**DETRMHMRS Receives Three Grant Requests**  
The Deep East Texas Regional Mental Health Mental Retardation Services (DETRMHMRS) has recently received approval of three grant requests. The agency, which provides community based mental health and mental retardation services for the citizens of the 13-county region, received a total of \$33,000 in grant funds from three separate agencies. A total of \$14,000 was received from the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare to finance the operation of the Stoughton County Workshop and Opportunity Center. This grant will provide funds to employ and train more mentally retarded clients, as well as improve the quality of care being provided.

### Neches River Navigable From Town Bluff To Gulf

Based on historical data submitted in a navigability report prepared by the Port of the Neches District, the Chief of Engineers has recently issued a determination of navigability for the Neches and Angelina Rivers. It was determined that the stretch of Neches River from the mouth of the Angelina River to the mouth of the Neches River is a navigable water of the United States for the purpose of exercising regulatory jurisdiction by the Corps of Engineers. The new price schedule for weekly lunch tickets is as follows: Students in grades K-4, 40¢ per day; Students in grades 5-12, 60¢ per day; All school personnel, 80¢ per day; All other meals, \$1.00 per day. There is an additional charge of 50¢ when a student buys a lunch ticket for one day rather than the usual weekly ticket. The school would also like to remind parents that when family financial circumstances change, application for free or reduced price lunches may be made at any time during the school year.

**Christmas In Saint Louis**

**Homemaking Hints**  
BY BELINDA COVINGTON

The poinsettia, the favorite Christmas plant, will remain colorful and attractive throughout the holiday season with proper care.

Poinsettias do best when placed in a sunny location and protected from sudden temperature changes due to drafts, heat, vents, or opening doors at night. Temperatures should not drop below 50 degrees. Sudden drops in temperature will result in leaf loss.

About three weeks after the plant has been received, fertilize it with a complete fertilizer, such as those recommended for African violets and other house plants. Fertilize the fertilizer in water as recommended on the container. Then water the plant thoroughly. The soil should be allowed to become as dry as a bone before watering. The soil, however, should not be saturated with water.

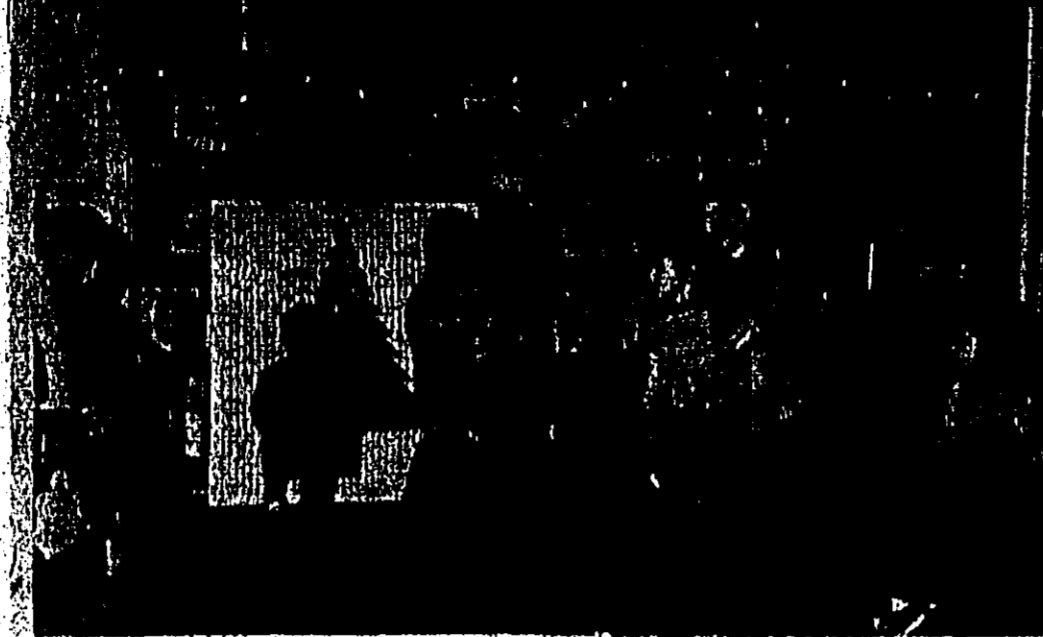
