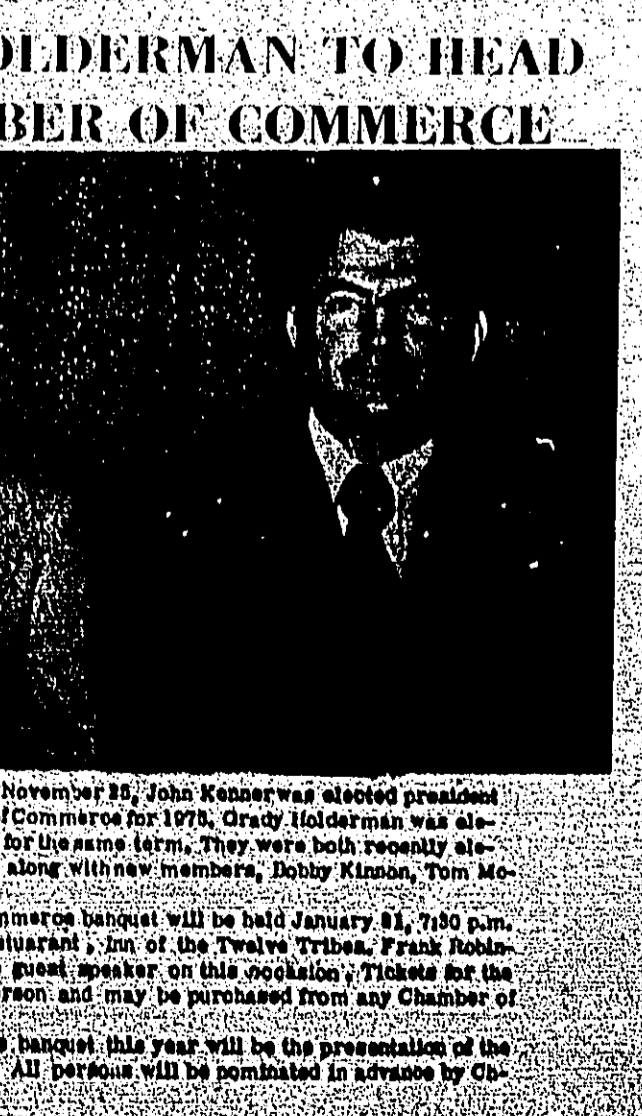
USED BOOK SALE NOW AT LIBRARY

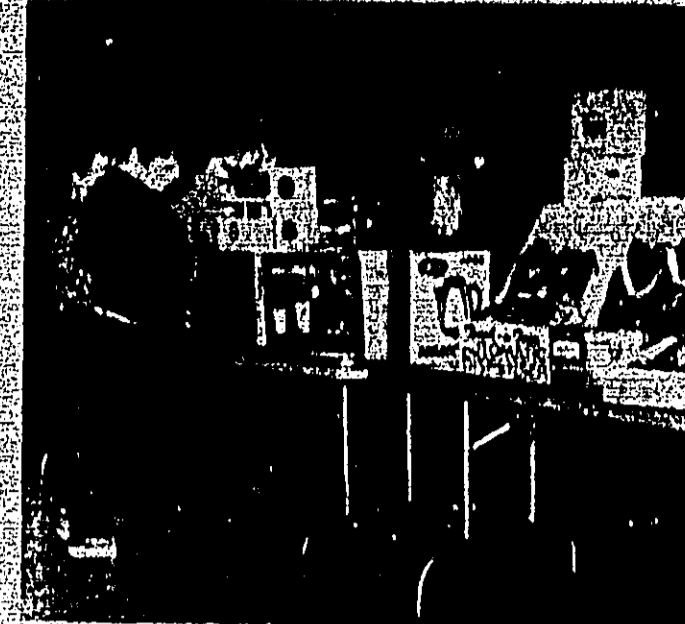

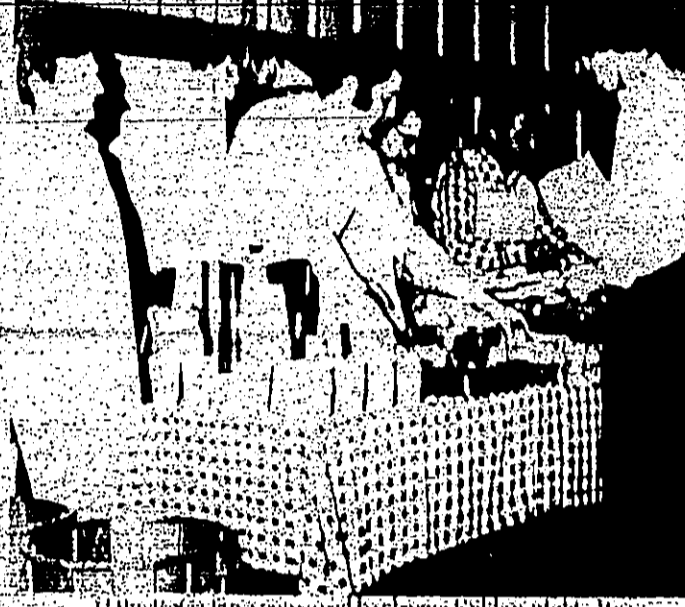

June Term Grand Jury Decisions

Recommendations and report of June Term 1974 Grand Jury.

It was decided to:

- Reestablish the Assistant District Attorney's office in Tyler County. This office shall be such that he does not have to engage in private law practice. This office will assist in every way possible to help law enforcement officers to win evidence in cases.
- It was recommended that the Tyler County Jail be consolidated by:

 - (A) City maintenance department facilities.
 - (B) Prisoners be fed three meals per day.
 - (C) Feeding facility present jail facilities.

- It was also recommended that all law enforcement officers of the County should strive for clean and efficient operation.
- There were 21 True Bill convictions and 22 True Bill acquittals.
- There were 11 True Bill acquittals.

It was recommended that the Tyler County Jail be consolidated by:

- (A) City maintenance department facilities.
- (B) Prisoners be fed three meals per day.
- (C) Feeding facility present jail facilities.

It was also recommended that all law enforcement officers of the County should strive for clean and efficient operation.

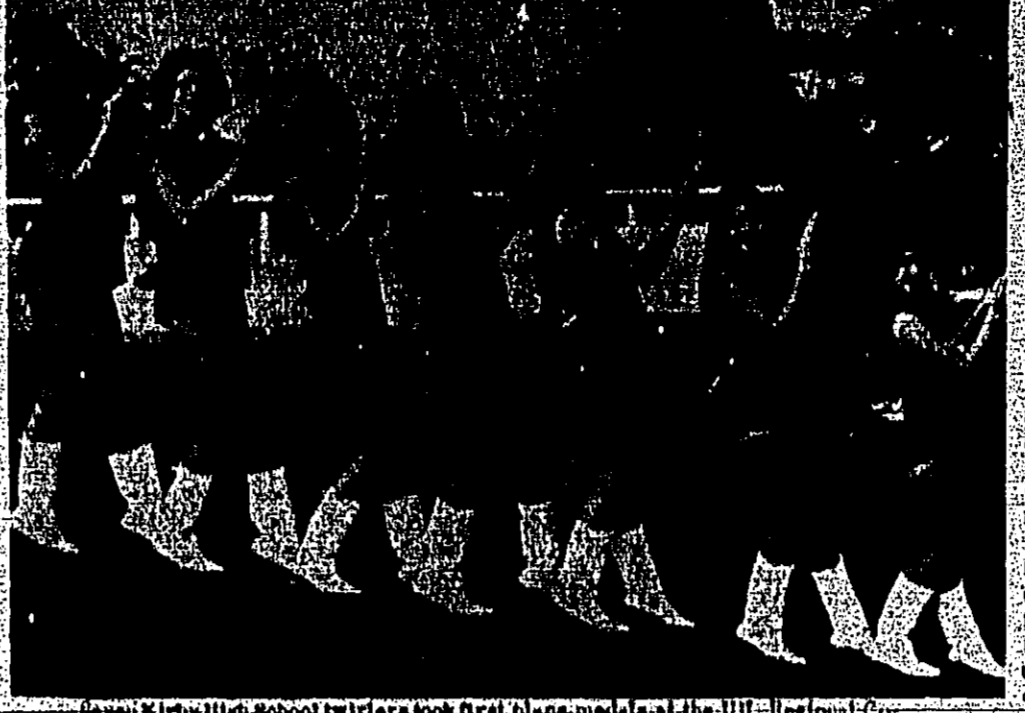

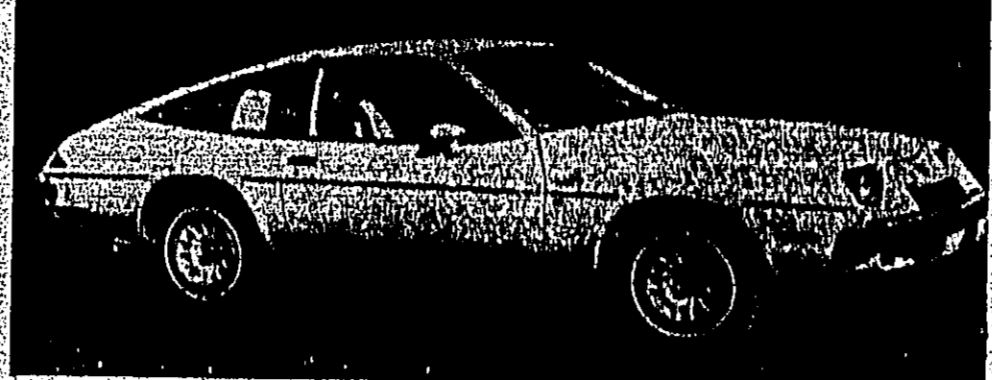

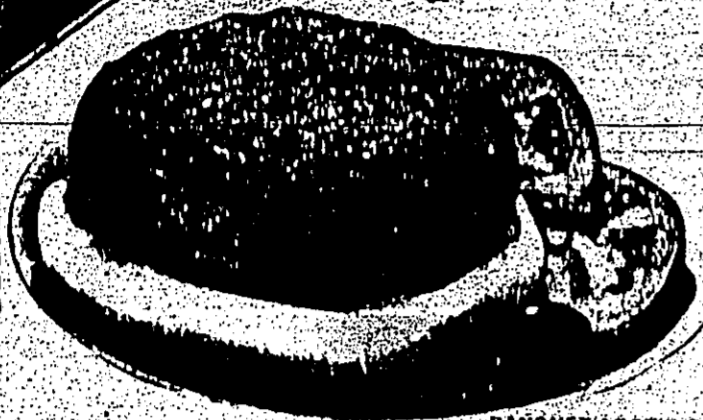
