State Comptroller Bob Bullock says that a record state tax bill—ranging from \$320 million to more than \$2 billion appears unavoidable for 1977 if lawmakers continue the current spending trend. House speaker Bill Clayton urged his appropriations advisors to cut spending recommendations below Legislative Budget Board recommendations.

"It's not a question of if or when. It's a question of how much we pay the fiddler," Bullock said.

The state comptroller believes "The fat is in the fire and there's no pulling it out." And because our constitution requires it, \$9.3 billion of the \$13.2 billion expected to pass through the state treasury will go for education, highways, welfare, children's assistance and federal programs.

Bullock believes there is an outside chance of avoiding a major tax bill in 1977 if the current legislature sets aside a \$400 million reserve fund and the 1977 legislature adopts a hold-the-line budget.

A letter to our state Senator and Representative might help to keep the budget down and head off a tax increase.

## Most Candidates Return To Their Former Position

There was a total of 69 votes cast in the Woodville City Councilman election. Elected to vacant or unexpired terms for two year terms were J.G. Anderson by 67 votes, Webb Ashworth, 63 votes and Dr. James Jimette, 64 votes.

Terry Watts, running for councilman, one year, unexpired term, was elected by 61 votes. There were three write-in votes cast.

Warrin School Board Trustees incumbents, Harold T. Davis and Herman Elliott were returned to their positions in the Saturday, April 5 election. Davis won his place in Position IV with 396 votes; his opponent, B.I. Hutto received 256 votes. In position V, Elliott got 347 votes to 301 cast for his opponent Marvin R. Fannin. ## Preliminary Big Thicket Meeting Held

At an informal preliminary meeting National Park service personnel and town and county officials concerning the Big Thicket National Preserve Thursday, April 3 in the Commissioners Courtroom.

Area manager Tom Lubbert of Beaumont, said this was the first time they had created a preserve in such a scattered situation. He said eventually the preserve would involve between 2 and 3 thousand acres in a land block. Land purchasing may begin as early as the beginning of next year and continue for six years.

Accompanying Lubbert were Paul Kalkwarf, planner for the NPS and Joel Kusman, biologist from Denver. They are visiting all counties involved in the Big Thicket Preserve on a day-to-day basis trying to make the best use of the land for the park.

The main purpose of the meeting is to determine what kind of management plan will be used for the park. Lubbert said the park will be run by the U.S. Government and the public will be invited to participate in the planning process.

## Homemaking Hints

Sweetness-The Choice Is Yours

By Belinda Covington

Recently, consumers have been faced with the fluctuating cost of sugar and are looking for alternative sweeteners.

The common sweetening alternatives include brown sugar, corn syrup, molasses or sorghum. These alternatives are more expensive than sugar and consumers will need to check local prices to determine the best price.

A new publication, MP-176, "Sweetness-The Choice Is Yours," helps consumers determine which sweetener prevents the growth and development of mold and bacteria. Many micro-organisms are killed by freezing sugar but not sweeteners. For more information on Home Freezing, write or call the extension office in Woodville for Bulletin #176.

FREEZING FOOD AT HOME

A meal on a moment's notice can be a welcome treat after a long day at work. Freezing food at home is one of the simplest, most popular ways of preserving foods at home. It retains the natural color, flavor, texture and value of fresh fruits, vegetables, meats and baked goods.

The quality of the food frozen can vary with freshness of raw materials used.

The quality of the food can vary with freshness of produce, used methods of preparation, packaging and storage. Proper freezing techniques are essential to good-quality products. Fruits and vegetables should be frozen for table use.

Frozen meat, fish, fish eggs and eggs also freeze well. Handling the food promptly after purchase can cause undesirable taste and appearance. The selection of containers depends on the type of food and personal preference.

But all materials should be moisture-vapor proof to prevent evaporation and retain moisture and quality until frozen.

Glass, metal, rigid plastic and some paper containers are recommended because they are moisture-vapor proof or at least moisture-vapor resistant. Use ordinary waxed papers, household aluminum foil and coddle cheese or ice cream cartons.

Glass and metal plastic containers should be washed and dried before freezing. Soak the containers in warm water for 10 minutes, then dry them with a clean cloth.

Give special care to foods which may become rancid, a result of natural fats and oils. Foods containing protein, dried beans and nuts, milk and milk products, soya flour and cereals also contain protein.

Scenes typical of life in this decade were performed at the front of a hardware store front which was filled with clothing and hardware. A garter was used for the girls to keep the gimples from getting into their stockings.

The first of seven scenes consisted of placard bearing children's names, names and ages, and a first scene on prohibition. Several makers of moonshine with their primitive stills were shown with a process of making moonshine which still would have to be concealed before more "earthen squeezes" could be made, as this one blew up.

After the moonshiners showed the coming of the automobile, its effect on society and the new morality which accompanied it, the final scene was transportation and life-style. A girl and boy picnicking was shown with a car.

The Tyler County Woman's Club float was formed around the 1920's and a stereotypical scene from one of their installation meetings was shown. The scene depicted the glamour, liberal use of cosmetics and freedom for women, was the reenactment of a beauty pageant, a selected group of young women in bathing suit clad beauties to bear the title of Miss Tylerian Creek.

The High School float, built in the 1920's, was shown at the time of its dedication with a float from the post laureate of Tyler County, Mrs. Trebilcot.

Although the lights of the town were turned off at 10 each night, one of the popular entertainments of this time was dancing. Several local bands such as Rudolph Valentine, Pola Negri, Clark Bow, Douglas Fairbanks, Mary Pickford, Charlie Chaplin and Al Jolson were featured in this vugle.

Local promoters came to the area and brought with them free parades for only a few dollars down, the first of the installment plan being arrangements. The last scene of the pageant was a man, his motor, his girlfriend and the accompanying troop of Charleston dancing girls, bringing back memories to the citizens of Tyler County.

Depression era changes followed these, days of the 20's; the end of the era of moonshiners, the beginning of the Great Depression.

The festival ended with a fireworks display given by the Woodville Fire Department.

The operating directors of the 1975 Tyler County Dogwood Festival are Fred and Caroline Williams, Mr. Tommy McClure, Grady Holzman, Mrs. Howard Carter, George Jarrett, Terry Watts, Jim Gandy and Ben Worthy.
