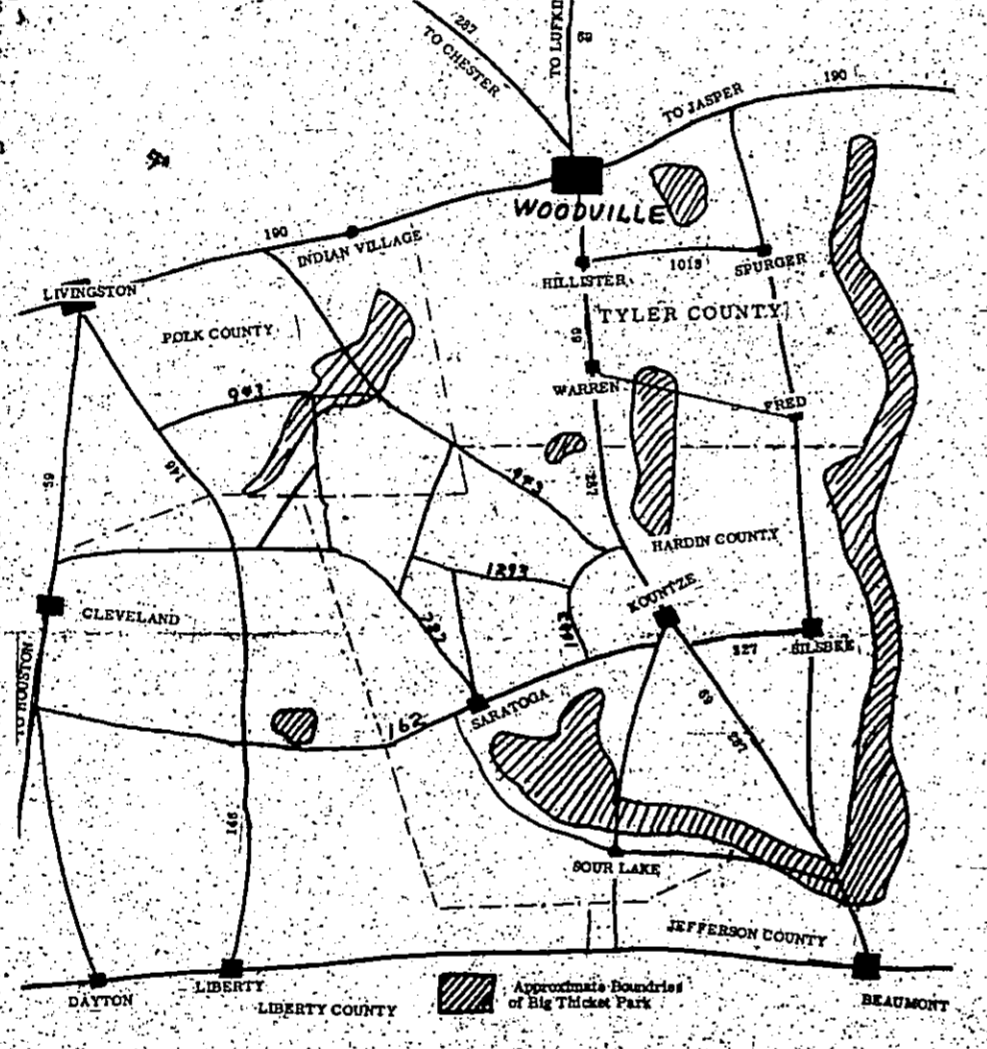
Woodville Asks To Headquarter Big Thicket Biological Preserve

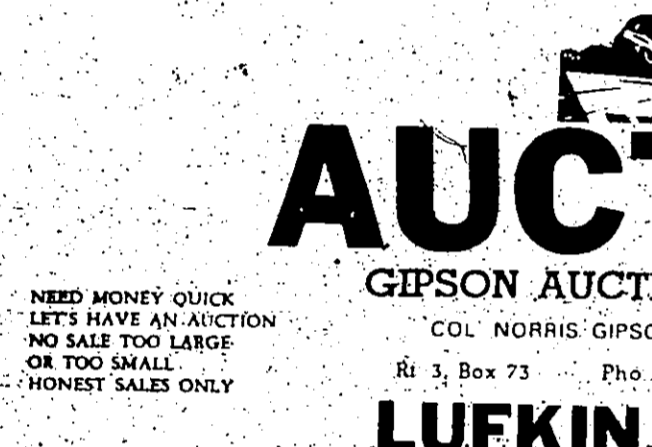

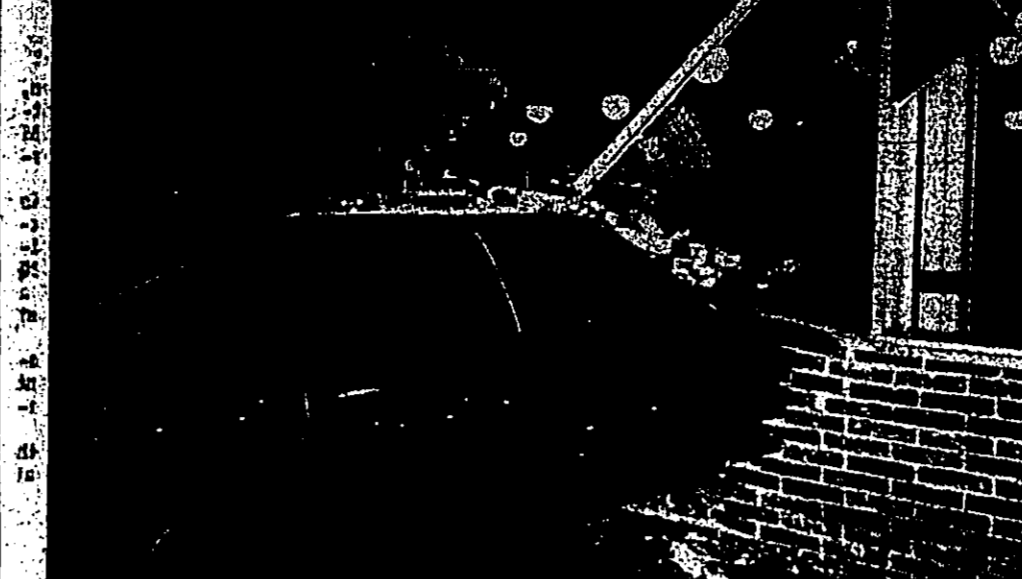

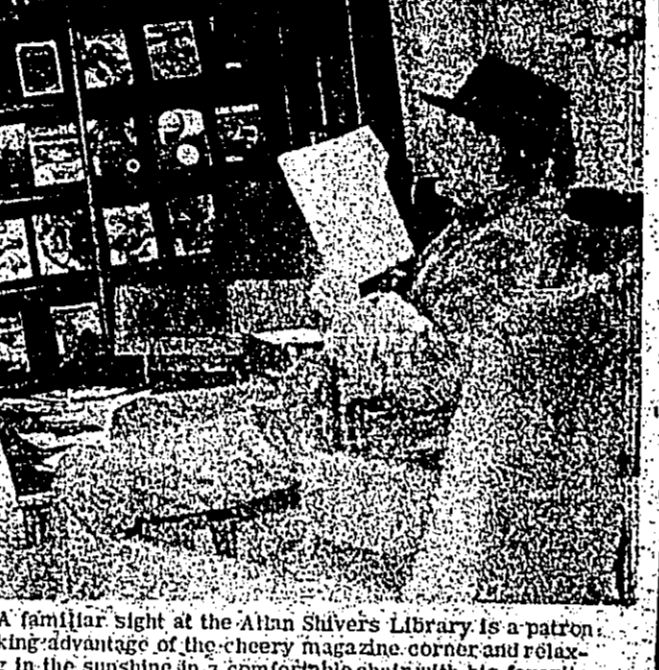
