Who is to blame for excessive government spending? Is it Congress or the administration? President Ford has sent to Congress a plan for an amended fiscal 1975 budget which includes budget cuts. He believes the plan will have an impressive impact on inflation. The budget out amounts to \$4.6 billion. This would bring fiscal 1975 spending to \$200.5 billion, not including an anti-cyclical \$2.7 billion which may be needed for the unemployed. The President's proposed budget would lower the 1975 fiscal year spending to \$200.5 billion. If Congress accepts the President's recommendations, the 1975 budget total of \$200.5 billion at the start of fiscal 1975.

Congress has already made a \$2.8 billion reduction in defense spending. The President recommends an additional \$25 billion cut in defense spending. Spending will be cut \$411 million if Congress will head the President's recommendation to both Health, Education and Welfare Department funding and the original budget report. It seems to me that it would be better to cut some foreign-aid funds rather than cut defense funds.

Jail Criticized By State Inspectors

Two State Inspectors were in Woodville Tuesday, December 10, to inspect the County Jail. They reported the jail in "bad condition" and following their return to Austin they will file a report of their findings and recommendations. During their tour of the jail facilities, accompanied by Sheriff Lewis Craven, they told him this jail is beyond repair. Craven has been aware of the existing inadequacy of the jail for a long time and has spoken to the courts regarding improvement.

Craven said that the present plumbing and sanitation facilities are very inadequate. "The only place the prisoners have to wash their hands is in the shower," said Craven. Other problems with the jail facilities is the entrance to the jail in a public corridor where the prisoners are in full view to any bystanders. He said the stairways were very steep and narrow.

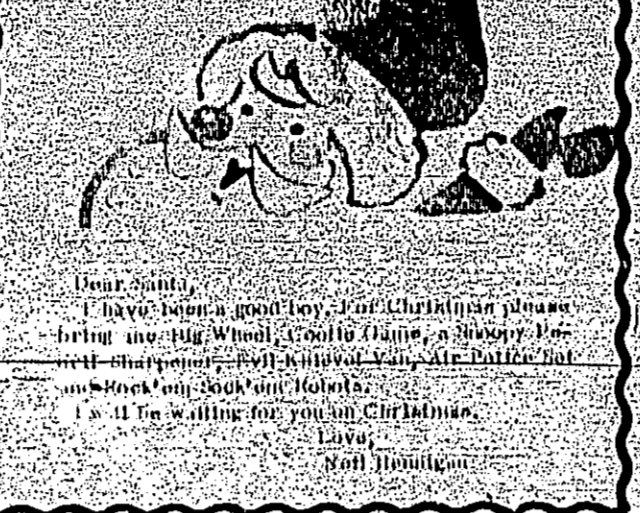

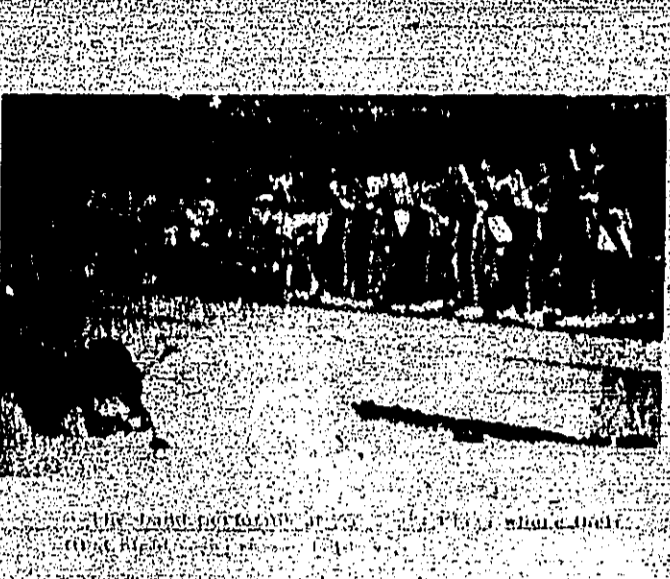

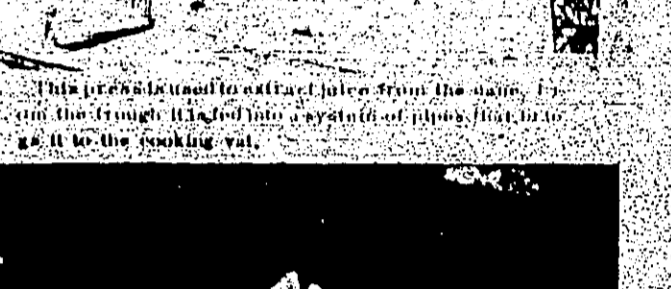
