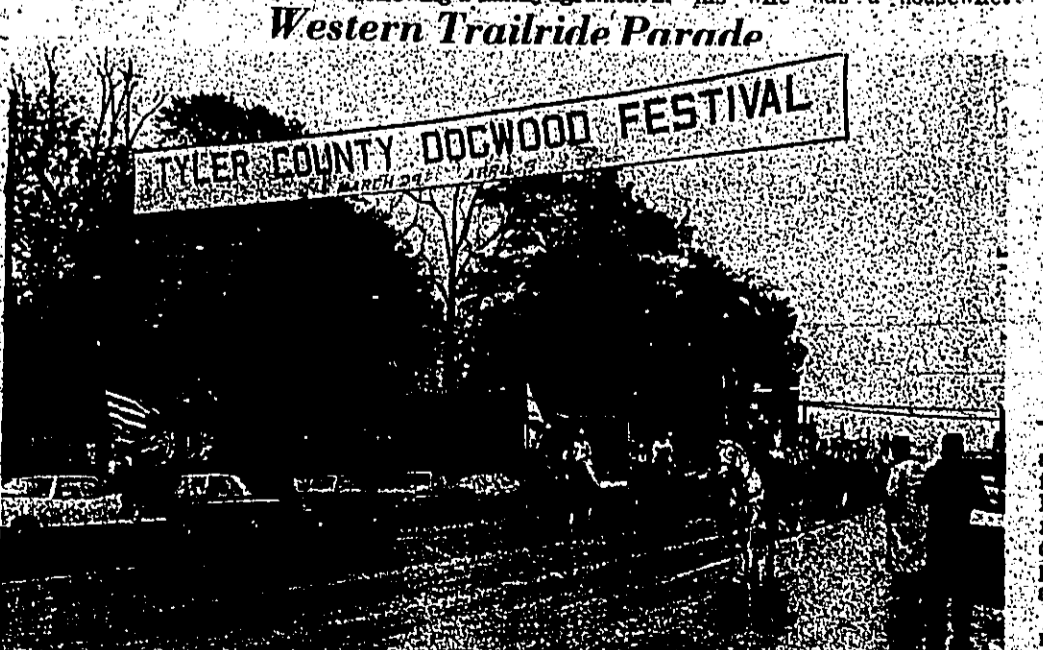


Belinda Currie Reigning Dogwood Queen

Warren Resident Is Charged With Murder

Sheriff Lewis Craven reported Jessie Williams, 31, was charged with murder before Justice of the Peace E.A. Sturrock, Pct. 1, following the alleged shooting death of her husband, Judd Williams, 37, Saturday night, March 29. The subject is suspected of having shot her husband in the neck with a .40 shot gun following a family argument in their home in Warren. The death occurred between 9:30-10 p.m. and a warrant for the arrest of Jessie Williams was issued Sunday morning at 1:05 a.m. She was released on \$7,500 bond. Judd Williams was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Sturrock. Williams had been employed as a welder and his wife was a housewife.

City and School Board Elections On Saturday

On Saturday, April 5 many voters will go to the polls to cast their votes for their school board of trustees members or city councilmen. In Woodville, voters will cast their votes for four who have filed for the position of Woodville City Councilman, running for vacant or expiring terms, to serve two years terms are J.G. Anderson, Webb Ashworth and Dr. James J. Jettie. Terry Watts has announced or one year unexpired alderman term.

Balloting will be held at the Freeman's Hall in Woodville from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. There are two School Board positions open at Warren. Incumbent Harold T. Davis and B.J. Hutto have filed for position IV and for Position V, incumbent Herman Elliott and Marvin R. Fain have run.

Election Judges for the three boxes will be Bobby Jenkins, Fred Viola Fowler, Village Mills and Hazel Gardner, Warren. There are two running for the position of County School Board member, L.P. Hicks for Precinct 4 and H.O. Semans for Precinct 2. Schools having schools within or partially within voting precinct #4 are Warren which will vote at Fred, Boxes 15 and 16; Woodville, Fairview voting Box 13 and all Spurger will vote in the precinct #4 election, Box 14. Voting in the precinct #2 election will be Chester, Box 7 only; Colmesnell, voting

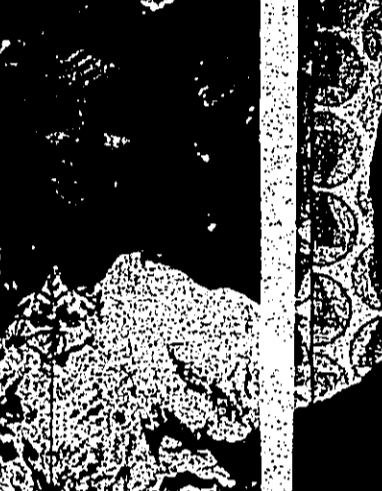

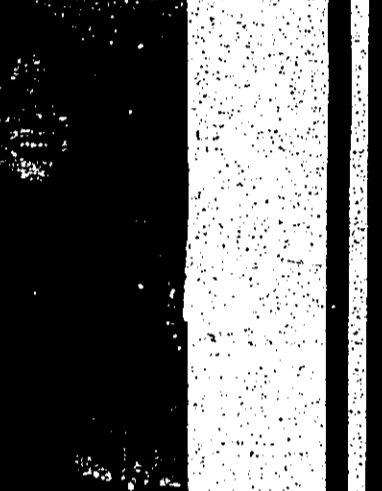

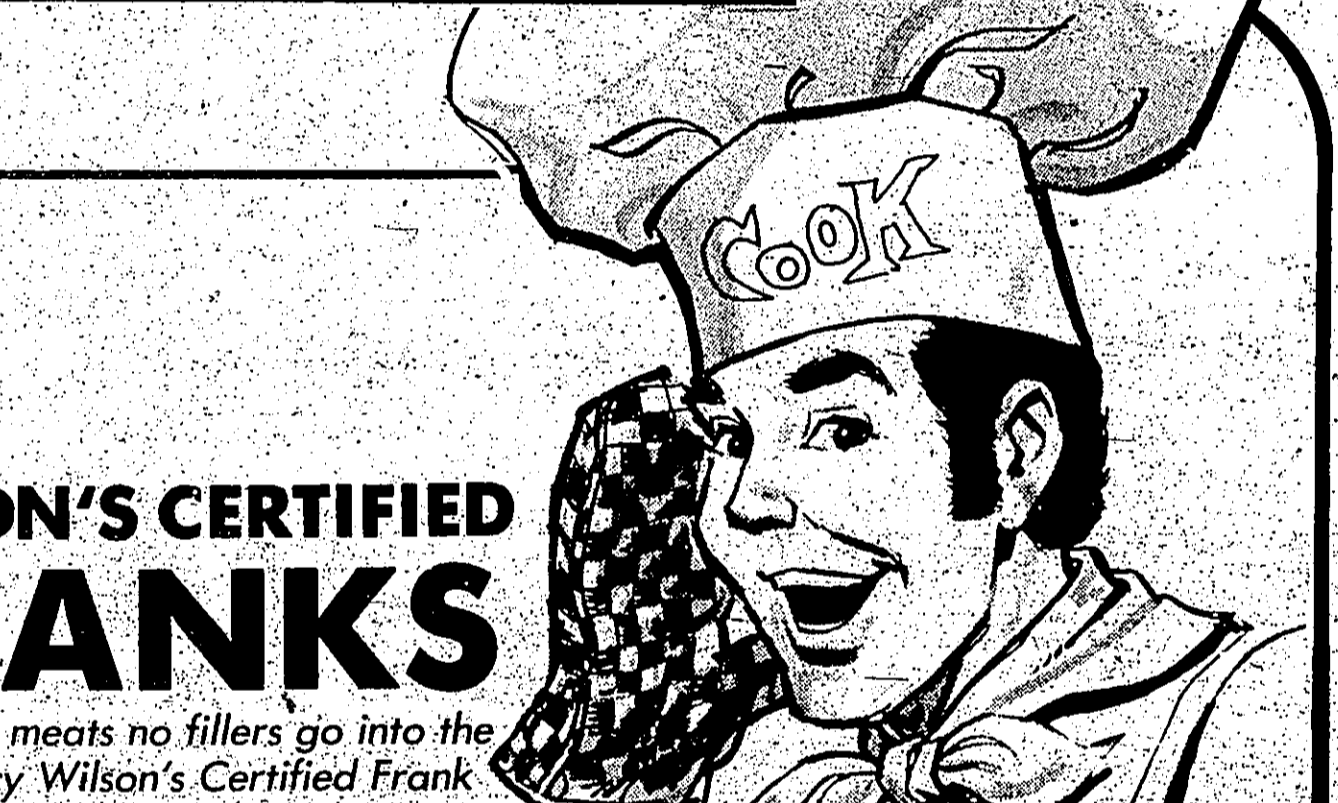
