## Ready For Lions Club Rodeo

## Rodeo Arena Improvements Are Nearing Completion

A flurry of activity at the Tyler County 4-H-FFA arena has attracted the interested and the curious. This activity centers around the extensive improvements made at the arena site across from the airport in Woodville.

The arena has recently been extremely fortunate in receiving sizable contributions of much needed materials. Sun Oil Company has donated a considerable amount of steel pipe and Weaver-Chesser of Chesser-Sutton Co. made a gift of galvanized steel. These contributions sparked the beginning of construction of new bleachers under the cover of the show barn on the east side of the arena, which when completed will seat some 1,500 people and includes, for the first time, a number of box seats. In addition to these two large contributions, funds on hand and revenue sharing money enabled the leaders of the 4-H-FFA to purchase the necessary fabricated steel support beams and lumber for the stands.

The race against the dead-line for the 1975 Tyler County Lions Rodeo, scheduled for July 25th and 26th, is keeping volunteer workers busy and members of the five Tyler County Lions Clubs are working night and day to hasten the completion.

In addition to the new covered bleachers, the arena is adding new bleachers, building pens, fences and gates. Long range plans include constructing similar bleachers on the east side of the arena with the grandstand cover and eventually completing the horse-shoe design with open bleachers at the south end.

Clinton Currie who heads the operation, announced that it is hoped that by 1976 all of the grandstands will be marked for reserve seats which will enable all events at the City Hall.






