Girls from area schools in the pageant include Warren Colmesnell, Chester and Woodville. Several of the competitors have completed their public school education and are now working or attending college.

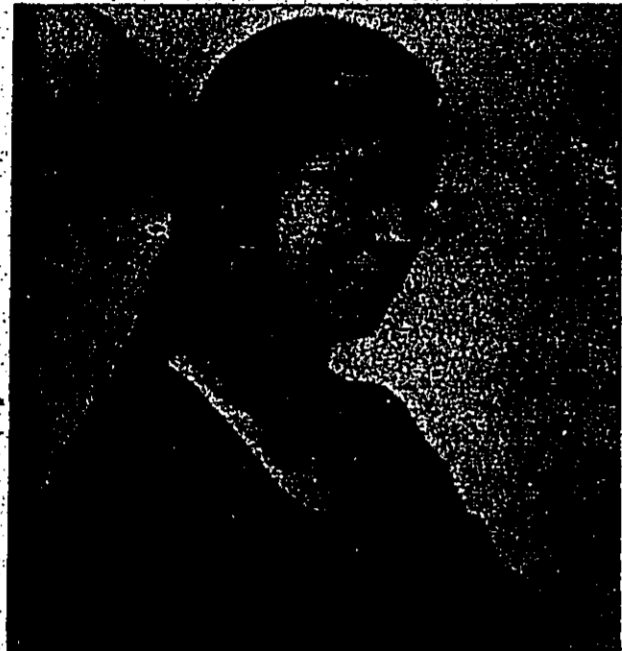
Chairman of the stage decoration committee is Ruth Stanford. Working with her are Gloria Smith, Judy Thornton and Linda Allen.

Qualified out-of-town judges will attend the pageant to select the girl who will be the new Miss Tyler County.



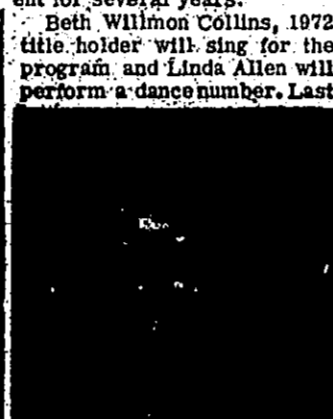
Jere Lynn Smith

Cynthia Antoinette Mitton

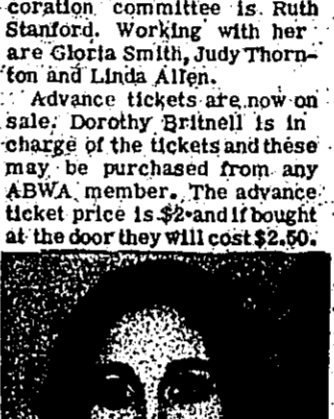

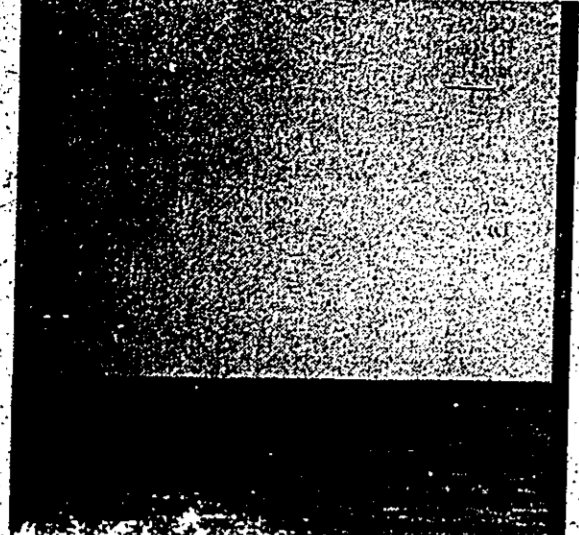

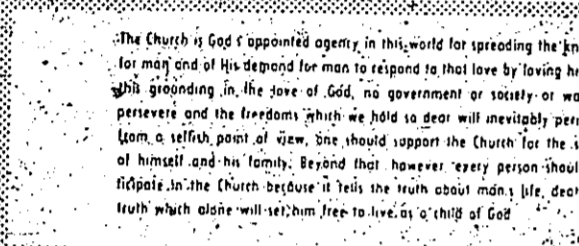
