Sharp Renders Mauritius Island Disaster Relief

Navy Airman Apprentice Marine, Lillian M. Sharpe, of Star Route 1, Woodville, is helping provide disaster relief to the people of Mauritius, an island in the Indian Ocean.

He is a crewmember aboard the nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, the *Kitty Hawk*, which was diverted from a routine cruise and dispatched to render aid after a severe cyclone struck the island.

Upon returning the cruise ship is scheduled to visit Singapore.

Here are some tips to help keep your pressure canner in good working condition:

* Take off removable petals and safety valves and wash them thoroughly after each use.

* Wash the parts in vinegar to remove any corrosion.

* Never add cold water to a pressure canner when it suddenly cooling that might cause it to warp or crack.

* Store a clean, dry canner inside to absorb moisture and odors.

* Wrap cover in paper and invert it on top of canner.

* Wash the pressure gauge after each use. Do not immerse lid in water. Do not use harsh scouring powders.

* To remove odors and stains, use one of the following mixtures and process at normal pressure for 5 minutes:

1. Juice of 1 lemon and 2 quarts of water.

2. Two tablespoons of vinegar and 2 quarts of water.

3. Handful of Irish potato peelings and 2 quarts of water.

DETCOG Has Executive Committee Meeting

The appointment of a Regional Executive Committee, the Regional Community Development Block Grants and a Manpower report were among the items discussed during the first meeting of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments held in Crockett on February 27.

The meeting began at 8 p.m. at the Crockett Public Library. Crockett Mayor J. E. Williams presided. The meeting was conducted on behalf of DETCOG President Billy J. Earley who was installed as chairman of the Garfield mayor of Odessa.

Four members of DETCOG's Executive Committee were present. The Budget Committee and will meet again in April to draw up the financial plan for DETCOG for FY 1976. They are Tyler County Judge Ted D. Young and Magistrate C.W.L. Neal; DETCOG President Billy Earley, Naegleches attorney, who will serve as chairman of the Appraisal Committee; Mrs. Sabine River Authority.

David Whisman, Director of planning for DETCOG, reported that some 20 pre-applications from the DETCOG area had been submitted to the Executive Committee meeting. The Committee honored Lufkin Police Commissioner George Gandy, who is retiring after 35 years in the law enforcement field. Mrs. Lucille G. Plane, who has been in the office of the Probation Officer for the Deep East Texas Regional Probation Department. Mrs. Plane will soon be taking a position with the Texas Department of Corrections.

The next Executive Committee meeting will be held in Crockett on March 27.
