Tyler County Elderly Given Tax Exemption

License Plate Sales To Begin On February 1

Chamber Of Commerce

Outstanding Citizen Award For 1975 Will Be Given Judge Mann

County Judge Tom Dick Mann was recently selected as the recipient of the first annual Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Citizen Award. Members from Tyler County civic clubs attended a meeting for the purpose of selecting a recipient.

Tyler County Chamber of Commerce directors felt many county wide improvements have been accomplished this year and the presentation of this award enable individuals to be recognized each year. This is the first time such an award has been given.

Representatives from all clubs presented their candidates and these were voted upon by the assembly. The award will be presented annually at the Chamber of Commerce banquet.

The 1974 banquet will be held Friday, January 31 at the Inn of the 12 Clans Restaurant at the Indian Village. The guest speaker for the occasion will be former resident, Frank Robinson.

Judge Mann will be given his award at the banquet. He was selected for this honor because of the many improvements he has worked toward for the elderly and youth of this country.

Judge Mann said this award was a "very pleasant surprise. I had never dreamed it would be given to me, it was completely unexpected." He also said, "I may not be worthy of it but I have done the best I could. If I am not presently worthy of this honor, I hope I will be in the future."

This year he has seen the inauguration of the mini bus program in this county. With money available from a state grant they have purchased the bus and set up pick-up stations throughout the county. The bus serves all of Tyler County during the week and is available for emergencies at all times. For those unable to go to the pick-up station they may call and ask for the bus to come to their home. An assistant rides with the bus to help those that might need help getting on or off the bus.

For the four years I have been in this office, I have tried to use available grant money for the employment of youths. We have had as many as 30 working for us at one time." These have worked after school, during their summer vacation; the county has hired as many as possible with the money they had. These youths have worked with the maintenance of the Little League ball park, with sanitation, the commissioners on road work; they have also done custodial work at the courthouse, and worked at the Alvin Library.

Through the Commissioners' Court they were able to give

over \$20,000 toward the building of the Little League ballpark which serves as a place of recreation for more than 600 children each year.

The Commissioners' Court

also made it possible to give

\$5,000 annually to the 4-H Club

in Tyler County. This club,

which is enjoyed by many

Tyler County youths, has recently built a new show barn

and 4-H arena.

Sales Tax Bonding Regulations Eased

Austin—Comptroller Bob Bullock issued regulations Monday to ease sales tax bonding requirements on existing businesses which change their technical legal status.

The Comptroller's office said:

"Under the new regulations, the Comptroller will take into account a business' tax payment record in deciding bond requirements in such situations as when a partnership becomes a corporation, a partnership or two businesses merge."

Bullock said the new regulations will be retroactive to Jan. 1, 1974, the date the new bonding law went into effect.



USDA Announces Change In Food Stamp Rule

A student who receives more than half of his support from his household which is eligible for food stamps may be eligible for food stamps under amended regulations announced today. The regulation is designed to eliminate the regulation of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

The change applies to any student, age 18 or over, who resides beyond high school and is claimed as a tax dependent by an ineligible household (i.e., a roomer, boarder, or person from a household where he does not reside). It applies only to the student who is claimed as a tax dependent by one or more members of the student's household who receive food stamps if they are eligible. The student has the opportunity to prove that he does not receive over half of his support from an ineligible house-

hold.

The regulation is in line with a provision of the Agriculture Appropriations Act of 1975, passed December 31, 1974, which required the USDA to make the change.

The "Foundations" are a group of amateur dramatics groups, mostly amateur, organized primarily for outdoor theatrical production.

The "Foundations" from Springfield, Missouri, was founded by Abbie Hobson, a former Attorney General's opinion. Under the funding law the Comptroller determines which foundations are eligible to be posted by new businesses or businesses with delinquency records.

USDA Will Issue New Food Stamp Series

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will replace the current \$0, \$1, \$2 and \$5 food stamp series with \$0, \$1, \$2, \$5 and \$10 series on March 1, 1975.

USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) said that the larger food stamp series are needed to meet increased food stamp demands, particularly in rural areas.
