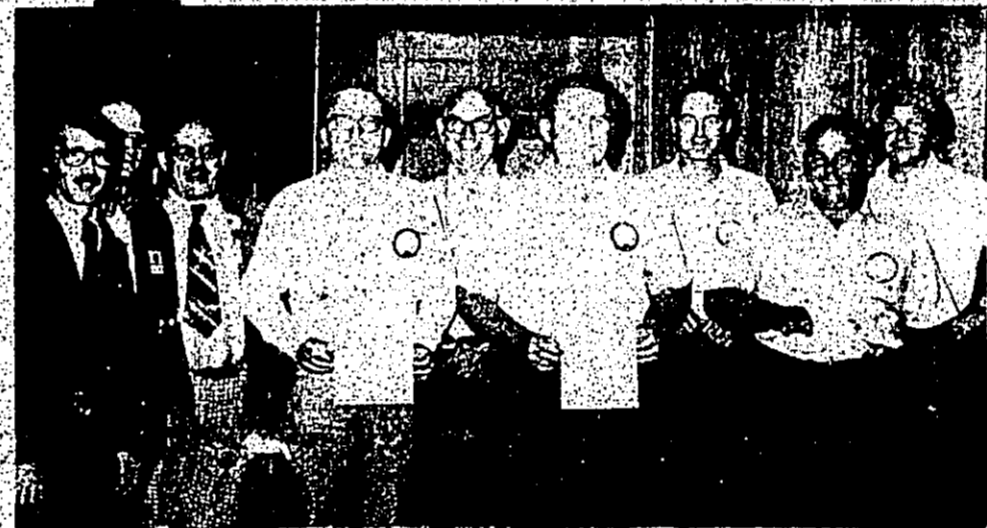
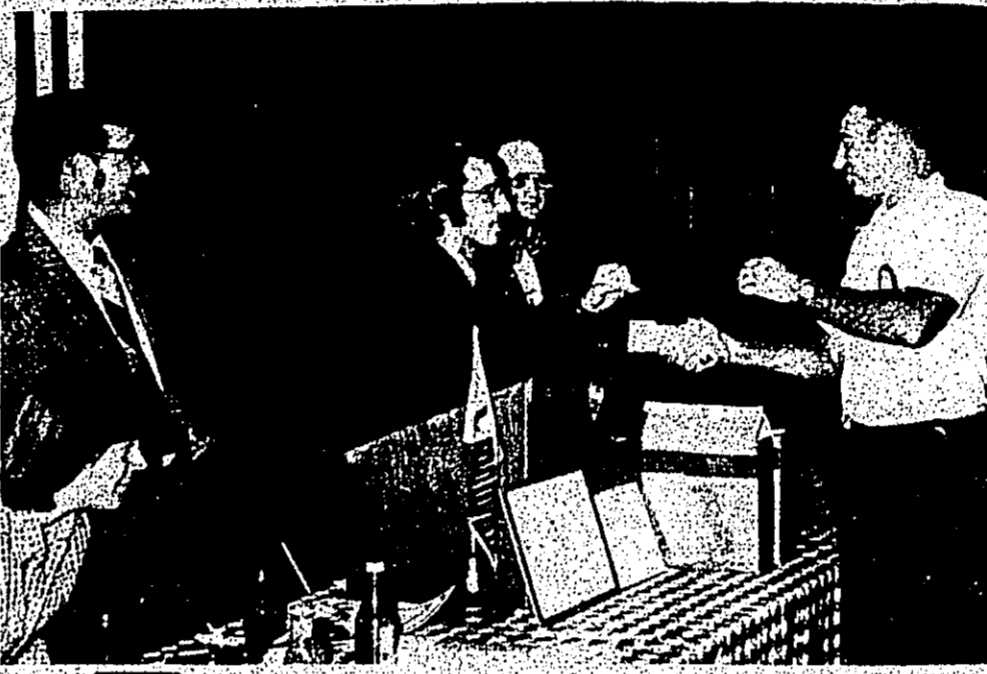
Adams Honored By Association

The Vocational Homemaking Teachers Association of Texas recently honored Senator Don Adams of Jasper with the organization's Distinguished Service Award for his outstanding support of Vocational Homemaking Education.

Being vitally interested in any legislation affecting the children and youth of Texas, VHTAT sought the support of Senator Adams in opposing legislation creating a super ultimate control over all programs in the State for children and youth, thus adding yet another bureaucratic layer to the delivery of services to children and their families. Senator Adams efforts successfully kept the bill from being debated on the Senate floor during the last eight weeks of the legislative session. In addition, Senator Adams

sponsored and passed legislation amending the definition of school year to allow members of the Teacher Retirement System who have 11 and 12 month contracts to use their "contract year" in determining their final average salary at retirement. This amendment will aide thousands of educators in the state, including vocational homemaking teachers.

Senator Adams was presented the VHTAT's top legislative award for his continuing support of education and legislation concerning children and their families. The Vocational Homemaking Teachers Association of Texas, representing the more than 2900 teachers of Vocational Homemaking Education in Texas, is the only organization of its kind in the nation and is the recognized spokesman for home economics education.

Mike Parker Succumbs In Hunt Trip Wreck

A northern New Mexico hunting expedition near the town of Lumberton claimed the life of Michael W. Parker, 25, of 206 W. Wheat, late Friday, as a four-wheel vehicle overturned killing Parker and throwing another lone passenger clear.

According to police accounts, John Smitley, a passenger in the vehicle and who was apparently asleep at the time of the accident, was thrown onto a sandy bank and was later picked up in a dazed condition by highway patrolmen.

The two were apparently enroute to investigate a possible cabin for future vacation use.

Smitley was treated and released from an Esplanade, N.M. hospital.

The two men had just left a camphouse which housed Parker's younger brother Lance, who had accompanied the group on the elk hunting trip.

Parker was a member of the Woodville Lions Club and the Tyler County Rescue Unit.

He was assistant manager of the Southeast Texas Savings and Loan Association, where he had been employed for two years.

Parker was born in Oakdale, La. He was a graduate of Kirby High School in Woodville and attended Baylor University and Tyler Junior College.

Funeral services for Parker were held Tuesday at 11 a.m. at the First Baptist Church, where his father, Dr. Raymond Parker is pastor and who ministered the service.

Burial was in the Camp Ground Cemetery.

Fallbearers included David

Collier, Butch Studdahl, Phil Tucker, Raymond Minyard, Skippy Weeks, and Odis Ray Fortenberry.

Survivors include his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Raymond Parker; one son, Tod Parker; one sister, Debbie Parker; one brother, Lance Parker; and grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. S.L. Reynolds of Pineville, La., and Mr. and Mrs. E.K. Parker of Oakdale, La.

The Parker family has requested that memorial contributions be designated for the Woodville First Baptist Church Foreign Missions Fund.

COG Offering New Service

Non-profit agencies and governmental entities, such as cities, counties or school districts, could benefit from a program offered through the Deep East Council of Governments.

The program is known as the Human Services Delivery System (HSDS) and the HSDS Inter-Agency Council is accepting proposals from area agencies and entities for small amounts of funds. These proposals are being taken during the month of October.

Eight such projects were funded last fiscal year, and included programs for the Livingston and Shepherd ISD's and the City of Jasper.

The projects requesting funds must be for a service not currently available in the agency's or entity's area and the projects must also have the approval of appropriate local officials, such as the county government, city council or board of directors for the particular agency.

Council, made up of social service or helping agencies throughout the area will be voting on the proposals November 24. Approximate starting date for the projects chosen and funded is January, 1976.

Craft Fair Will Offer The Moon

The Tyler County Big Thicket Craft Fair will have something for everyone -- crafts, entertainment, food and even the Moon.

The Moon is the Roaring Twenties era vehicle made for baseball hero, Babe Ruth.

The specially designed 1923 automobile will be on display Sunday, Oct. 26 at the Woodville airport rodeo arena. Moons are seldom seen today and Ruth's car, built to his specifications, is unlike any other Moon car made. The slogan of the Moon Motor Company, "the kolls Royce of America...the Moon." An expensive car in its day, it soon became unpopular when its oversize tires became difficult to obtain and the company went out of business.

Unique features of the six cylinder, opera coach Moon body are a telescoping front seat, a built-in bar and an electric starter, heater and fan. The hood ornament, a gift to Babe Ruth from his baseball fans, is a pair of wings centered with a baseball. Across the radiator are the silvered words, "San Antonio", a gift from that city which Ruth had installed on his unusual car.

Because Babe Ruth found the steering wheel uncomfortable, he sold the car within a year. It was then bought by a man in Austin and it has spent the rest of its 46 years in San Antonio, Cameron and presently is in Livingston.

Jimmy Singleton, a Livingston mechanic, was responsible for tuning up and cleaning up the car following its recent purchase. He will take the car on tour and will probably be with the car at the

Tyler County Big Thicket Craft Fair on Sunday.

While children participate in various entertaining games planned for them, men can contemplate holding the lines on the car owned by the famous Babe Ruth and women will have opportunity to look at the multitude of crafts items which will be at the fair. There will be a concession stand and several food booths at the Tyler County Big Thicket Craft Fair. These will be open from 9-4 Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 25-26 in Woodville. The craft fair is sponsored by the Woodville Business and Professional Women's Club and profits will be used for scholarships. Everyone is invited to attend this annual event.

A statewide poll of P&W biologists, technical assistants, and information officers for outlook on deer, quail, turkey, waterfowl and other game species is an optimistic one.


Deer: Good winter growth in whitetails over all but a few areas in Texas. P&W biologists are optimistic about the outlook for deer, quail, turkey, waterfowl and other game species is an optimistic one.

Texas' native mottled ducks produced very good hatchings this summer and there is plenty of water along the Gulf coast for both mottled ducks and northern migrant birds. A few shovellers and pintails are also showing up.

Antelope: Good reproduction in Trans-Pecos, Permian Basin and Panhandle areas. Herds will not be available to hunters as mature animals until 1979. Some 35 percent of the adult Trans-Pecos antelope herd was lost in 1978 and the herd is just now recovering. The adult Panhandle herd is in excellent condition. P&W biologists are expecting somewhat better than the 16-inch class during the early October season.

Phoebes: Results of a P&W summer pheasant census in the Panhandle show a substantial increase in both numbers and production rates. The pheasant population has more than doubled in the past year. Wildlife officials tentatively expect a similar increase in the Panhandle this year. In regulatory counties the daily bag limit will be 10 quail and the possession

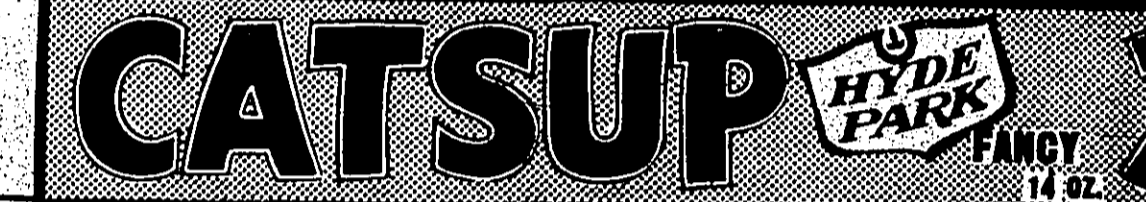
